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eSMR2 and Discharger Reported Violations

The group discussed the new Electronic Self Monitoring System (eSMR2) and its requirement for dischargers to complete the violation tab. These self reported violations create violation records in CIWQS. The group was concerned that there would be incidences that should not be violations but needed discussion. The group therefore initially thought that these self-reported violations should be created with the status of "potential" not "violation." The group did want to see more about the system and requested that a demo or mock-ups of the eSMR screens be shown during the next meeting.

Public Reports – Data Resolution Procedures

This document outlines the process for reporting and resolving data issues identified in California Integrated Water Quality System (CIWQS) public reports. It is limited to the interaction with CIWQS and does not dictate regulatory program functions.

Data issues generally fall into the following three categories:

- 1. Data entry errors
- 2. Data interpretation conflicts
- 3. Report errors

The first type includes transposing numbers or making incorrect links¹. The second type includes such situation where the caseworker has determined there is a violation, but the discharger does not think there is a violation. The third type of error involves programming and refresh problems of the report that is displaying the information.

The process begins when a data issue is identified in the CIWQS public reports. The problem is then submitted to the Water Board using an online form. A mock-up of the form is shown on page three of this document. The online form automatically generates an email that includes the reported information.

The email will go to an email box that an assigned student checks. The student confirms the reported issue, creates an issue in Mantis, and investigates it. The student works with the appropriate Regional CIWQS Coordinator to determine if the issue is a data entry error or a data interpretation conflict.


If it is a data entry error, the issue is assigned to the data cleanup lead at the regional board to correct. The data cleanup lead or designee emails the issue reporter so the reporter can confirm the issue is resolved.

If it is a data interpretation conflict, the issue is assigned to the caseworker. The caseworker investigates and sends an email to the issue reporter. If appropriate, the caseworker changes the data. If the caseworker verifies that the record/data is in fact correct, no change will be made and the issue is considered resolved.

The process is illustrated in the diagram below.

¹ In CIWQS, data is recorded by linking records together using various, designated role/relationships that describe why the records are linked together.
