


## SOUTH PLACER MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

Dear Chairman Hoppin and Members of the Board:

Thank you for the opportunity to provide our comment on the proposed revisions to the State Water Resources Control Board's (State Water Board) proposed revisions to the Sanitary Sewer System Waste Discharge Requirements (SSS WDR). South Placer Municipal Utility District (the District) partners with CVCWA and CWEA and concurs with the comments provided to you by the Clean Water Summit Partners.

South Placer Municipal Utility District serves the City of Rocklin, the Town of Loomis and the communities of Penryn and a portion of Granite Bay – a population of approximately 65,000. The District has expended significant resources as a result of the initial Order to ensure compliance (SSMP Gap Analysis, Hydraulic Model, Source Control Program, new equipment purchases.) In addition, the District has reviewed and evaluated its processes and procedures, related to system operations and emergency response plan, to ensure effectiveness and compliance.

It seems that making significant changes, as proposed, are not necessary at this point. The Order has been in effect for a relatively short time and the data collected to this point does not seem sufficient to be making decisions and substantial changes. It would be unfortunate to make the proposed changes to the current Order without allowing adequate time to demonstrate the order's effectiveness in reducing sanitary sewer overflows and holding collection system owner/operators accountable.
