The County of San Diego (County) violated Order No. 94-161, Waste Discharge Requirements for the County of San Diego, Pine Valley Sanitation District, Pine Valley Water Pollution Control Facility, San Diego County These violations subject the County to possible further enforcement action by the Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (Regional Board), including administrative enforcement orders requiring the County to cease and desist from violations, or to clean up waste and abate existing or threatened conditions of pollution or nuisance; administrative assessment of civil liability in amounts of up to \$5,000 per day per violation;² referral to the State Attorney General for injunctive relief; and referral to the District Attorney for criminal prosecution.

Summary of Violations

- 1. The Discharge Specification for the daily effluent concentration of biochemical oxygen demand, established at 45 milligrams per liter (mg/L), was exceeded on March 30, 2008 with a reported value of 54.6 mg/L.
- The Discharge Specification for the 12-month average effluent concentration of total dissolved solid (TDS), established at 750 mg/L, was exceeded during 2008 with a calculated average of 773 mg/L (from the quarterly reports: 559.0 mg/L, 723 mg/L, 810 mg/L, and 1000 mg/L).
- 3. The Discharge Specification for daily effluent pH values (6 9 units) was exceeded on September 16, 2008 with a reported value of 9.5.
