SUBJECT: LOWER MOOSA CANYON WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) has reviewed the April-June 2009, July-September 2009, October-December 2009, and January-March 2010 quarterly monitoring reports; the January-June 2009 and July-December 2009 semiannual monitoring reports; and the January-December 2009 annual monitoring report submitted by the Valley Center Municipal Water District in accordance with Monitoring and Reporting Program of Order No. 95-32.

The following violations of the Order No. 95-32 were identified in the above monitoring reports:

- 1. The daily maximum discharge specification for Biochemical Oxygen Demand (BOD) established at 30 milligrams per liter (mg/L) was exceeded on April 22 and May 6, 2009, and January 7, 2010 with reported values of 65, 31, and 35 mg/L respectively.
- The 30-day average discharge specification for BOD established at 20 mg/L was exceeded for April and May 2009 with reported values of 27.72 and 21.85 mg/L respectively.
- The daily maximum discharge specification for total suspended solids established at 30 mg/L was exceeded on April 22, 2009 with a reported value of 47 mg/L.

Please be aware these violations subject you to possible further enforcement action by the San Diego Water Board, including administrative enforcement orders requiring the you to cease and desist from violations, or to clean up waste and abate existing or threatened conditions of pollution or nuisance; administrative assessment of civil liability in amounts of up to \$5,000 per day per violation; referral to the State Attorney General for injunctive relief; and referral to the District Attorney for criminal prosecution.

The next monitoring reports required to be submitted are the April-June 2010 quarterly and January-June 2010 semiannual monitoring reports which are due by July 30, 2010.
