

The photos that were in the attachment that you sent me are all taken at the mouth of the city storm drain that is shown in the left red block in the attached pictures. Note that NASSCO does not discharge to this drain system.

The red block to the right in the pictures represents the actual mouth of the creek and the Navy installs a boom at this location to capture trash and debris that comes down the creek during rain events. The trash and debris that is captured right at the boom is removed by the Navy.

One of the three cleanups that NASSCO conducts each year is just upstream from this location and attached is also a presentation with the photos from April's clean up in this area. This clean up site is to the right of the red area on the right of the attached pictures.

Obviously these photos are only a snap shot in time during our cleanup event but you can see there was a significant increase in the volume of the trash and debris compared to 2006.
