SUBJECT: NOTICE OF VIOLATION NO. R9-2010-0058 SAN DIEGO WILD ANIMAL PARK


Enclosed is Notice of Violation (NOV) No. R9-2010-0058 for the San Diego Wild Animal Park. The basis for this NOV was the monitoring data contained in the May 2009 through January 2010, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2009, and 2009 annual monitoring reports submitted by the Zoological Society of San Diego (Society) in accordance with Order No. 99-04.

Please take steps to implement the follow-up actions necessary to ensure that the violations noted do not occur in the future. These violations subject the Society to possible further enforcement action by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board), including administrative enforcement orders requiring the Society to cease and desist from violations, or to clean up waste and abate existing or threatened conditions of pollution or nuisance; administrative assessment of civil liability in amounts of up to \$5,000 per day per violation; referral to the State Attorney General for injunctive relief; and referral to the District Attorney for criminal prosecution.

The San Diego Water Board has the following comments regarding the reports referenced above:

1. The Wild Animal Park Sewage Treatment Plant has had violations of the total coliform effluent limitation since April 2005. Historically, violations were addressed through re-training of personnel on correct sampling techniques. More recently, violations have been attributed to clogging of the chlorine dosing pump, high influent flows, and failure of the chlorine dosing pump. During these

events, inadequately disinfected secondary effluent was discharged to the recycled water storage pond. Recycled Water Use Requirement E.5 (as written in Addendum No. 1 to Order No. 99-04) states:

The plant shall be equipped with automatic shut down capability to prevent inadequately disinfected secondary effluent from discharging into the recycled water storage pond. The inadequately disinfected secondary effluent at the chlorine contact tank will be re-disinfected with higher dose and re-sampled prior to diversion into the recycled water pond.

Based on conversations with the treatment plant operators and an inspection of the facility, the Wild Animal Park STP is not equipped with automatic shut down capability to prevent the discharge of inadequately disinfected secondary effluent. Ms. Cathryn Henning of the San Diego Water Board discussed this deficiency during a meeting with you on August 20, 2009. Ms. Henning followed up with emails dated August 26, 2009 and October 27, 2009 requesting a list of tasks and expected completion dates for the installation of a chlorination system in compliance with Recycled Water Use Requirement E.5. No response has been provided to the San Diego Water Board to date. Please provide the requested information as soon as possible.

2. The median values for total coliform calculated on August 25, 26, and 27, 2009 were reported as ND when the actual values were 17 most probable number per 100 milliliters.

The next monitoring report is the February 2010 monthly monitoring report, which is due by March 30, 2010. Waste Discharge Requirements: Order No. 99-04

Facility: San Diego Wild Animal Park

## YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT:

The Zoological Society of San Diego (Society) violated Order No. 99-04, Waste Discharge Requirements for Zoological Society of San Diego, San Diego Wild Animal Park, San Diego County. These violations subject the Society to possible further enforcement action by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board), including administrative enforcement orders requiring the Society to cease and desist from violations, or to clean up waste and abate existing or threatened conditions of pollution or nuisance; administrative assessment of civil liability in amounts of up to \$5,000 per day per violation;2 referral to the State Attorney General for injunctive relief; and referral to the District Attorney for criminal prosecution.

The San Diego Water Board reviewed the May 2009 through January 2010, 3rd and 4th quarter 2009, and 2009 annual monitoring reports required by Order No. 99-04.

## Summary of Violation

- There were 4 violations of Discharge Specification B.4 for total coliform, which states: Effluent shall not exceed a total coliform bacteria [most probable number] MPN of 240/100 [milliliters] mL in more than one sample in any 30-day period. Violations occurred on August 23, September 19, 20, and 21, 2009 with reported values of 1,600 MPN/100mL.
- 2. Samples for total coliform were not collected on September 24 and 25, 2009.
- 3. Discharge Specification B.4 for chloride establishes a daily maximum effluent limitation of 400 milligrams per liter (mg/L). This Discharge Specification was violation on December 12, 2009 with a reported value of 1,000 mg/L.

- 4. The 4th quarter 2009 monitoring report did not include grab sample results from SW-3 and SW-4 as required in Section C.3 of Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 99-04.
- 5. The 4th quarter 2009 monitoring report did not include grab sample results from SW-5 and SW-6 as required in Section C.4 of Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 99-04.
- 6. The 2009 annual monitoring report did not include grab sample results from SW-8 (or SW-7) and SW-9 as required in Section C.5 of Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 99-04.
- 7. Groundwater monitoring data for 2009 has not been reported to the San Diego Water Board as required in section C of Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 99-04.
- 8. The 2009 annual monitoring report did not include the evaluation report required in section E.1.e of Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 99-04.
- 9. The 2009 annual monitoring report did not include the information required in section F.1 through F.7 of Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 99-04.
