YOU ARE HEREBY GIVEN NOTICE THAT:

- Snyder-Langston Company, is alleged to have violated provisions of law for which the California Regional Water Quality Control Board (Board), Santa Ana Region, must impose mandatory penalties pursuant to California Water Code (Water Code) Section 13385 (h) and (i).
- 2. A hearing concerning this complaint will be held before the Board within 60 days of the date of issuance of this complaint, unless Snyder-Langston Company waives its right to a hearing. If the hearing in this matter is not waived, the hearing will be held during the Board's regular meeting on July 19, 2002, in Fountain Valley. Snyder-Langston Company or its representatives will have an opportunity to appear and be heard and to contest the allegations in this complaint and the imposition of mandatory penalties by the Board. An agenda and announcement for the meeting will be mailed to you not less than 10 days prior to the hearing date.
- 3. If the July 19, 2002 hearing is held, the Board will consider whether to affirm, reject or modify the proposed mandatory penalties or whether to refer this matter to the Attorney General for recovery of judicial civil liability.
- 4. This complaint is based on the following facts:
 - a. In 1998, the Board adopted General Waste Discharge Requirements, Order No. 98-67 (NPDES No. CAG998001), for discharges to surface waters which pose an insignificant (De Minimus) threat to water quality. International Bay Clubs, Inc., submitted a notice of intent to discharge wastewater under this general permit resulting from construction of an underground parking structure.
 - b. Snyder Langston Company is the general contractor for this construction project and has accepted responsibility for all wastewater discharges associated with the project.

- c. Snyder Langston Company, submitted self-monitoring reports (February 23, 2001 January 31, 2002) that show that the discharge to Newport Bay exceeded the sulfide limit specified in Order No. 98-67 on 20 separate occasions. These violations are summarized on Attachment "A" which is Page 3 of this complaint.
- 5. In accordance with the criteria specified in Water Code Sections 13385 (h)(2), these violations are defined as serious violations. Water Code Section 13385 (h) and (i) requires the Board to assess a mandatory minimum penalty of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for each serious and/or chronic violation.
- 6. As shown in Attachment "A", Snyder Langston Company incurred a total of 20 violations between February 2001 and February 2002.
- 7. All 20 violations are subject to mandatory minimum penalties of \$3,000 for each violation. In accordance with Water Code Section 13385 (h) and (i), the mandatory minimum penalties for the 20 effluent limit violations cited in Attachment "A" are \$60,000.
- 8. In accordance with Water Code Section 13385(c), the Board may impose administrative civil liability for the 20 violations cited in Attachment "A". The maximum administrative civil liability which may be imposed for these violations is over \$200,000.
- 9. The Executive Officer proposes that mandatory penalties of \$60,000 be imposed on Snyder Langston Company, by the Board for the violations cited above. The Executive Officer further proposes that \$3,000 of this assessment may be placed in the "Robinson-Skinner Annuity Account for Maintenance Dredging and TMDS Compliance Projects in Newport Bay", as a supplemental environmental project.
- 10. You may waive your right to a hearing. If you waive your right to a hearing, please sign the attached waiver and return it together with the attached invoice and a check in the amount of \$57,000.
