SUBJECT: REPUBLIC SERVICES, INC. and REPUBLIC SERVICES VASCO ROAD, LLC, VASCO ROAD LANDFILL, LIVERMORE, ALAMEDA COUNTY – Adoption of Updated Waste Discharge Requirements and Rescission of Order No. 96-041

CHRONOLOGY: Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) updated in 1996 (Order No. 96-041)
WDRs amended in 1995 (Order No. 95-063)
WDRs adopted in 1986 (Order No. 86-042)

DISCUSSION: This Tentative Order (Appendix A) updates WDRs for the active Vasco Road Landfill. This landfill is an operating municipal solid waste disposal site located on Vasco Road about three miles north of Interstate 580 in an unincorporated portion of eastern Alameda County north of the City of Livermore. The landfill is expected to reach final capacity in about 14 years.

The Tentative Order updates the WDRs specifically to:

- reflect current landfill operations and construction of new waste disposal units;
- reflect changes to the final closure schedule;
- update waste acceptance criteria for designated wastes for disposal units constructed in compliance with State and Federal requirements;
- update monitoring, control, and collection requirements for groundwater, leachate, landfill gas, and storm water consistent with Title 27; and
- rescind the existing WDRs (Order No. 96-041).

No comments were received during the public comment period, and the discharger has indicated its acceptance of the Tentative Order.
