
SUBJECT: ALL SEASONS RV PARK AND CAMPGROUND

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) has reviewed the January - June 2009 and July - December 2009 semiannual monitoring reports, and the January-December 2009 annual monitoring report. The referenced reports were submitted in accordance with the Monitoring and Reporting Program of Order No. 94-05.

The following violations of Order No. 94-05 were identified in the reports submitted:

- 1. The Discharge Specification for the daily maximum effluent concentration for Biochemical Oxygen Demand (BOD), established at 45 milligrams per liter (mg/L), was exceeded on March 13 and September 17, 2009 with reported values of 97 mg/L and 50 mg/L respectively.
- 2. The Discharge Specification for the daily maximum effluent concentration for boron, established at 0.75 mg/L, was exceeded on June 8, 2009 with a reported value of 0.76 mg/L.
- 3. The Discharge Specification for the daily maximum effluent concentration for chloride, established at 200 mg/L, was exceeded on October 29, 2009 with a reported value of 230 mg/L.

Please be aware these violations subject you to possible further enforcement action by the San Diego Water Board, including administrative enforcement orders requiring the you to cease and desist from violations, or to clean up waste and abate existing or threatened conditions of pollution or nuisance; administrative assessment of civil liability in amounts of up to \$5,000 per day per violation;¹ referral to the State Attorney General for injunctive relief; and referral to the District Attorney for criminal prosecution.
