## STATUTORY TIMELINES FOR LOCAL AGENCY CLEANUP OVERSIGHT

The Health & Safety Code (HSC) established and revised several timelines related to cleanup at hazardous waste release sites. These timelines come into effect either before or after a Local Officer enters into a Remedial Action Agreement (RAA) with a Responsible Party (RP). The following table summarizes these timelines.
