Scientific Collecting Permits

Mission of the Department

• The Mission of the Department of Fish and Wildlife is to **manage** California's diverse fish, wildlife, and plant resources, and the habitats upon which they depend, for their ecological values and for their use and enjoyment by the public.

What is Take

• F & G Code Division 0.5 Section 86 "Take" means hunt, pursue, catch, capture, or kill or **attempt to** hunt, **pursue**, catch, capture, or kill.

CESA

• F & G Division 3 Chapter 1.5 Article 3 Section 2080: **NO** person shall import into this state, export out of this state, or take, possess, purchase, or sell within this state, any species, or any part or product thereof, that the commission determines to be an endangered species or a threatened species, or attempt any of those acts, except as otherwise provided in this chapter...

Fully Protected Species

• 5515. (a) (1) Except as provided in Section 2081.7 or 2835, fully protected fish or parts thereof may not be taken or possessed at any time. No provision of this code or any other law shall be construed to authorize the issuance of permits or licenses to take any fully protected fish, and no permits or licenses heretofore issued shall have any force or effect for that purpose. However, the department may authorize the taking of those species for necessary scientific research, including efforts to recover fully protected, threatened, or endangered species.

SCP

• F & G Division 2 Chapter 3 Article 1 Section 1002 **The** department may issue permits, subject to restrictions and regulations that the department determines are desirable, to take or possess, in any part of the state, for scientific, educational, or propagation purposes, mammals, birds and the nests and eggs thereof, fish, amphibians, reptiles, or any other form of plant or animal life.

Memorandum of Understanding

• No longer valid for use as permits for take for non-listed species.
