Subject: Amendment to Clean Water Act Section 401 Water Quality Certification No. 07C-050 for the Buena Vista Creekwalk Trail and Channel Stabilization Project

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) is amending the Buena Vista Creekwalk Trail and Channel Stabilization project, Certification number 07C-050 issued on March 24, 2008. This amendment to the Water Quality Certification has been requested by the City of Vista. The original certification with requested changes is included as Attachment A.

The proposed changes include a temporary flow diversion (in Buena Vista Creek) to allow the installation of a 140 foot-long plantable rock gabion. The temporary flow diversion would provide a more stable, dry work surface for the contractor. The City of Vista would install a 40 foot long temporary by-pass pipe to divert flows away from the work area. The pipe would be anchored with gravelbags to ensure stability during gabion installation. The pipe is expected to remain in place for 5 days. No vegetation is located in the area of the by-pass pipe and no additional impacts are expected. Thus, no additional mitigation is proposed. The City of Vista has also reduced the number of in-stream gabions from three plantable rock structures, totaling 249 linear feet, to one plantable rock structure, totaling 140 linear feet.

Any petition for reconsideration of this Certification amendment must be filed with the State Water Resources Control Board within 30 days of certification action (23 CCR § 3867). If no petition is received, it will be assumed that the City of Vista has accepted and will comply with all conditions of the Certification. Failure to comply with all conditions of this Certification may result in enforcement actions against the City of Vista.

Amended language to the Water Quality Certification is shown as strikeout and bold-underlined font in the amended Water Quality Certification (Attachment A). Technical

information provided by the City of Vista in support of the amendment is included as Attachment B.



PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The project will provide a trail connection between Brengle Terrace Park to an existing trail system at Capri Drive by constructing an approximately 1,200 foot long by 10 foot-wide trail segment comprised of decomposed granite. The project will also stabilize the channel banks by installing <u>one</u> four plantable, rock gabion structures totaling 140 linear feet along the length of the channel. The creek is eroding and incising in response to increased flows caused by surrounding impervious areas.

California Environmental Protection Agency

The proposed changes as described in the amendment request will include a temporary flow diversion to install a 140 foot-long plantable rock gabion. The temporary flow diversion will provide a more stable, dry work surface for the contractor. The City of Vista will install a 40 foot long temporary bypass pipe to divert flows away from the work area. The pipe will be covered with gravel bags to ensure stability during gabion installation. The pipe is expected to remain in place for 5 days. No vegetation is located in the area of the by-pass pipe and no additional impacts are expected.

STANDARD CONDITIONS:

The following three standard conditions apply to <u>all</u> certification actions, except as noted under Condition 3 for denials (Action 3).

- 1. This certification action is subject to modification or revocation upon administrative or judicial review, including review and amendment pursuant to section 13330 of the California Water Code and section 3867 of Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations (23 CCR).
- 2. This certification action is not intended and must not be construed to apply to any discharge from any activity involving a hydroelectric facility requiring a Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) license or an amendment to a FERC license unless the pertinent certification application was filed pursuant to 23 CCR subsection 3855(b) and the application specifically identified that a FERC license or amendment to a FERC license for a hydroelectric facility was being sought.
- 3. The validity of any non-denial certification action (Actions 1 and 2) must be conditioned upon total payment of the full fee required under 23 CCR section 3833, unless otherwise stated in writing by the certifying agency.

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS:

In addition to the three standard conditions, the City of Vista must satisfy the following:

A. GENERAL CONDITIONS:

1. The City of Vista must, at all times, fully comply with the engineering plans, specifications and technical reports submitted with this application for 401 Water Quality Certification and all subsequent submittals required as part of this certification.

- 2. The City of Vista must comply with the requirements of State Water Resources Control Board Water Quality Order No. 99-08-DWQ, the NPDES General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Construction Activity.
- 3. The City of Vista must maintain a copy of this certification, the application, and supporting documentation at the project site at all times for review by site personnel and agencies.
- 4. Prior to the start of the project, and annually thereafter, the City of Vista must educate all personnel on the requirements in this certification, pollution prevention measures, spill response, and Best Management Practices implementation and maintenance.
- 5. The City of Vista must permit the Regional Board or its authorized representative at all times, upon presentation of credentials:
 - a. Entry onto project premises, including all areas on which wetland fill or wetland mitigation is located or in which records are kept.
 - b. Access to copy any records required to be kept under the terms and conditions of this certification.
 - c. Inspection of any treatment equipment, monitoring equipment, or monitoring method required by this certification.
- 6. The City of Vista must notify the Regional Board within 24 hours of any unauthorized discharge, including hazardous or toxic materials, to waters of the U.S. and/or State; measures that were implemented to stop and contain the discharge; measures implemented to clean-up the discharge; the volume and type of materials discharged and recovered; and additional best management practice (BMPs) or other measures that will be implemented to prevent future discharges.
- 7. The City of Vista must, at all times, maintain appropriate types and sufficient quantities of materials onsite to contain any spill or inadvertent release of materials that may cause a condition of pollution or nuisance if the materials reach waters of the U.S. and/or State.
- 8. This Certification is not transferable to any person(s) except after notice to the Executive Officer of the Regional Board. The applicant must submit this notice in writing at least 30 days in advance of any proposed transfer. The notice must include a written agreement between the existing and new owner(s) containing a specific date for the transfer of this Certification's responsibility and coverage between the current discharger and the new discharger(s). This agreement must include an

acknowledgement that the existing owner is liable for compliance and violations up to the transfer date and that the new owner(s) is/are liable from the transfer date on.

- 9. In the event of any violation or threatened violation of the conditions of this certification, the violation or threatened violation must be subject to any remedies, penalties, process or sanctions as provided for under State law. For purposes of section 401(d) of the Clean Water Act, the applicability of any State law authorizing remedies, penalties, process or sanctions for the violation or threatened violation constitutes a limitation necessary to assure compliance with the water quality standards and other pertinent requirements incorporated into this certification.
- 10. In response to a suspected violation of any condition of this certification, the Regional Board may require the holder of any permit or license subject to this certification to furnish, under penalty of perjury, any technical or monitoring reports the Regional Board deems appropriate, provided that the burden, including costs, of the reports must bear a reasonable relationship to the need for the reports and the benefits to be obtained from the reports.
- 11. In response to any violation of the conditions of this certification, the Regional Board may add to or modify the conditions of this certification as appropriate to ensure compliance.

B. COMPENSATORY MITIGATION:

- Compensatory mitigation for the proposed impact of 0.125-acre (458-linear feet) of vegetated Waters of the U.S. and State, must be achieved by the onsite:
 - a) Creation of 0.01-acre of Southern willow scrub.
 - b) Enhancement of 0.02-acre Southern willow scrub.
 - c) Creation of 0.10-acre Southern coast live oak riparian forest.
 - d) Enhancement of 0.20-acre of Southern coast live oak riparian forest
 - e) Creation of 0.015-acre wetlands.

The overall mitigation ratio will be 2.8:1.

2. The City of Vista must follow and implement the recommendations contained within the Conceptual Wetlands Mitigation & Monitoring Plan for the Buena Vista Creekwalk Trail & Stabilization Project, prepared by Dudek, and dated March 2008.

- 3. In addition to the maintenance and monitoring proposed in the mitigation plans, the City of Vista must develop and submit an addendum to the mitigation plans that implements monitoring criteria to measure the functional success of the mitigation areas. This addendum is due to the Regional Board by June 1, 2008.
- 4. If, after all other establishment criteria have been met, monitoring shows that the mitigation area(s) are not meeting the functional success' criteria proposed in the addendum, the Regional Board has the option to modify this certification to require changes to the mitigation plans, including but not limited to additional or different mitigation to compensate for the lack of or diminished functional mitigation.
- Within 90 days of the issuance of this certification, the City of Vista must provide a draft preservation mechanism (e.g. deed restriction, conservation easement, etc.) that will protect all mitigation areas and their buffers in perpetuity. The conservation easement or other legal limitation on the mitigation property must be adequate to demonstrate that the site will be maintained without future development or encroachment on the site or which could otherwise reduce the functions and values of the site for the variety of beneficial uses of waters of the U.S. that it supports. The conservation easement or other appropriate legal limitation must prohibit, without exception, ail residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, and transportation development, and any other infrastructure development that would not maintain or enhance the wetland functions and values of the site. Other infrastructure development to be prohibited includes, but is not limited to, additional utility lines, paved maintenance roads, and areas of maintained landscaping for recreation. The City of Vista must submit proof of a completed preservation mechanism within one year of issuance of this certification.
- 6. The City of Vista must submit a report (including topography maps and planting locations) to the Regional Board within 90 days of completion of mitigation preparation and planting, describing as-built status of the mitigation project. If the site grading and planting are not completed within six weeks of each other, separate reports will be submitted describing those specific as-built conditions.
- 7. The construction of proposed mitigation must be completed within the same_calendar year as impacts occur, or at least no later than 9 months following the close of the calendar year in which impacts first occur (e.g., if impacts occur in June 2003, construction of mitigation for all impacts must be completed no later than September 2004). Delays in implementing mitigation must result in an increased mitigation ratio by 1.0 acre for each acre of impact for each year, or part thereof, of delay.

- 8. Mitigation areas must be maintained free of perennial exotic plant species including, but not limited to, pampas grass, giant reed, tamarisk, sweet fennel, tree tobacco, castor bean, and pepper tree. Annual exotic plant species must not occupy more than 5 percent of the onsite or offsite mitigation areas.
- 9. If at any time during the implementation and establishment of the mitigation area(s), and prior to verification of meeting success criteria, a catastrophic natural event (e.g., fire, flood) occurs and impacts the mitigation area, The City of Vista, must be responsible for repair and replanting of the damaged area(s).
- 10. Mitigation monitoring reports must be submitted annually until mitigation has been deemed successful. Monitoring reports must be submitted no later than 30 days following the end of the monitoring period. Monitoring reports must include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - a) Names, qualifications, and affiliations of the persons contributing to the report;
 - b) Tables presenting the-raw data collected in the field as well as analyses of the physical and biological data;
 - c) Qualitative and quantitative comparisons of current mitigation conditions with pre-construction conditions and previous mitigation monitoring results;
 - d) Photo documentation from established reference points;
 - e) Survey report documenting boundaries of mitigation area; and
 - f) Other items specified in the draft and final Wetland and Riparian Mitigation and Monitoring Plan.
- 11. For the purpose of determining mitigation credit for the removal of exotic/invasive plant species, only the actual area occupied by exotic/invasive plant species must be quantified to comply with mitigation requirements.
- 12. For purposes of this certification, creation is defined as the creation of vegetated or unvegetated waters of the U.S. where they have never been documented or known to occur (e.g., conversion of nonnative grassland to freshwater marsh). Restoration is defined as the creation of waters of the U.S. where they previously occurred (e.g., removal of fill material to restore a drainage). Enhancement is defined as modifying existing waters of the U.S. to enhance functions and values (e.g., removal of exotic plant species from jurisdictional areas and replacing with native species).

C. STREAM PHOTO DOCUMENTATION PROCEDURE

The City of Vista must conduct photo documentation of the project site and mitigation areas, including all areas of permanent and temporary impact, prior to and after project construction. Photo documentation must be conducted in accordance with the State Water Resources Control Board Standard Operating Procedure 4.2.14: Stream Photo Documentation Procedure, included as Attachment 6. In addition, photo documentation must include Geographic Positioning System (GPS) coordinates for each of the photo points referenced. The City of Vista must submit this information in a photo documentation report to the Regional Board with the Mitigation Maintenance and Monitoring reports. The report must include a compact disc that contains digital files of all the photos (jpeg file type or similar).

D. GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM REPORTING

The City of Vista must submit Geographic Information System (GIS) shape files of the impact and mitigation areas within 30 days of project impacts and the mitigation areas within 30 days of mitigation installation. All impact and mitigation areas shapefiles must be polygons. Two GPS readings (points) must be taken on each line of the polygon and the polygon must have a minimum of 10 points. GIS metadata must also be submitted.

E. R EPORTING

- 1. All information requested in this Certification is pursuant to California Water Code (CWC) section 13267. Civil liability may be administratively imposed by the Regional Board for failure to furnish requested information pursuant to CWC section 13268.

1. All applications, reports, or information submitted to the Regional Board must be signed and certified as follows:

- a. For a corporation, by a responsible corporate officer of at least the level of vice president.
- b. For a partnership or sole proprietorship, by a general partner or proprietor, respectively.
- c. For a municipality, or a state, federal, or other public agency, by either a principal executive officer or ranking elected official.
- 2. A duly authorized representative of a person designated in Items 1.a. through 1.c. above may sign documents if:
 - a. The authorization is made in writing by a person described in Items 1.a. through 1.c. above.
 - b. The authorization specifies either an individual or position having responsibility for the overall operation of the regulated activity.
 - c. The written authorization is submitted to the Regional Board Executive Officer.
- 3. All applications, reports, or information submitted to the Regional Board must be signed and certified as follows:

"I certify under penalty of law that I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted in this document and all attachments and that, based on my inquiry of those individuals immediately responsible for obtaining the information, I believe that the information is true, accurate, and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fine and imprisonment."





Dudek is submitting this request to amend Section 401 Water Quality Certification Number 07C-050 on behalf of the City of Vista (City) to allow for the temporary installation of a flow by-pass pipe in a perennial tributary to Buena Vista Creek to support the construction of a proposed 140 foot-long plantable rock gabion. The proposed gabion was previously permitted by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE), Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB), and California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG) as part of the Buena Vista Creekwalk Trail project (RWQCB File No. 07C-050) in December 2008. The proposed project entailed the construction of an approximately 1,200-foot-long by 10-foot-wide decomposed granite trail adjacent to Buena Vista Creek along with three plantable rock gabion structures for creek stabilization and a culvert extension at Ponderosa Drive to accommodate trail construction. However, since the issuance of resource agency permits in 2008, the City has reduced the number of in-stream gabions from three plantable rock structures, totaling 249 linear feet, to one plantable rock structure, totaling 140 linear feet (Exhibit 1). The 140 foot-long plantable rock gabion is proposed in an area where fallen trees and vegetation caused by heavy 2010 storms redirected creek flows into the southern channel bank, causing severe erosion and undercutting (see photos below). The single plantable rock gabion is expected to adequately address creek stabilization in the project area.

To install the gabion structure in-stream, a temporary flow diversion is needed to provide a more stable, dry work surface for the contractor. Creek flows are minimal due to the onset of summer. To address temporary flow diversion, the City is proposing to install a 40 foot long temporary by-pass pipe to divert flows away from the work area. The pipe would be reinforced with several sandbags to ensure it remains in place during gabion installation. The pipe is expected to remain in place for a period of five days. Crews will likely access the work area to install the by-pass device on foot from the north. The creek is unvegetated at this location. Thus, no vegetation will be removed during installation of the by-pass device.

The photos below were taken by Dudek biologist Tricia Wotipka on June 15, 2010. The white line seen in both photos is meant to indicate the location of the proposed gabion. The by-pass device would be installed just upstream of the gabion to divert flows away from the work site to allow wet soils (seen in the photo to the left) to dry.





Following construction of the gabion, the temporary pipe and sandbags will be removed and all areas temporarily impacted by the work will be restored to pre-construction contours and conditions. No vegetation is expected to be removed through installation of the by-pass pipe. No additional mitigation is proposed.

STATUS OF RESOURCE AGENCY PERMITS

ACOE. A notification to use Nationwide Permit 33 (Temporary Construction, Access, and Dewatering) has been submitted to Ms. Michelle Mattson and is currently being processed by ACOE staff.

CDFG. Condition #38 of the Streambed Alteration Agreement, issued by the CDFG in July 2008, allows for temporary flow diversion. After discussions with Darren Bradford of the CDFG on May 27, 2010, it was determined that no notification to the CDFG is necessary as the proposed flow diversion device is compliant with the existing permit requirements.


