Dear Executive Director Sobeck:

We write to encourage the State Water Resources Control Board to increase data collection on the prevalence of water debt impacting California's low-income households, and to collect more data on the number of vulnerable small water systems who may be impacted by the pandemic.

Communities across California, but particularly low-income communities of color, are suffering because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The pandemic's financial and economic impacts make access to water less affordable for many. While a statewide moratorium on water utility shut offs is appreciated and has provided continued water access for many families, these costs pile up, leaving potentially large cumulative water bills due when the moratorium concludes.

Increasing data collection will provide critical information on the prevalence of water debt and identify the communities and small water systems that are most impacted. The more we can better understand how access to safe and affordable water is being impacted by the pandemic, the more we will be better positioned to proactively and thoughtfully respond before a crisis occurs such as mass water shutoffs for low-income families. The imperative of safe and affordable water has never been clearer than now.

Thank you for your consideration of this request. We appreciate your leadership in providing Californians access to safe and affordable drinking water in this difficult time.
