Summary

The Town of Scotia implemented and developed various SEPs to provide water quality benefits to the Eel River. Scotia's SEP included four components:

- 1. Developed and implemented a stormwater management program for residents by holding workshops that explained good housekeeping skills, and distributing to the community the storm drain maintenance brochure "Town of Scotia and its Storm Water Drainage System".
- 2. Provide ongoing informal training to staff responsible for storm drain maintenance in Scotia. Information reviewed during the trainings have been regarding stormwater management plans and keeping good housekeeping tasks by installing new storm drain markings around the town of Scotia.
- 3. Implemented a rebate program for water conservation fixtures by providing a direct replacement for older toilets with new "low-flow" toilets.
- 4. Implemented and developed a NPDES compliance workshop that provides residents and personnel of Scotia with good housekeeping skills by not disposing hazardous water and materials down the drain or the toilet that would interfere with the wastewater treatment process.
