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## Program Background

- CWSRF Est'd in 1987 by Clean Water Act Amendment
  - Low interest loans and limited principal forgiveness for water quality projects
- State loans/grants complement CWSRF
  - CWSRF Policy and IUP applicable to CWSRF and complementary sources
  - Policy last amended November 28, 2018
- > High Demand
  - >\$7.0 billion

### **Eligible Projects**

# Eligible Project Types May Depend on the Applicant Type and the Funding Source

- 1. Publicly-Owned Treatment Works (Wastewater & Storm Water)
- 2. Non-Point Source & Storm Water
- 3. Estuary Plans (SF Bay, Morro Bay, Santa Monica Bay)
- 4. Construct, repair, or replace decentralized wastewater treatment systems
- 5. Manage, reduce, treat, or recapture stormwater or subsurface drainage water
- 6. Public agency measures to reduce demand for POTW capacity through water conservation, efficiency, or reuse
- 7. Development and implementation of watershed projects meeting CWA Section 122 criteria
- 8. Public agency measures to reduce energy consumption of POTW
- 9. Reusing or recycling wastewater, stormwater, or subsurface drainage water
- 10. Increase security of POTW
- 11. To qualified nonprofits to assist owners and operators of small and medium POTW
  - Plan, develop, and obtain financing for eligible projects and
  - Help those POTW achieve compliance with CWA
- 12. To qualified nonprofits to assist eligible individuals
  - repair or replace existing individual household decentralized wastewater treatment systems or
  - connect individual household to a POTW

### Eligible Applicants & Costs

#### Eligibility May Depend on the Funding Source

- ➤ Applicants: Cities, Counties, Districts, Joint Power Authorities, State Agencies, Non-Profits, Private Entities (Select Categories and Sources), and Tribes
- Costs: Planning, Design, Construction, Construction
  Management, Administration, and Value Engineering





### **Financial Outlook**


- Sustainable CWSRF Loan Capacity
  - Approximately \$1.0 Billion per year
- Complementary Funds
  - SCG
    - Grant and PF = \$78 million
  - WRFP
    - Grant = \$8.8 million (\$48.8 million if Prop 68 appropriated)
    - Loan = \$105 million (\$137 million if Prop 68 appropriated)
  - Stormwater
    - Grant = \$96.4 million
      - Final solicitation early 2019
  - Groundwater
    - Grant = \$675 million
      - Round 2 Concepts early 2018
      - Additional solicitations 2019 and/or 2020

### The Fundable List

- Fundable List Identifies Projects DFA Can Finance
  - Only Projects on Fundable List Eligible
- Loan Demand > Loan Capacity
  - Therefore, Scoring/Ranking Other (Primarily Loan) Projects, and
  - Funding Target = 90% → 125% of Sustainable Loan Capacity



### **Small Disadvantaged Communities**

### Automatically on Fundable List

- Applications are not scored and ranked
- Initial eligibility screening by DFA staff
- Eligibility re-checked/confirmed prior to funding by DFA staff

### Small Community Grant (SCG) Funding

- Current demand exceeds funding available
- > DFA staff qualifies applications for all available funding sources
- Based of readiness to proceed and availability of funding
- Prioritizing construction projects

### **Small Disadvantaged Communities**

- Small Community
  - > <20,000 people
- Disadvantaged Community
  - <80% Median Household Income (MHI)</p>
- Severely Disadvantaged Community
  - > <60% MHI



# Scoring & Ranking Essentials

- Sum of 3 Components; Intended to be Mutually Exclusive
  - Primary Score water quality conditions
  - Secondary Score applicant or project features
  - Readiness Score ensure timely use of cash
- Maximum Score = 16
- Cut-Off Score
  - Projects with Same Score Either Fundable or Not Fundable
- Increase Funding to Past Partially Funded Projects?


# Process: Scoring and Developing the Fundable List

### What's New?

### CWSRF Policy Amendment

- New Priority Scoring System & Fundable List
- Eligible Start Date: construction costs can be eligible starting at Notice to Proceed (\* Applicants can start construction at their own risk! Being "Fundable" <u>DOES NOT GUARANTEE</u> an Executed Funding Agreement.)
- "Restructure" Planning & Design Loans
- Bridge Financing costs to cover eligible project costs until CWSRF is approved (\* Applicants should verify eligibility before closing bridge financing!)
- New Eligible Project Costs
  - Replacement of Private Laterals (\* No direct funding to homeowners!)
  - Recycled water onsite user retrofits (\* No direct funding to individual property owners!)

### What's New? (Cont.)

- Principal Forgiveness = "Non-Repayable Financing"
- New Credit Review Appendix N
- Debt service coverage
  - Increased senior and parity coverage from 1.1 to 1.2 times
  - Lowered subordinate coverage to 1.0 times

### Short-Term Financing Incentive

0.25% reduction for 20-year financing term

## Stays the Same

- PF for "Green" Projects
  - \$32 million Available from 2017 Cap Grant; No New Funds After 2017 Fund Committed
  - Projects on 18-19 Fundable List Have Priority
- Optional Match Financing
  - Effective Rate is 1.2% on 30-year Match Loan
- Application Process
- Applications Accepted Continuously
  - Will Assist & Review as Time Permits
  - No Deadline to Submit Applications
    - December 31<sup>st</sup> Deadline for Complete Application for Readiness Scoring

## Stays the Same

- Fundable List Not a Guarantee of Funding
  - Must Meet all Eligibility Criteria for Funding
- Retroactive Planning & Design Costs
  - Project Planning & Design Costs Remain Eligible
     Regardless When Incurred
  - Must Still Be Documented

### **Implementation**

- Execute all Fundable Agreements by June 30, 2020
  - Applications not Funded Will Roll Over to 2020-21
     Fundable List
- Mid-Year Status Report
  - Progress Towards Executing Agreements
  - Only Additions to Fundable List will be Small SDAC, Small DAC, or Public Health Projects

### Status Reports

- Individual Monthly Application Status Reports on Fundable Projects
- Modify Web Status Report to Provide Additional Information
