The Contra Costa Watershed Forum is offering a series of regionally focused creek and watershed symposia on March 28, 30 and April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2006. The Forum is comprised of some thirty agencies, non-profit groups and interested individuals whose mission are to protect and restore watersheds in the County. The first creek and watershed symposium in 1999 has created this group. Since then, the Forum meets every other month to collaborate existing resources and to implement watershed restoration strategies.

You and anyone who are interested in creek and watersheds are invited to this event. The main goals of the -symposia are listed below:

• to present the results of the Citizen Creek Monitoring Program (Global Positioning System creek data and Benthic Macroinvertebrate data

collected between 2003 and 2005 by local volunteers); and

- to introduce the Contra Costa Watershed Forum (how a collaboration of agencies and non-profit organizations is working since 1999);
- to encourage participation in local creek and watershed activities.

A two hour program will include a poster display and presentations, as well as light refreshments. The Databook, which summarizes the Global Positioning System creek data and Benthic Macroinvertebrate data collected by volunteers will be available at these events (free). To include more regionally focused topics, each event is slightly different from one another,
