NOTICE OF NEW STATUS CONFERENCE DATE

The State Water Resources Control Board Administrative Hearings Office will hold a Status Conference on the pending application (A029657) of

The County of San Joaquin

for a permit to appropriate water from the South Fork American River at the Freeport Regional Water Authority Facility on the Sacramento River

The Status Conference will be held on March 16, 2021, beginning at 9:30 a.m.

NEW STATUS CONFERENCE DATE

The AHO issued a Notice of Status Conference on January 5, 2021, setting the status conference in this matter for February 16, 2021, beginning at 9:30 a.m. On February 3, 2021, the AHO received a request from San Joaquin County (County) to delay the status conference until April 15, 2021, or a later date. North San Joaquin Water Conservation District supported the County's request and no party opposed the request to delay the status conference.

E. JOAQUIN ESQUIVEL, CHAIR | EILEEN SOBECK, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The AHO is postponing the status conference in this matter until **March 16, 2021**, **beginning at 9:30 a.m.**, and postponing the associated deadline to file Notices of Intent to Appear and status conference statements until **March 9, 2021**. Based on the County's letter of February 3, 2021, the County may have been delayed in its receipt of the Notice of Status Conference and recently retained new counsel to represent it in this matter. An initial status conference will likely be productive, however, even if the County is not yet able to provide complete answers to issues (3) and (4), identified below. The AHO may set a subsequent status conference (or status conferences) if the County or other parties need to supplement their responses to the issues.

In its letter of February 3, 2021, the County asked for clarification whether the AHO will take action "relevant to" Application 29657 at the status conference. The purpose of this initial status conference is to receive information from the County about whether it intends to continue to pursue Application 29657, receive information from the protestants about whether they intend to maintain their protests, and discuss a schedule for the County to submit any additional information necessary for the Board to act on Application 29657. This basic information is necessary for the AHO to determine whether and when a public hearing in this matter would be appropriate. After the status conference, the AHO may issue an order setting a schedule for the County to submit additional information and may issue a notice of public hearing on Application 29657.

STATUS CONFERENCE

The AHO will circulate the Zoom teleconference information to each person or entity who files a Notice of Intent to Appear (NOI, discussed below). Because of the current COVID-19 crisis, no in-person appearances will be allowed. The status conference will be electronically recorded by Zoom teleconference. The hearing officer will prepare a status conference order after the conference. The AHO will not retain a court reporter for the status conference. Any party may arrange for a court reporter at his, her, or its own expense.

The status conference will address the following issues:

- (1) Does the County still want to pursue Application 29657?
- (2) Does each of the protestants want to maintain his, her, or its protest to Application 29657?
- (3) What is the status of each action item on the application-development schedule? The action items include:
 - a. Development of a project-specific Environmental Impact Report,
 - b. Negotiation for the right to use the Freeport Diversion Facility as the point of diversion for the project, and
 - c. Resolution of protests.

- (4) Should the AHO schedule a public hearing to consider whether the State Water Board should cancel, reject, or deny Application 29657 under Water Code section 1276 or section 1335, or California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 683 or 840? If so, when should the hearing be held?
- (5) Any other procedural issues raised by the participants.

PROHIBITION ON EX PARTE COMMUNICATIONS

All parties are prohibited from having any *ex parte* communications with any members of the AHO hearing team. (See Wat. Code, § 1110, subd. (c); Gov. Code, §§ 11430.10- 11430.80.) For a discussion of *ex parte* communications regarding State Water Board members, see "Ex Parte Questions and Answers," available on the State Water Board's website at:

http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/laws_regulations/docs/exparte.pdf. These rules regarding ex parte communications apply to all members of the AHO hearing team.

If any party wants to communicate with the AHO at any time regarding any procedural or substantive issue related to these proceedings, including the status conference, then that party shall make such communication to the AHO by e-mail or letter. The party shall serve all other parties on the service list with copies of the communication and include a proof of service demonstrating such service with the written communication to the AHO. A party may provide this proof of service through a formal proof of service or by other verification. For e-mails, the verification shall be a list of the e-mail addresses of the parties or their representatives in an electronic mail "cc" (carbon copy) list. For letters, the verification shall be a list of the names and mailing addresses of the other parties listed on the service list in the cc portion of the letter. The service list for this proceeding is attached to this notice.

Please do not attempt to communicate by telephone or in person with any AHO team member regarding any procedural or substantive issue concerning this proceeding. If oral communications with any members of the AHO team are necessary to discuss any procedural or substantive issue, then the AHO will set up a conference call in which representatives of all parties may participate. Any party may request such a conference call at any time using the written communications protocols described above.

NOTICES OF INTENT TO APPEAR

Any person or entity who wants to participate in this status conference must file a Notice of Intent to Appear (NOI), using the form in this notice, with the AHO before the deadline listed below. The AHO encourages parties to agree to accept electronic service (by e-mail) of all documents regarding this proceeding. If a party is not willing to do this, then the party may check the appropriate box on the NOI form. If this box is not

checked, then the AHO will assume that the party agrees to accept electronic service.

If the AHO does not receive an NOI from the Applicant indicating the Applicant's intent to participate in the status conference before the deadline specified below, the AHO may transmit a proposed order to the Board that would cancel Application 29657 without holding a hearing. If the AHO does not receive an NOI from any protestant, the AHO may transmit a proposed order to the Board that would cancel that protestant's protest.

STATUS CONFERENCE STATEMENTS

On or before the deadline listed below, each participant shall submit and serve a status conference statement that separately addresses each of the status conference issues listed above that the participant wants to address. The participants also may include in their status conference statements discussions of any other issues they believe are relevant. Parties with common interests may file joint status conference statements.
