Dear Jeanine Townsend,

I would like the Board to consider the effects that two logging projects have had to kings creek (before highway 9, two miles from downtown boulder creek, san lorenzo valley) that empties into the San Lorenzo River, which then empties into the Monterey Bay that has 1) destroyed all macrovertibrate habitat and 2) destroyed the habitat and any and all fish species. Both effects to the food source and fish occurred suddenly, after two up stream logging projects and heavy rain. I have been counting species since 2006. In 2009, the effects took a toll both species have been absent since.

The state water board has allowed the central coast to abandoned its water quality monitoring projects related to timber harvest plans JUST to their jurisdiction, and is not fair to our environment and will effect the bay, the estuary and is at a critical braking point.

How well did the prior "annual status report on the development of sediment quality objectives" work for that decision? And will this sediment event be reported on?

I attach a video of our new sediment laiden mud river (hopefully it is 15 mb or shorter, if it isn't i'll try to attach still pics) It is a little larger than 15 mb, so i attached stills of the video. Let me know if you need the video.
