### Project Name: Truckee Donner Land Trust Memorial Overland Emigrant Trail Project (SWRCB ID: SB25027GN)

**Background:** On April 17, 2025, the Truckee Donner Land Trust submitted an application for Clean Water Act section 401 water quality certification for the Truckee Donner Land Trust Memorial Overland Emigrant Trail Project (Project) by requesting authorization under the Statewide Restoration General Order (Order WQ 2022-0048-DWQ).

**Project Description:** The purpose of the Project is to improve connectivity along Donner Summit as well as provide additional north to south trail alternatives to the Pacific Crest Trail. The Project is located on lands under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Forest Service, California Department of Parks and Recreation, and privately owned.

The Project includes approximately 21 miles of trail divided into three segments: Shallenberger Ridge Trail, Roller Pass Trail, and Forest Service Ridge Trail. Construction will happen in three phases. The Shallenberger Ridge Trail would be constructed as Phase 1 starting at a Donner Memorial State Park trailhead and continuing west to the Sugar Bowl Resort. The Roller Pass Trail would be Phase 2, which continues down through the Sugar Bowl Resort property and includes the addition of a new trailhead. The Forest Service Ridge Trail would be Phase 3, extending west from the Roller Pass Trail and ultimately ending at Sode Springs Road connecting to the existing Soda Springs Trail.

Areas where streams cross the proposed trail segments would be impacted during construction but restored. Each of the three proposed trail segments have been designed to minimize environmental impacts while optimizing trail usability for multiple non-motorized user types. Construction methods, including equipment choice along the proposed trail segments, will be determined upon terrain, habitat sensitivity, and soils present.

A Certification or Denial will be prepared by the State Water Board for the Truckee Donner Land Trust Memorial Overland Emigrant Trail Project in response to this application.
