## Project Name: 2025 Fisheries Restoration Grant Program

(Reg. Meas. ID: 464025 and SWRCB ID: SB26004IN)

**Background:** On January 28, 2026, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) submitted a Clean Water Act section 401 water quality certification application for the 2025 Program by requesting authorization under the Statewide Restoration General Order (Order WQ 2022-0048-DWQ). The date (2025) refers to the grant cycle year that individual projects were chosen by CDFW, not the year that the Program application was received. That is, individual projects selected for Program funding during the 2025 grant cycle are being considered for water quality certification in 2026.

**Project Description:** The purpose of proposed activities is to restore degraded salmonid habitat with the goal of increasing populations of wild anadromous fish in coastal streams and watersheds. The Program would include individual project activities at several sites located in various streams and watersheds.

The Program application reports impacts to waters of the state, including waters of the United States, as shown in Table 1. Temporarily impacted areas would be restored to pre-project condition once Program activities are complete. The application further reports total quantities of restored waters of the state, as provided in Table 2.
