YOU ARE HEREBY GIVEN NOTICE THAT:

1. BASF is alleged to have violated provisions of law for which the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Santa Ana Region (Board), must impose mandatory penalties pursuant to California Water Code (Water Code) Section 13385(h) and (i).
2. A hearing concerning this Complaint is scheduled for the Board's regular meeting on August 22, 2003. BASF or its representatives will have an opportunity to appear and be heard and to contest the allegations in this complaint and the imposition of mandatory penalties by the Board. An agenda for the meeting and the staff report related to the Complaint will be mailed to you not less than 10 days prior to the hearing date.
3. If a hearing is held, the Board will consider whether to affirm, reject or modify the proposed mandatory penalties or whether to refer this matter to the Attorney General for recovery of judicial civil liability.
4. This complaint is based on the following facts:
 - a. BASF owns the former Mobil Chemical Plant Facility property located at 2530 S. Birch Street in Santa Ana. A groundwater treatment system at the site treated and discharged groundwater from the site. On January 23, 2002, the Board adopted Waste Discharge Requirements, Order No. R8-2002-0007 (NPDES No. CAG918001), General Groundwater Cleanup Permit (Permit). The Permit includes effluent limits for a number of constituents including ethylbenzene and tertiary butyl alcohol (TBA). On June 17, 2002, BASF was authorized to discharge treated water from its groundwater cleanup system and was required to monitor the discharge in accordance with Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 02-0007-083.
 - b. BASF submitted quarterly self-monitoring reports and the August 5, 2002, report indicated that BASF discharged ethylbenzene at 16 micrograms per liter ($\mu\text{g/l}$) or ppb on June 21, 2002. This concentration exceeded the

average monthly concentration limit of 10 ppb for ethylbenzene. In addition, the September 13, 2002, quarterly self-monitoring report indicated that TBA was discharged at 34 micrograms per liter ($\mu\text{g/l}$) or ppb on August 9, 2002. This concentration exceeded both the effluent maximum daily concentration of 18.6 ppb and the average monthly concentration limit of 12 ppb for TBA. Furthermore, these exceedences are serious violations as defined under Water Code Section 13385(h).

5. Water Code Section 13385(h) and (i) requires the Board to assess a mandatory minimum penalty of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for each serious and/or other specific types of violations.
6. In accordance with Water Code Section 13385(h), the mandatory minimum penalty for the effluent limitation violations cited in Section 4, above, is \$9,000.
7. In addition, the Board may also assess administrative civil liability of \$10,000 per day for each day of violation and \$10 per gallon for each gallon discharged in excess of 1,000 gallons in accordance with Water Code Section 13385(c). The maximum administrative civil liability that may be imposed for the June 21, 2002, violation is \$15,190 (\$10,000 for one day of violation and \$5,190 based on $1,519 - 1,000 = 519$ gallons @ \$10 per gallon). In addition, the maximum administrative civil liability that may be imposed for the August 9, 2002, violation is \$342,660 (\$140,000 for fourteen days of violation and \$202,660 based on $21,266 - 1,000 = 20,266$ gallons @ \$10 per gallon).
8. The Executive Officer proposes that the mandatory minimum penalties of \$9,000 be imposed on BASF by the Board for the violations cited above.
9. You may waive your right to a hearing. If you waive your right to a hearing, please sign the attached waiver form and return it together with a check for \$9,000 payable to the State Water Resources Control Board and the bottom portion of the invoice to Sacramento in the enclosed envelope.

MANDATORY PENALTY COMPLAINT NO. R8-2003-0079

Dear Mr. Reid-Green:

We are enclosing a certified copy of Complaint No. R8-2003-0079, proposing a mandatory penalty of \$9,000. The complaint is issued pursuant to California Water Code Section 13385(h), for three serious violations of the effluent limitations specified in Waste Discharge Requirements, Order No. R8-2002-0007. An invoice for this amount is also enclosed.

A public hearing on this matter is scheduled for the Regional Board meeting on August 22, 2003. The staff report regarding this complaint and a meeting agenda will be mailed to you no less than 10 days prior to the Board meeting.

You have the option to waive your right to a hearing. Should you decide to waive your right and pay the proposed assessment, the Regional Board will not hold a public hearing on this matter. If you choose to waive your right to a hearing, please sign the enclosed waiver form and submit the form with a check or money order for \$9,000. The waiver form, the bottom portion of the invoice and the check should be mailed to Sacramento using the enclosed envelope. All other correspondence regarding this complaint should be directed to this office at the address listed on this letterhead.

If you do not wish to waive your right to a hearing, a pre-hearing meeting with Board staff is recommended. Should you wish to schedule a pre-hearing meeting, please contact us prior to August 1, 2003. At that time, you may submit information that may not have been previously available to staff regarding this violation. This information should address the accuracy of the findings in the complaint.

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
