The following information is provided in satisfaction of the public notice requirements of section 3858, title 23, of the California Code of Regulations, which govern the State's Water Quality Certification Program.

State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) staff are proposing to regulate this Program pursuant to section 401 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1341) and the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act. **Staff will consider all comments submitted in writing and received at this office during a 21-day comment period that begins on the first full date of issuance of this notice (March 12, 2026) and ends at 5:00 p.m. on the last day of the comment period (April 2, 2026).** To submit comments, or if you have questions, please contact the State Water Board staff person listed below.

Background: On March 14, 2025, Orange County Public Works (OCPW) submitted an application for Clean Water Act section 401 water quality certification for the Countywide Long-Term Routine Maintenance Program, RGP 106 (Program).

Program Description: The purpose of the Program is to perform countywide routine maintenance activities for designated flood control facilities located within the applicant's right-of-way. Maintenance of facilities, such as channels, basins, and small dams, would include: silt removal; slope maintenance and repair; landscape maintenance, vegetation control and removal; insect and rodent control; rip-rap installation and repair; structural inspection and cleaning; removal and replacement of concrete lining; and the repair and backfill of washouts.

Individual projects (or activities) performed under the Program, as reported in the application, would result in temporary and permanent impacts to waters of the state, including waters of the United States. Temporarily impacted areas would be restored to pre-project condition once the individual project is complete. Compensatory mitigation would be required for permanent impacts on an individual project basis.

The County of Orange, acting as lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), adopted an Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration (IS/MND) for the Program (IP 11-444) (SCH No. 2012111011) following completion of the public comment period on May 21, 2013. The County of Orange subsequently approved Addendum No. 1 to the Countywide Long-Term Routine Maintenance Permitting Program ISMND in February 2025. A Notice of Determination was subsequently filed on March 4, 2026. This IS/MND and Addendum No. 1 is available at 600 N. Ross Street, Santa Ana, CA 92702.

A Certification or Denial will be prepared by the State Water Board for the OCPW Long-Term Routine Maintenance Program, RGP 106 in response to this application.

In California, Regional Water Quality Control Boards (Regional Water Boards) issue or deny Certification for discharges within their geographical jurisdiction. The State Water Board has this responsibility for projects (or programs) affecting waters within multiple Regional Water Board jurisdictions.
