BACKGROUND

On April 1, 2014, the State Water Resources Control Board adopted [Order 2014-0057-DWQ](#) for statewide regulation of storm water discharges associated with industrial activities (General Permit). The General Permit includes a reopener to incorporate Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) requirements through a future permit amendment (Section XX.A). The proposed General Permit Amendment incorporates requirements for implementing existing TMDLs adopted by the San Francisco Bay, Santa Ana, Los Angeles, and San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Boards identifying industrial storm water as a source of the receiving water impairment.

In December 2017, State Water Board staff held focused stakeholder meetings with interested parties that submitted public comments regarding the Regional Water Board draft TMDL-implementation language during the March 2016 public comment period. During subsequent collaborative stakeholder meetings, the proposed statewide compliance options were initially developed. The proposed General Permit Amendment includes statewide compliance options to allow compliance with water quality objectives through onsite and regional storm water capture best management practices in place of typical compliance with numeric action levels and numeric effluent limitations.

On August 19, 2014, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) promulgated the new *Use of Sufficiently Sensitive Test Methods for Permit Applications and Reporting Rule* for discharges regulated by NPDES permits. The new Rule became effective on September 18, 2014, after the existing Statewide Industrial General Permit was adopted. The new Rule requires NPDES permittee to use “sufficiently sensitive” analytical test methods for the analyses of regulated pollutants or pollutants parameters. The proposed General Permit Amendment includes revised monitoring and reporting requirements for industrial storm water sampling consistent with the new Rule.

The State Water Board will schedule a meeting subsequent to the public hearing at which the Board will consider adoption of the proposed General Permit Amendment.


