REVISED NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT AND NOTICE OF BOARD HEARING

TENTATIVE ORDER R8-2026-0034, NATIONAL POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMIT AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR DISCHARGES OF POLLUTANTS IN RUNOFF FROM THE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEMS (MS4) IN THE COUNTIES OF ORANGE, RIVERSIDE, AND SAN BERNARDINO WITHIN THE SANTA ANA REGION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Santa Ana Region (Santa Ana Water Board) is accepting public comments on Tentative Order R8-2026-0034 (Tentative Order), which is a region-wide Phase I MS4 Permit.

PUBLIC HEARING

Following the conclusion of the public comment period, the Santa Ana Water Board will hold a public hearing to ~~consider adoption of~~ receive public comments on the Tentative Order. The public hearing will be held at the following date, time, and location:

This proceeding is an adjudicatory proceeding subject to sections 648 – 648.5.1 of title 23 of the California Code of Regulations. Chapter 5 of the California Administrative Procedure Act (commencing with section 11500 of the Government Code) does not apply to adjudicative hearings before the Santa Ana Water Board, except as otherwise specified in the above-referenced regulations. Presubmittal of witness lists and oral testimony is not required. No documentary evidence will be accepted at the hearing.

The Santa Ana Water Board's agenda for the Board meeting will be available on the Santa Ana Water Board's [Agenda](#) webpage at least ten days prior to the meeting. Please check the Santa Ana Water Board's website for the most up-to-date public hearing date and location, as they are subject to change.

At the hearing, the Santa Ana Water Board ~~may adopt~~ will hear a presentation from board staff and receive public comment on the Tentative Order as noticed. The Santa Ana Water Board will not take action on the Tentative Order but may give direction to staff. The Santa Ana Water Board will close the hearing on July 24 and continue its consideration of the Tentative Order to a meeting at 9:00 a.m. on August 21, 2026 at 25541 Barton Road in the City of Loma Linda (Loma Linda City Hall). The agenda for that meeting will be provided at a future date.

SUBMISSION OF WRITTEN COMMENTS

The Santa Ana Water Board accepted written comments on the Tentative Order from March 1, 2024, through September 13, 2024. Staff has revised the Tentative Order in response to comments. Staff has also updated the permit to reflect legal and regulatory changes since the 2024 draft was released and as otherwise necessary. All revisions are shown in redline/strikeout. The revised Tentative Order in redline/strikeout format is available online as noticed above or by request. The Response to Comments received during the public comment period is currently being finalized and will be made available upon request shortly after this Notice is posted.

The Santa Ana Water Board will accept written public comments regarding these revisions during a **45 75-day public comment period that ends at 5:00 p.m on June 19 July 20, 2026**. Late comments will not be accepted unless the Santa Ana Water Board determines otherwise. No late comments will be accepted unless the commenter provides reasonable cause for the late submission and the Chair determines there is no prejudice to any party or the Board.

Comments unrelated to the revisions and comments on the Response to Comments will not be accepted and will not be included in the administrative record. This limitation does not apply to oral testimony or comments at the public hearing.

TENTATIVE ORDER AND SCOPE OF PROCEEDING

The Santa Ana Water Board has regulated pollution from urban areas through three separate permits issued to each of the three counties and their cities within the watershed. These permits were first issued in the 1990s and have been renewed four times since then. The permits are known as Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permits. An MS4 is a conveyance or system of conveyances (including roads with drainage systems, city streets, catch basins, curbs, gutters, ditches, man-made channels, or storm drains) usually owned by a city or county.

The Santa Ana Water Board is preparing to renew the MS4 permits for a fifth time. Instead of issuing three separate permits, the Santa Ana Water Board is proposing to adopt a single MS4 permit for all the counties and cities in the Santa Ana River watershed. The Tentative Order will go through public review before the Santa Ana Water Board adopts it.

Once adopted, the Tentative Order would regulate discharges of pollutants in stormwater and urban runoff from cities in Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino Counties that are within the Santa Ana River watershed:

- Requirements to effectively prohibit certain non-stormwater discharges.
- Requirements for the control of Trash.
- Requirements for minimum control measures found in 40 Code of Federal Regulations, section 122.26(d) (40 CFR § 122.26(d)). These include requirements for public education; inspections of industrial, commercial, and construction sites; inspections of municipal facilities; and requirements for pollution controls for new development and significant redevelopment.
- Requirements to attain waste load allocations for certain pollutants in the Big Bear Lake, Lake Elsinore/Canyon Lake, Newport Bay, and Middle Santa Ana River watersheds.

The Tentative Order includes provisions implementing numerous TMDLs. These TMDLs are either duly adopted regulations of the Santa Ana Water Board, TMDLs established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, or TMDLs that the Santa Ana Water Board has approved but that require other agency approvals to take effect. The validity of these TMDLs is beyond the scope of this proceeding. Any written or oral comments or evidence attempting to challenge the validity of TMDLs are outside the scope of this hearing and will not be considered. Comments and/or evidence concerning whether and how the Santa Ana Water Board implements the TMDL provisions into the Tentative Order are appropriate.

PARTICIPANTS IN THIS PROCEEDING

Participants in this proceeding are either “parties” or “interested persons.” Designation as a party is not necessary to participate in this proceeding. Both interested persons and parties will have the opportunity to present oral comments about the Regional MS4 Permit and may be asked to respond to clarifying questions from the Santa Ana Water Board members, counsel, or staff, or others at the discretion of the board.

Interested persons include any person or organization that is interested in the outcome of the matter, but who has not been designated as a party. Interested persons may present oral comments at the hearing, but they may not present evidence. Oral comments include policy statements and/or arguments about the appropriateness, wisdom, or utility of the Tentative Order. Interested persons are not subject to cross-examination and may not cross-examine witnesses.

Parties to the hearing may present evidence or cross-examine other parties’ witnesses and are subject to cross-examination.

All entities named as Permittees in the Tentative Order are parties. Any other persons or organizations that wish to participate in the hearing as a party shall request party status by submitting a written request to the Santa Ana Water Board by email to rb8-stormwater.comments@waterboards.ca.gov with a copy to Lori.Okun@waterboards.ca.gov and Heraclio.Pimentel@waterboards.ca.gov no later

than 5:00 pm on **June 24, 2026**. All requests for designation as a party shall include the name, phone number, and email address of the person who is designated to receive notices about this proceeding. The request shall also include a statement explaining the reasons for their request (e.g., how the issues to be addressed in the hearing and the Tentative Order affect the person or organization). Those submitting requests for party status will be notified before the hearing whether the request is granted or denied. All parties will be notified if other parties are designated.

Santa Ana Water Board staff is not a party. This is a proceeding to consider the requirements of a permit, which does not involve investigative, prosecutorial, or advocacy functions. Staff's proposals, recommendations, and their participation in this proceeding exist for the purpose of advising and assisting the Santa Ana Water Board. Likewise, attorneys for the Santa Ana Water Board will advise and assist the board, which includes the board members and its entire staff.

HEARING TIME LIMITS

The Principal Permittees (the County of Orange, Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, and San Bernardino County Flood Control District) will each have twenty minutes to make individual presentations or one hour to make a combined presentation. Any visual presentations must be submitted to Vanessa.Fuerte@Waterboards.ca.gov with a copy to rb8-stormwater.comments@waterboards.ca.gov no later than 5 PM on **July 22, 2026**.

In addition, Parties that are not Principal Permittees will each have five minutes to present oral testimony and comments. A party may not cede time to another party without prior approval from the Santa Ana Water Board.

Interested persons will each have three minutes to present comments.

The Board Chair may grant additional time on a case-by-case basis to parties or interested persons. Questions from Board members or the board's advisors and responses to those questions will not count toward time limits.
