

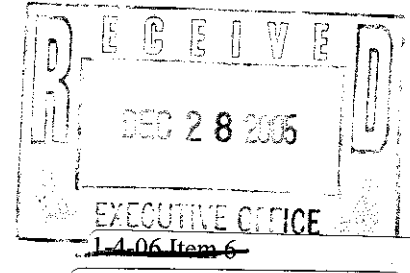

SSO Hearing - 2/8/06

Dear Chairwoman Doduc and Members:

This is written on behalf of the City of Azusa to express opposition to the Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) for Wastewater Collection System Agencies and the accompanying Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) in their current form. The City of Azusa is supportive of the goals of the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to implement the Sanitary Sewer Overflow Reduction Program to reduce the number and volume of Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSOs) throughout the state.

However, as you acknowledge in your Fact Sheet, the projected annual cost of implementing the Statewide WDR is approximately \$870 million, resulting in an average annual cost per household of \$71.86. For many households, this added cost will be very manageable. However, the cost per household in some cities will undoubtedly be much higher. For disadvantaged households in cities experiencing higher-than-average SSMP implementation costs, the added costs will not be easily manageable. The costs experienced by these households should not be further increased by fines or third party litigation due to SSOs that occur even after full SSMP implementation and full compliance with WDR and MRP requirements. The WDR must strongly differentiate between negligent and non-negligent SSOs, and should provide the citizens of California with protection against fines and lawsuits based on SSOs from collection systems managed, operated and maintained according to the standards and requirements established by this new regulatory program.

The City of Azusa strongly urges the SWRCB not to adopt the WDR and MRP without the inclusion of language which would offer some protection to the citizens of California from potentially unfair and unreasonable regulatory fines and third party litigation.
