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GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR REUSE/DISPOSAL OF FUEL CONTAMINATED SOIL IN THE SAN DIEGO REGION (ORDER R9-2002-0342)

1. **Order R9-2002-0342 prescribes General Waste Discharge Requirements** (per Water Code Sec. 13260 *et seq.*) for reuse and disposal of fuel contaminated soils... this Order is not a waiver of WDRs! The Order, Monitoring and Reporting Program R9-2002-0342, and the Fuel Contaminated Soil (FCS) Certification form are available on-line at:

2. **Regulation under Order R9-2002-0342** does not relieve the discharger(s) of any obligation to comply with other State or local requirements (*e.g.*, applicable storm water permitting, *etc.*).
3. **Streamlined Enrollment Process.** Dischargers need to provide the RWQCB with information in Section A of Order R9-2002-0342 (Order). Enrollment and regulation of a discharge under the Order does not require the discharger to wait for approval by the RWQCB at a board meeting.
4. **Siting Criteria Requirements.** Reuse/disposal site must meet criteria specified in Section C.2 of the Order. If criteria not met, site specific WDRs, or a site-specific waiver of WDRs, will be needed before fuel contaminated soil can be reused/disposed.
5. **Required Waste Characteristics.** Fuel contaminated soils meet the definition in Finding No. 6.a of the Order, comply with the discharge Prohibitions in Section B of the Order, and meet either the primary or secondary criteria specified in Section C.3 of the Order. If not, site specific WDRs or a site-specific waiver of WDRs will be needed before fuel contaminated soil can be reused/disposed.
6. **Temporary Waste/Stock Piles.** Temporary waste piles are allowed for the duration of the project. Waste/stock pile management requirements are specified in Section C.5 of the Order.
7. **Final Report.** Discharger(s) must provide a Technical Report on the final disposition of FCS Wastes as required in (see Section F) of the Order and Monitoring and Reporting Program R9-2002-0342. The Report is to be submitted to the RWQCB within 60 days after the discharge of FCS waste is completed.
8. **Final Inspection.** The RWQCB staff will schedule a site inspection to assess the final condition of the site. The RWQCB staff will work with the discharger(s) to resolve any observed/remaining areas of concern.
9. **Termination of enrollment under Order R9-2002-0342.** Upon satisfactory completion and documentation requirements, enrollment in the Order will be terminated for the discharger.
