The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (San Diego Water Board) has reviewed the monitoring reports listed in Table 1 below. The City of San Clemente (City) submitted the monitoring reports as required by the Monitoring and Reporting Program of Order No. R9-2003-0123.

The following violations of Discharge Specifications of Order No. R9-2003-0123 were identified in the monitoring reports:

 Section B.1 requires that the 12-month average concentration for manganese shall not exceed 0.075 milligrams per liter (mg/L). The 12-month average manganese discharge specification was exceeded the following months:

 Section B.3 requires that the 24-hour average effluent turbidity shall not exceed 2 Nephelometric Turbidity Units (NTU). The 24-hour effluent turbidity exceeded 2 NTU on the following dates:

Section D.9 of Order No. R9-2003-0123 requires the City to comply with the Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) of Order No. R9-2003-0123. The following violations of Section D.9 and Section B of the MRP were identified in the monitoring reports:

Monitoring and Reporting Program No. R9-2003-0123 section B.2, requires Total Coliform to be sampled and analyzed at least daily. Results for Total Coliform were not reported for June 12, 2017. If the facility did not produce disinfected tertiary recycled water on June 12, 2017, please indicate that in your written response. In the cover letter for future monitoring reports please indicate time intervals when the facility was not producing disinfected tertiary recycled water.

Please continue to implement follow-up actions necessary to ensure that the violation(s) noted above do not occur in the future. These violations may subject the City to possible further enforcement action by the San Diego Water Board including but not limited to: administrative enforcement orders requiring the City to cease and desist from violations, or administrative assessments of civil liabilities in amounts of up to \$5,000 per day per violation; referral to the State Attorney General for injunctive relief; and referral to the District Attorney for criminal prosecution.

The next monitoring report required to be submitted is the June 2017 monthly monitoring report, which is due by <u>August 1, 2017</u>.
