The following information is provided in satisfaction of the public notice requirements of section 3858, title 23, of the California Code of Regulations, which govern the State's Water Quality Certification Program.

State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) staff are proposing to regulate this Project pursuant to section 401 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1341) and the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act. Staff will consider all comments submitted in writing and received at this office during a 21-day comment period that begins on the first full date of issuance of this notice (April 2, 2025) and ends at 5:00 p.m. on the last day of the comment period (April 22, 2025). Project Name: State Routes 94 and 188 Asset Management Project

(Reg. Meas. ID: 460535 and SWRCB ID: SB25020IN)

Background: On March 19, 2025, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) submitted an application for Clean Water Act section 401 water quality certification for the State Routes 94 and 188 Asset Management Project (Project).

Project Description: The Project proposes to rehabilitate culvert systems along State Route 94 to restore serviceability and to prevent culvert failures that may damage the highway. Additionally, the existing pavement on State Route 188 will be rehabilitated to improve ride quality and pedestrian ramps will be upgraded to meet current standards. Project activities will occur between post miles 15.2 to 65.3 on SR-94 and post miles 0.0 to 1.9 on State Route 188.

The Project application reports impacts to waters of the state, including waters of the United States, as shown in Table 1. Temporarily impacted areas would be restored to pre-project condition once the Project is complete.
