Non-State Listed	§ 1002, 1002.5 (Title 14 § 650) – scientific, education, and propagation	SCP
State Listed	CESA Threatened, Endangered or Candidate § 2081(a) – scientific, education, management	MOU
Fully Protected (FP)	§ 3511, 4700, 5050, 5515 (Title 14 § 670.7) – necessary scientific research, including recovery of listed species	MOU

- Completeness review
 - Obtain details from applicant
- Content review
 - Coordinate with specialists
 - Regional
 - Species
 - Obtain details from applicant
- Condition take
- LRB for final processing

Common Application Errors

Inadequate Details (Sec. 5 – Justification)

Locations, Capture Methods, Procedures (qualifications)



- Minnow traps will be used to capture juvenile fish
- Description of minnow traps that includes;
 - Baited yes/no
 - Locations, soak time, and check frequency
 - *#, size, and mesh size*

Missing target and by-catch take numbers

• Exception – Freshwater invertebrates

Potential effects on target and by-catch species

Missing permits (MOU or Federal)

CESA & Fully Protected MOUs

California Endangered Species Act (CESA) - FGC § 2081(a)



Purposes: Science, Education, Management

Fully Protected (FP) - FGC § 3511, 4700, 5050, 5515





Purpose: Necessary scientific research, recovery for these or State listed species



CESA or FP MOU Request

Information needed is similar to SCPs

- Permitholder Information
- Purpose

- Capture Methods/Procedures
- Take & Location Information

Sampling Season





FP MOUs – Public Information Notice

Fisheries Branch

- Prepare a PIN describing the proposed work
 *Reference a Federal Permit # Federally Listed Species
- Submit the PIN to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL)
 California Regulatory Notice Register
 - 30 day public review period

Bioassessment Considerations

Locations for sampling

Potential for by-catch of sensitive species

- Check occurrence (CNDDB, Special Animals List)
- Seasonal or perennial flow \rightarrow Suitable habitat?
- Gear has the potential to capture non-target species?

Expected take numbers

• Not required for invertebrates identified and counted off site.
