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ORDER ADOPTING DECLARATION OF FULLY APPROPRIATED STREAM SYSTEMS AND SPECIFYING CONDITIONS FOR ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS AND REGISTRATIONS

BY THE BOARD:

#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

Following notice pursuant to Water Code Section 1207, the Board held a hearing on March 14, 1989, to determine whether to adopt a declaration that certain stream systems are fully appropriated (Water Code Section 1205(a)), thereby precluding acceptance of applications to appropriate unappropriated water from sources subject to such declaration. systems under consideration by the Board for inclusion in the Declaration were identified in an attachment to the Notice of Public Hearing in this proceeding, dated December 22, 1988 (hereinafter, "the Hearing Notice

Attachment"). The Hearing Notice Attachment also specified, for each stream system under consideration, the season of unavailability of water for appropriation and the previous water right decision which determined that no water remains available for appropriation.

- The proceeding included inquiry into the conditions, if any, that should be established in such declaration upon which applications to appropriate water should nevertheless be accepted. (Water Code Section 1206(b).)
- Initiation of rights pursuant to the Water Rights

  Permitting Reform Act of 1988 (Water Code Section 1228

  et seq.; hereinafter, "the Permitting Reform Act") is

  also made subject to this proceeding by operation of

  law. (Water Code Section 1228.2(b).) Accordingly, in

  this Order the Board has made certain findings and

  established certain conditions specifically relating to

  registration of small domestic use appropriations

  pursuant to the Permitting Reform Act.
- Having taken official notice of previous water right decisions, and having considered the hearing presentations, the Board makes the following findings.

#### 2.0 GENERAL FINDING

Except as found in succeeding paragraphs, the Board finds that the stream systems identified in the Hearing Notice Attachment are fully appropriated during the seasons specified therein. Reference is made to Exhibit A to this Order, entitled "Declaration of Fully Appropriated Stream Systems", and by this reference Exhibit A is incorporated into this Order as though fully set forth herein. Exhibit A consists of the stream systems identified in the Hearing Notice Attachment, except that Exhibit A incorporates findings (including findings related to seasons of unavailability of water for appropriation from specific stream systems) set forth in Section 3.0, below. the Chief, Division of Water Rights, completes the action identified in Paragraph 2.1, next below, the result will be a compilation consisting of Exhibit A together with other appropriate conditions, authorized by Water Code Section 1206(b), as specified in succeeding paragraphs. For convenience, Exhibit A will hereinafter be referred to as "the Declaration".

The Chief, Division of Water Rights, should compile and maintain the Board's Declaration of Fully Appropriated Stream Systems, together with Conditions for Acceptance of Water Right Applications and Small Domestic Use

Registrations, all in accordance with the findings contained in this Order.

FINDINGS RELATED TO SPECIFIC STREAM SYSTEMS AND TO THE SEASONS OF UNAVAILABILITY OF WATER THEREIN

Based upon the water right decisions officially noticed; upon presentations and exhibits presented by interested persons at the hearing of March 14, 1989; upon information provided by staff and made part of the record of that hearing; and upon other matters officially noticed; the Board makes the following findings with respect to the stream systems under consideration. The stream systems upon which findings are made are organized by county. Final paragraphs address issues which encompass more than one stream system.

# 3.1 Alpine County

3.1.1 <u>Decision 54</u> (Bear River, tributary to Mokelumne River).

Amador County and Amador County Water Agency suggested that Decision 54 did not determine a season of non-availability for the Bear River and that the season determined by that decision for the Mokelumne River is inconsistent with later decisions regarding the Mokelumne River. The Board finds that the point is

valid with respect to Bear River. As to the Mokelumne River, the Hearing Notice Attachment did not show Decision 54 as determining a season of non-availability. Instead, the Hearing Notice Attachment showed Decisions 1109 and 1219 as determining the season of non-availability of water for Mokelumne River as July 1 through September 30, as pointed out by the participants. Following review of Decisions 1109 and 1219, it is found that the season as specified in the Hearing Notice Attachment is accurate.

3.1.2 Decision 609 (Shay Creek, Carson River System); United States of America v. Alpine Land and Reservoir Co., U.S.D.C., D.Nev., Civ. No. D-183: the "Alpine Decree" (Carson River System). The State Engineer of the State of Nevada appeared on his own behalf and on behalf of the Director of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, State of Nevada. This presentation was made in support of a finding, based on Decision 609, that no water is available for appropriation in any season from Shay Creek, a stream within the interstate Carson River System. The Board agrees. In addition, the State Engineer noted that the Alpine Decree contains a finding that the Carson River System is fully appropriated. The Alpine Decree does contain such finding. Accordingly, the entire Carson River System should, at this time and for the purposes of

this proceeding, be declared fully appropriated. However, the Board notes that the Alpine action was not an equitable apportionment of the waters of the interstate Carson River System between the States of California and Nevada. (See, generally, Colorado v. New Mexico, 459 U.S. 176.) Further, the Alpine action did not arise from a statutory in rem proceeding pursuant to Water Code Section 2500 et seq. or any federal law equivalent and is not subject to the special findings hereinafter made to govern applications for appropriation of water in statutorily adjudicated areas (see paragraph 6, below); and persons who were not parties to the Alpine action, or whose predecessors in interest were not parties, are not bound by the decree. Further the Board takes official notice of the introduction in the United States Senate on August 4, 1989, of S. 1554 by Senator Harry Reid of Nevada. Among other purposes, this measure could result in a Congressional apportionment of the waters of the Carson River, as well as the interstate Truckee River, between the States of California and Nevada. Such an apportionment could influence the question whether water is available for appropriation in California from these sources. Elsewhere in this Order the Board has made provision for revision of the Enactment of S. 1554, or an interstate Declaration.

apportionment effected through some other means, would be a basis for revising the Declaration with respect to the Carson River System. Other points made by the State Engineer in effect urge that the Declaration not result in disturbing vested rights. As the Board has found elsewhere in this Order, the Declaration is not intended and should not be construed to do so.

#### 3.2 Amador County

3.2.1 Decisions 685 and 761 (Jackson Creek, tributary to Mokelumne River); Decision 976 (South Fork Jackson Creek, tributary to Mokelumne River); and Decision 1311 (unnamed stream, tributary to Jackson Creek). Amador County and Amador County Water Agency contended that Decision 685 did not contain a determination of the season of unavailability of water from Jackson Creek, but that subsequent decisions determined the season of unavailability to be from early May to September 30 as to Jackson Creek (Decision 761), April 1 to September 30 as to South Fork Jackson Creek (Decision 976), and April 1 to September 30 as to unnamed stream tributary to Jackson Creek (Decision 1311). The Board finds that Decision 685 did contain a determination of the season of unavailability of water and that the determination made by subsequent Decision 761 is consistent therewith; however, the point is valid that the season

of unavailability determined by these two decisions is May 1 through September 30, and the Declaration should show that season. Similarly, the participants' points as to the seasons of unavailability determined by Decision 976 as to South Fork Jackson Creek, and by Decision 1311 as to unnamed stream tributary to Jackson Creek, are valid and the Declaration should show the season of unavailability in both these sources to be April 1 through September 30.

#### 3.3 <u>Calaveras County</u>

3.3.1 Decision 858 (Mokelumne River System; various sources within the Calaveras and Stanislaus River Systems). Amador County and the Amador County Water Agency urged that Decision 858 contains a determination of unavailability of unappropriated water only as to the Mokelumne River, although the proceeding which resulted in Decision 858 involved a number of sources outside the Mokelumne River System. The Board agrees, and finds that Decision 858 did not determine unavailability of unappropriated water from any source other than the Mokelumne River System. Accordingly, sources identified in the Attachment to the Hearing Notice as having been determined by Decision 858 as being conditionally fully appropriated should not be included in the Declaration. We emphasize, however,

that the determination made by Decision 858 of unavailability of unappropriated water from the Mokelumne River included the Mokelumne River System, that is, the River and its tributaries.

3.3.2 Decisions 1179 and 1601 (Calaveras River). Calaveras County Water District pointed out that Decisions 1179 and 1601 confirmed the fully appropriated status of the Calaveras River, a point with which the Board agrees. These decisions also create procedures for protecting the water needs of Calaveras County pursuant to countyof-origin and watershed-of-origin principles. District's presentation sought assurance that these procedures would not be disturbed by the instant proceeding. Elsewhere in this Order we have provided for the filing, under certain circumstances, of applications which are inconsistent with the Declaration. One such circumstance is area-of-origin protection. Filings pursuant to area-of-origin protection principles represented by Decisions 1179 and 1601 with respect to Calaveras County should be accepted.

# 3.4 El Dorado County

3.4.1 <u>Decision 390</u> (Middle Fork Cosumnes River and Sopiago Creek). The Cosumnes River Water and Power Authority

pointed out that Decision 390 determined the seasons of unavailability of water for appropriation from these sources to be July 1 through November 30 (Middle Fork Cosumnes River) and May 16 through November 30 (Sopiago Creek). Following review of Decision 390, the Board agrees, and the Declaration should show those seasons for these sources.

- 3.4.2 Decisions 684 and 992 (Scott Creek, tributary to South Fork Cosumnes River and Clear Creek, tributary to North Fork Cosumnes River.) The Cosumnes River Water and Power Authority pointed out that Decisions 684 and 992 did not include a specific date for the end of the season of unavailability of water from these sources. This observation is correct. However, a necessarily implied finding of these decisions is that water would not become available for appropriation until commencement of the winter season. For this drainage, it is found that the winter season will commence in most years on November 1. Accordingly, the Declaration should show November 1 as the end of the season of unavailability of water for appropriation from these sources.
- 3.4.3 <u>Decisions 999 and 1075</u> (Jackass Creek, tributary to North Fork Cosumnes River). The Cosumnes River Water

and Power Authority suggested that Decision 999 was effectively superseded by the later Decision 1075. The Authority further contended that the season of unavailability of water for appropriation determined by Decision 1075 should be July 1 through September 30. The Board agrees; the season of unavailability of water for appropriation from Jackass Creek should be governed by Decision 1075 and the Declaration should show that the season of unavailability determined by Decision 1075 is July 1 through September 30.

Decision 1451 (Grizzly Creek, tributary to Steely Fork Cosumnes River; and unnamed stream and unnamed spring tributary to Steely Fork Cosumnes River). The Cosumnes River Water and Power Authority pointed out that Decision 1451 determined the seasons of unavailability of water to be July 1 through October 31 (direct diversion) and June 1 through October 31 (storage). The Board agrees and the Declaration should show the season suggested. The distinction between the season of unavailability for direct diversion and the season of unavailability for storage is valid and should be maintained.

# 3.5 Fresno County

3.5.1 <u>Decision 1290</u> (Kings River, and Fresno Slough tributary to San Joaquin River). Staff has pointed out that

Decision 1290 determined that Kings River and Fresno Slough are fully appropriated year-round. Accordingly, the Declaration should include these stream systems.

#### 3.6 Humboldt County

3.6.1 <u>Decision 531</u> (Jacoby Creek tributary to Humboldt Bay).

Staff has pointed out that Decision 531 determined that

Jacoby Creek is fully appropriated from August 1

through September 30. Accordingly, the Declaration

should include this source.

#### 3.7 <u>Inyo County</u>

- Decision 402 (Birch Creek and Milk Creek, also known by other names, tributary to Owens River System.) The Baxter Ranch contended that Decision 402 does not support a finding that both Birch Creek and Mill Creek are fully appropriated year-round. The Board finds that Decision 402 did determine that Birch Creek is fully appropriated year-round and that water is unavailable for appropriation from Milk Creek from May 1 through September 1.
- 3.7.2 <u>Decisions 165 and 694</u> (Thompson Canyon and Darwin Wash, both within Panamint Valley). A presentation by the Bureau of Land Management, United States Department of Interior, supported a finding that no water is

available for appropriation in any season from these sources. The Board agrees.

#### 3.8 Kern County

- Decision 1196 (Kern River System). The Kern River
  Water Users urged the Board to find that no water is
  available for appropriation in any season from this
  source. The Kern Property Corporation urged that
  Decision 1196 could not be interpreted as a
  determination that no water remains available for
  appropriation in the Kern River System. The difficulty
  arises from the phrasing of Finding paragraph 8 of
  Decision 1196:
  - "8. There has been no showing that there is unappropriated water available to supply the applicants."

The Board's finding of an absence of a showing of availability of unappropriated water is not the same thing as a determination by the Board that no water is available for appropriation. However, in Finding paragraph 7 of Decision 1196 the Board stated:

"7. A comparison of the quantities of water used in the First Point, Second Point, and Lower River Service Areas for the period 1894-1963, with the quantities of water flowing past the first point of measurement, adjusted to eliminate the effect of Isabella Reservoir, shows that there is no water surplus to the established uses of the applicants, protestants, and

other users in these areas. This conclusion is further supported by the fact that ground water levels within the service areas are declining, and agencies within the area have entered into or are negotiating contracts to purchase additional water from the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation and from water facilities now under construction by the State of California." (Emphasis added.)

If there exists any ambiguity as to whether Decision 1196 determined that no water remains available for appropriation in the Kern River System, the Board is aided by the administrative record upon which the decision is based. That record contains ample substantial evidence to support a finding that no water remains available for appropriation. The record also contains an engineering staff analysis prepared by a senior staff engineer. After reviewing the record of the hearing on the applications with which Decision 1196 was concerned, the engineer concluded:

"The water of the Kern River is fully appropriated and apportioned under existing agreements and court decrees and no unappropriated water is available for use under the applications being considered."

Accordingly, the Board finds that Decision 1196 does determine that no water remains available for appropriation in the Kern River System.

- 3.9 Kings County
- 3.9.1 <u>Decision 1290</u> (Kings River). See paragraph 3.5.1, above.

#### 3.10 Lassen County

Decisions 155, 1182, and 1572 (unnamed stream tributary to Willow Creek; and Willow Creek, tributary to Susan River). McCain Associates made a presentation disputing a determination that water is unavailable for appropriation from the Willow Creek System year-round, as suggested by Decision 155. The Board agrees.

Decision 155 should be removed from the Declaration.

Review of the later decisions shows that water has been determined not to be available for appropriation from the unnamed tributary to Willow Creek from April 1 through October 31, and from Willow Creek from March 1 through November 30.

# 3.11 Los Angeles County

3.11.1 Decisions 385 and 412 (Walnut Creek and Live Oak
Canyon, both within the San Gabriel River System). The
court-appointed Watermaster supported a finding that no
water is available for appropriation in any season from
these sources. The Board agrees.

3.11.2 <u>Decision 42</u> (Big Rock Creek, within Rogers Lake Basin).

A presentation pointed out that the source addressed by this decision is an unnamed spring tributary to Big Rock Creek. The Board agrees and the Declaration should reflect this limitation.

#### 3.12 Marin County

- 3.12.1 <u>Decision 1453</u> (unnamed stream tributary to Pacific Ocean). The National Park Service supported the season of unavailability of water for appropriation as shown in the Hearing Notice Attachment, that is, October 1 through April 30.
- Bay). The National Park Service also urged that the seasons of unavailability of water for appropriation from Lagunitas Creek were incorrectly shown in the Hearing Notice Attachment, that is, May 1 through June 30; and September 1 through October 30. The Board agrees with the Service. It is found that Decision 1582 determined that water is unavailable for appropriation from any source within the Lagunitas Creek System from May 1 through November 30, and that further unappropriated water is unavailable year-round from any source within the Lagunitas Creek System above Kent Lake.

- 3.13 <u>Mendocino County</u>
- River). The Mendocino County Water Agency (MCWA) stated that two of the three prior rights, the exercise of which led to the fully appropriated determination in Decision 1007, no longer exist. Therefore, it was contended, this source should not be determined to be fully appropriated. However, the fact of extinction of these rights, and the effect of any such extinction upon the water supply in this source, is beyond the scope of this proceeding. As provided elsewhere in this Order, opportunity will be afforded interested persons to seek revision of the Declaration; that procedure will include provision for making showings of the type urged here by MCWA.
- 3.13.2 <u>Decision 1009</u> (unnamed stream tributary to Navarro River). MCWA pointed out that Decision 1009 determined the season of unavailability of water from this source to be May 15 through October 15, rather than the season set forth in the Hearing Notice Attachment. The Board agrees and the Declaration should show this change.
- 3.13.3 <u>Decision 1107</u> (Reynolds Creek, tributary to the Pacific Ocean). MCWA pointed out that Decision 1107 determined

the season of unavailability to be summer and early fall, rather than year-round as set forth in the Hearing Notice Attachment. The Board agrees; the Declaration should show the season of unavailability to be June 1 through October 1.

3.13.4 Decisions 1110, 1141, 1151, and 1258; and Decision 1610 (Russian River, tributary to Pacific Ocean). urged that the Russian River not be declared to be fully appropriated, during the season specified in the Attachment to the Hearing Notice, for the following reasons: (1) the Board has allegedly issued permits to appropriate from the Russian River during the season of unavailability specified in the Attachment to the Hearing Notice; (2) the impact of Decision 1610 has altered the circumstances under which the earlier decisions were made; (3) county-of-origin concerns. The Board finds that the key permits authorizing appropriation from the Russian River, issued and amended as the result of the decisions specified in the Attachment to the Hearing Notice, together with Decision 1610, contain terms and conditions tailored to meet the concerns expressed by MCWA. However, the Board further finds that, except as to applications filed pursuant to these terms and conditions, water is unavailable for appropriation from the Russian River

during the season July 1 through October 15. The administrative rules to be proposed by the Chief, Division of Water Rights, for adoption by the Board in implementation of this Order should contain provisions governing applications filed pursuant to terms and conditions of these decisions.

- River). MCWA suggested that some unappropriated water is available to supply domestic uses, in that the permit issued by Decision 1258 has been licensed for only one-half the permitted amount. However, the reason for the reduction of the permitted amount in the license, and the effect of that reduction on the water supply in the source, is beyond the scope of this proceeding. As provided elsewhere in this Order, opportunity will be afforded interested persons to seek revision of the Declaration; that procedure will include provision for making showings of the type urged here by MCWA.
- 3.13.6 <u>Decision 1403</u> (South Fork Eel River, tributary to Eel River). MCWA pointed out that the proceeding leading to Decision 1403 was a limited proceeding and that no evidence was given or received on the question of availability of unappropriated water. The Board

The Decision 1403 proceeding involved agrees. applications which may fairly be called "protective" applications. These applications in effect sought authorization to continue the power diversion historically made by Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) of water from the South Fork Eel River and discharged into the upper Russian River watershed. applications were made to quard against the possibility that the PG&E diversion might be discontinued. Decision 1403 denied the applications on the basis that they were premature. Unlike proceedings on some other protective applications, neither Decision 1403 nor the underlying record can fairly be read to contain a determination, either express or implied, on the question of availability of unappropriated water in this source. Accordingly, the Declaration should not include the South Fork Eel River.

# 3.14 Mono County

Oistrict, U.S.D.C., D.Nev., In Equity No. C-125: the "Walker River Decree" (Walker River Stream System). A presentation was made asking the Board to acknowledge riparian and pre-1914 rights that were not taken into account in the Walker River Decree. The legislative mandate pursuant to which this proceeding is conducted

does not include adjudication of specific water rights. The proceeding is prospective: the legal effect of a declaration that a stream system is fully appropriated is that the Board may not accept future applications to appropriate water, except under suitable conditions, and may make appropriate disposition of pending applications to appropriate water from these sources. Further, as emphasized elsewhere in this Order, the Declaration is not intended and should not be construed as disturbing vested rights. However, whether the Walker River Decree determined that no water remains available for appropriation in the Walker River System is a relevant inquiry. Unlike the Alpine Decree for the Carson River System, discussed above, the Walker River Decree does not contain an express finding that the Walker River System is fully appropriated. Further, we take official notice of the Federal District Court's Order dated July 7, 1989, in the Walker River action, wherein that Court states its intent that the California Water Resources Control Board act upon any new applications to appropriate unappropriated water from the Walker River System in California. Under these circumstances, we cannot find that the Walker River System should be declared fully appropriated. Accordingly, the Walker River System should not be included in the Declaration.

Decision 455 (Mill Creek, Lee Vining Creek, and Rush Creek, all tributary to Mono Lake; and Walker Creek and Parker Creek, both tributary to Rush Creek). Staff has pointed out that Decision 455 determined that these sources are fully appropriated year-round.

Accordingly, the Declaration should include these sources.

#### 3.15 Orange County

Oreek, thence Pacific Ocean). The Trabuco Creek Water
Users and the Capistrano Valley Water District made
presentations regarding Trabuco Creek. That source is
not a candidate for inclusion in the Declaration.

However, these presentations raised an important and
relevant issue which relates to more than one stream
system, that is, the means for obtaining revocation or
revision of the Declaration. That issue is addressed
in paragraph 3.25.2, below.

# 3.16 Placer County

3.16.1 <u>Decision 1108</u> (North Fork American River and American River, tributary to the Sacramento River). Staff has pointed out that Decision 1108 determined that the entire flow of the American River and its tributaries

from July 1 through October 31 is required to satisfy prior rights on the American River and in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. Accordingly, the Declaration should show the American River System as fully appropriated during that season.

#### 3.17 <u>San Bernardino County</u>

Decision 628 (Unnamed spring, tributary to Van Dusen 3.17.1 Canyon Creek, thence Baldwin Lake). Big Bear Community Services District contended that the unnamed spring identified in Decision 628 was not therein determined to be fully appropriated year-round. The Board agrees. Review of Decision 628 shows that Van Dusen Canyon Creek should be identified in the Declaration as fully appropriated, but not the tributary unnamed spring. Additionally, Big Bear City Community Services District and Robert Mindte (Thumbum Uranium Mine) have pending applications to appropriate water from this watershed, and both expressed concern that the applications not be cancelled pursuant to Water Code Section 1206(a). Further, James Blake Ramsey filed technical information related to the topography, geology, and hydrology of this watershed. This information does not appear to be relevant to the instant proceeding, although it may be relevant to proceedings on the pending applications. The Board has elsewhere made findings regarding review

and disposition of applications pending on the effective date of the Declaration. The applications of concern to these participants should be reviewed pursuant to this procedure.

Decisions 550 and 1619<sup>2</sup> (Grass Valley Creek, tributary to West Fork Mojave River; and Mojave River). Rancho Las Flores supported the accuracy of these decisions. Rancho Las Flores suggested that additional streams -- all tributary to the Mojave River -- are also fully appropriated. While these additional streams are not specifically addressed by a water right decision, it is found that Decision 1619 determined that the Mojave River system is fully appropriated year-round. The Declaration should evidence this finding.

# 3.18 <u>San Diego County</u>

3.18.1 Decision 646 (Sweetwater River, tributary to San Diego Bay). The Sweetwater Authority and the South Bay Irrigation District, and a representative of AURANN Unlimited, made presentations relating to the Sweetwater River. The former supported a declaration that this source is fully appropriated year-round. The latter, which holds a water right permit to appropriate water from Viejas Creek, tributary to Sweetwater River, requested that any declaration that the Sweetwater

River System is fully appropriated contain a condition regarding a proposed enlargement of permittee's existing diversion. The condition sought is advance Board approval for the permittee to file a future application to appropriate water which would enlarge its existing diversion. Such a project would be undertaken pursuant to an agreement with the Sweetwater Authority and the South Bay Irrigation District. latter entities either hold, or represent the holders of, major water rights within the Sweetwater River Nothing in the presentations of either the permittee or the water right holder entities suggests that permittee's project should not go forward. On the other hand, the presentations do not suggest that a finding that Decision 646 determined that this source is fully appropriated year-round would be erroneous. The Board finds that it would be inappropriate to condition the declaration to provide for advance approval, as requested by permittee. permittee will have the right, as provided elsewhere in this Order, to seek revision of the Declaration to accommodate its project, in connection with submission of an application, if such an application is necessary for the project.<sup>3</sup>

<sup>3</sup> Depending on the specifics of the project and the terms of the agreement with existing right holders, it is possible that permittee's project may involve a transfer of water or water rights, or a change in existing rights, rather than initiation of a new right.

- 3.18.2 Decision: none (Sagamatuma Creek, tributary to Sweetwater River). The Descanso Community Water - District informed the Board that the District's water supply consists of four wells, one of which, constructed in the early 1900s, may be so closely associated with Sagamatuma Creek as to be drawing water which is subject to the law of surface waters. well was originally constructed to serve riparian uses and no evidence of an appropriative right was ever The District asked that the Declaration include a condition allowing the District to file an appropriation permit based on an existing use. Rather than include special case conditions in the Declaration, the Board has made provision elsewhere in this order for a comprehensive procedure to govern the filing of applications which are inconsistent with the Declaration, looking to the possibility of revising the Declaration. This procedure will be available to the District with respect to the well in question.
- Decisions 234, 800, and 801 (unnamed stream, Pilgrim Creek, and unnamed stream, respectively, all within San Luis Rey River System, tributary to Pacific Ocean). A number of presentations were made concerning the question of availability of unappropriated water within the San Luis Rey River System. Participants on this question included Susan Trager, representing San Luis

Rey River Users and others; Robert Pankey, representing San Luis Rey Municipal Water District (and in contact with other water producers); riparian owners; and an interested geologist and geohydrologist. The central themes of these presentations were (1) that the water right decisions involving the San Luis Rey River System relied upon in the Attachment to the Hearing Notice are all early decisions and therefore may not reflect current conditions; and (2) that the System is complex and a generalization about the availability of water cannot be made. The participants uniformly recommended that the Board promulgate specific guidelines so that the door is left open to future applicants to make a showing that there is water available for appropriation in the stream system and so that such applicants know what such a showing must consist of. In paragraph 3.24.5 below we have addressed the system complexity issue, and we have elsewhere in this Order made provision for interested persons -- including potential applicants -- to seek revision or revocation of the Declaration.

### 3.19 San Joaquin County

3.19.1 <u>Decisions 1109 and 1219</u> (Mokelumne River). As noted above in paragraph 3.1.1 (Decision 54, Alpine County),

Amador County and Amador County Water Agency urged that

Decisions 1109 and 1219, rather than Decision 54, be used to determine the season of unavailability of water for appropriation from Mokelumne River. The Board agrees.

#### 3.20 San Luis Obispo County

- 3.20.1 Decision 109 (Arroyo Grande Creek, tributary to Pacific Ocean). Avila Beach County Water District and Steve Sinton urged that the proceeding which resulted in Decision 109 did not include sufficiently reliable flow data upon which to base a determination that water is unavailable for appropriation from this source in July and August. The Board recognizes that Decision 109 is a very early decision and that flow data for subsequent years could conceivably lead to a contrary determination. However, there has been no later water right decision regarding Arroyo Grande Creek. elsewhere in this Order made provision for securing a revision of the Declaration, and it is appropriate that these participants avail themselves of this procedure at the proper time.
- 3.20.2 <u>Decision 963</u> (San Luis Obispo Creek, tributary to
  Pacific Ocean). Avila Beach County Water District and
  Steve Sinton urged that water is in fact available for

appropriation from this source. The Board finds, however, that Decision 963 did determine that San Luis Obispo Creek is fully appropriated. The participants, and any other interested persons, should seek revision of the Declaration pursuant to the procedure provided for elsewhere in this Order.

3.20.3 Decision 739 (Salinas River, tributary to Pacific Ocean). Steve Sinton objected to including the entire Salinas River System above Paso Robles in the Declaration. It is contended that the proceeding upon which Decision 739 was based did not include investigatory data sufficient to determine whether diversions in the upper basin tributaries would impact the underflow of the Salinas River. Decision 739 found that surface flows in the Salinas River were too insubstantial during the summer and fall to warrant a determination that water is available for appropriation from the system during that season. Questions of the adequacy of original data, or offers of additional data to support findings which contravene an earlier determination, should be raised or presented in a proceeding which seeks revision of the Declaration, as provided for elsewhere in this Order.

#### 3.21 San Mateo County

3.21.1 Decision: In the Matter of Determination of the Rights of the Various Claimants to the Waters of San Gregorio Creek Stream System (adopted by SWRCB Resolution No. 89-29, April 20, 1989). William Dunn asked that certain streams in San Mateo County within the San Gregorio Creek System (Woodruff Creek and Mindego Creek), and San Gregorio Creek itself, not be declared to be fully appropriated, on the grounds that an adjudication pursuant to Water Code Section 2500 et seq. ("statutory adjudication") was pending on that stream system. It is true that the statutory adjudication was pending on that date. However, the Board will take official notice of its own subsequent final Order of Determination, In the Matter of Determination of the Rights of the Various Claimants to the Waters of San Gregorio Creek Stream System, adopted April 20, 1989. Elsewhere in this Order the Board has made special provision for stream systems which have been statutorily adjudicated. Although the Superior Court decree remains to be issued in the San Gregorio Creek adjudication (see Water Code Section 2768), and although the final decree may adjust individual water rights following a Superior Court proceeding on exceptions to the Order of Determination (see Water Code Section 2757 et seq. 1, it is highly unlikely that anything in the final decree will controvene the

findings related to adjudicated stream systems made by the Board in Section 6.0 of the instant Order.

Accordingly, the San Gregorio Creek System should be included in the Declaration upon the conditions provided in said Section 6.0.

#### 3.22 <u>Sierra County</u>

3.22.1 Decision 1444 (Balls Creek, tributary to Long Valley Creek). The Green Gulch Ranch pointed out that Decision 1444 found that on rare occasions water surplus to downstream rights might be available during the season sought by applicant's direct diversion application in the proceeding which produced Decision Because this occasional water was found to be insignificant in amount, and for reasons related to the public interest, that decision determined that no water remained available for appropriation, in the context of applicant's direct diversion application, during the season March 1 through September 30. Green Gulch Ranch has pending applications to appropriate from this These applications seek, in part, to store water beyond March 1. The Ranch urges that the considerations which caused the Board to disapprove the direct diversion appropriation in the Decision 1444 proceeding are inapplicable to the pending storage appropriation applications. The Ranch asks, in effect,

appropriation not be made applicable to the Ranch's pending storage applications. There may be merit in the Ranch's position. However, the Board has elsewhere in this Order made provision for disposition of pending applications, pursuant to an initial review by the Chief, Division of Water Rights. The Board finds that the Ranch's pending applications should be subject to this review process, wherein the Ranch will have the opportunity to make a prima facie showing that circumstances are such as to justify continued processing of the applications.

### 3.23 <u>Tulare County</u>

3.23.1 <u>Decision 1290</u> (Kings River). See paragraph 3.5.1, above.

### 3.24 <u>Ventura County</u>

3.24.1 <u>Decision 1129</u> (Sespe Creek, tributary to Santa Clara River). The United Water Conservation District urged that Decision 1129 did not determine that no water remains available for appropriation from Sespe Creek. Review of this decision shows that the participant is correct. Accordingly, the Declaration should not include Sespe Creek.

- 3.25 <u>Issues Raised at Hearing Relating to More Than One Stream System</u>
- 3.25.1 Non-consumptive uses. The Pacific Gas and Electric
  Company urged that the Board's Declaration include a
  condition exempting non-consumptive uses. The point is
  well taken and the Board has made provision for such a
  condition elsewhere in this Order.
- 3.25.2 Revocation or revision of the Declaration. presentations were made concerning the need for rules or quidelines for obtaining a revocation of a declaration that a stream system is fully appropriated or for revising a declaration, for example, by adjusting a season of unavailability of water for appropriation from a particular source. presentations questioned the continued validity of a particular decision's determination that a source is fully appropriated, on the grounds that the decision is obsolete and that changed circumstances indicate that there is unappropriated water available for appropriation. Such presentations were made by representatives of the Trabuco Creek Water Users and of the Capistrano Valley Water District (Trabuco Creek in Orange County); by Messrs. Pankey, Hodge, and Giles (San Luis Rey River System in San Diego County); by Avila Beach County Water District and Steve Sinton (Decision 109, Arroyo Grande Creek System in San Luis

Obispo County; Decision 963, San Luis Obispo Creek
Stream System in San Luis Obispo County.) The points
made by these presentations are well taken. The Board
has elsewhere in this Order made provision for
revocation or revision of the Declaration. The
provision should include means by which a petitioner
may show that a previous decision is no longer valid
because of changed circumstances.

3.25.3 No Presumption of Availability of Water for Appropriation from Non-Listed Stream Systems. Hildebrand for the South Delta Water Agency suggested that the Board make it clear that the absence of a fully appropriated declaration as to a particular stream system does not raise a presumption that water is available for appropriation from that source. point is valid. No such presumption arises, nor does a presumption arise that water is available for appropriation from a listed source, pursuant to any application accepted for filing because it meets the conditions contained in the Declaration for that In either case, as a prerequisite to obtaining source. a permit, the applicant will continue to be responsible for showing that unappropriated water is available to

supply the applicant. (Water Code Section 1375(d).)

State Filings and Area-of-Origin Protection. participants addressed issues related to applications filed by the Department of Water Resources and its predecessors pursuant to Water Code Section 10500 et seq. ("state filings"), to county-of-origin protections which exist in connection with the state filing system, and to other provisions of California law which protect the availability of water for use in areas of origin. Such presentations were made by representatives of Calaveras County Water District and Bella Vista Water District, and by William Dunn and William DuBois. Elsewhere in this Order the Board has recognized these concerns and made findings with respect to most of them. One concern not previously addressed in this Order, raised by Calaveras County Water District and the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation, is the impact of this proceeding on existing area-of-origin protection terms and conditions imposed by the Board and its predecessors in past proceedings which resulted in assignment or release of priority of state filings. The Declaration is not intended, and should not be construed, to affect such terms and conditions in any manner nor to affect in any manner existing area-of-origin protection terms and conditions which have as their legal source provisions

3.25.4

of law other than the state filing system. (See Paragraph 7.0.5, below, for identification of the various area-of-origin protection provisions.)

3.25.5 Inter-relationship Between Tributary Stream Systems and the Larger Stream System. The presentation of the Bureau of Reclamation, United States Department of Interior ("the Bureau"), pointed out that many of the stream systems under consideration are tributary to larger stream systems. The latter may or may not also be under consideration for declaration that they are fully appropriated and, if so, the conditions of unavailability of water for appropriation may or may not be consistent with the conditions for the tributaries. The South Delta Water Agency voiced similar concerns. The primary concern here is that future Board actions to revoke or revise a Declaration addressing a tributary system not overlook policies and administrative practices promulgated in water right decisions addressing the larger system. (Examples of such decisions include Decision 1594, which encompasses the Sacramento-San Joaquin watershed; and decisions addressing the Sacramento River, the Feather River, and the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.) The Bureau also noted the existence of the Board's "Policy for Administration of Water Rights in the Lake Tahoe Basin"

and the proposed California-Nevada Interstate Water

Compact and suggested that the Declaration or a related

document should explain the relationship between that

Policy and the Declaration.

3.25.5.1 The Board first notes that inconsistency of determinations regarding availability of water for appropriation as between a tributary system and the larger system may be justified. For example, water may be unavailable for appropriation year-round from a tributary system while at the same time water remains available for appropriation from the larger system. This situation may occur because of the contribution to the larger system made by undeveloped tributaries isolated from the fully appropriated tributary. Conversely, water may be unavailable for appropriation from a larger system at the same time water is available for appropriation from a tributary system. This situation may occur where there is no hydraulic continuity, at least during part of the year, between the tributary and the larger system. Accordingly, the Board finds that perfect consistency regarding determinations of unavailability of water for appropriation among sources with the larger stream systems is in general neither desirable nor attainable.

- 3.25.5.2 Nevertheless, the Board finds valid the participants' concern that future Board actions to revoke or revise fully appropriated declarations (including the addition of stream systems) should take into account the policies and administrative practices, as well as the findings, of existing and future water right decisions Important which address the larger stream systems. issues, including priority of right and protection of areas of origin, are involved. The Board has elsewhere in this Order made provision for revocation or revision The provision should include means of the Declaration. by which policies, administrative practices, and findings promulgated by broader, system-wide decisions are identified and taken into account in such proceedings.
- 3.25.5.3 Further, the presentations of the Bureau and the South Delta Water Agency prompt us to make two findings to clarify the scope and application of the instant Order. These findings are intended to accommodate both local and more general hydrologic conditions. First, a declaration herein that a specifically identified stream system is fully appropriated should encompass all upstream sources which contribute to the identified stream system if, and to the extent that, such sources are hydraulically continuous to the identified stream

system. Second, whenever a tributary stream system and a downstream system to which the tributary contributes are both specifically declared to be fully appropriated, the declaration containing the more restrictive conditions should govern the tributary stream system if, and to the extent that, such tributary is hydraulically continuous to the downstream system.

3.25.5.4 With respect to the Lake Tahoe Basin, we note that the proposed California-Nevada Interstate Water Compact, although adopted by the Legislatures of both California and Nevada, has never been given Congressional consent as required by the Constitution of the United States. Neither the Lake Tahoe Basin nor any of the streams tributary to Lake Tahoe are under consideration in this proceeding because no water right decision has determined any such source to be fully appropriated. Elsewhere in this Order the Board officially noticed the introduction of S. 1554 by Senator Harry Reid of Nevada; this measure contemplates a Congressional apportionment of several interstate stream systems, including the Lake Tahoe Basin. As the Board found above with respect to the Carson River (Paragraph 3.1.2), enactment of S. 1554, or an interstate apportionment effected through some other means, could

be a basis for revising the Declaration to include the Lake Tahoe Basin.

### 4.0 CONDITION PROVIDING FOR ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS FOR NON-CONSUMPTIVE USE

Under certain circumstances water may be appropriated for non-consumptive use without substantially affecting the supply available to satisfy existing uses. Accordingly, applications which propose only nonconsumptive use of water from the sources identified in the Declaration should be accepted, even where such applications propose diversion during a season of unavailability of water for consumptive use. Acceptance of such applications will allow the Board to carry out the Constitutional mandate that the water resources of the State be put to the fullest possible beneficial use. (California Constitution, Art. 10, Sec. 2.) For the purpose of this condition, nonconsumptive use means a use of water which does not substantially diminish the quantity or quality of water in the source and does not regulate the flow in the source in such manner as to impair any other existing reasonable and beneficial use, including instream use. Non-consumptive use includes, but is not limited to, power use. (See 23 CCR 662.)

domestic use pursuant to the Permitting Reform Act are limited to domestic use as that use is defined by Board rule, plus <u>incidental</u> aesthetic, recreation, or fish and wildlife purposes. (Water Code Section 1228.1(b).)

Domestic use as defined by Board rule is consumptive use. (23 CCR 660.) Thus, registration of small projects cannot propose solely non-consumptive uses.

Accordingly, no exception for non-consumptive use should be made for Permitting Reform Act registrations.

### 5.0 CONDITION PROVIDING FOR ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS PROPOSING TO DEVELOP OR SALVAGE WATER

The principle is well-established that the water supply in a source may be augmented by artificial means, thereby making such water available for beneficial use by the developer. (See Pomona Land & Water Co. v. San Antonio Water Co., 152 Cal. 618, 93 Pac. 881 (1908).) So long as environmental impacts of the means proposed to augment a water supply are addressed, the developed or salvaged water principle should be preserved. Since the Board's action on applications to appropriate unappropriated water is subject to the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.), environmental concerns will be addressed in proceedings on applications proposing to develop or salvage water.

Accordingly, applications which propose to augment the water supply in an otherwise fully appropriated source should be accepted and considered and not be barred pursuant to Water Code Section 1206(a). Again, this provision will serve the Constitutional mandate to maximize beneficial use of the water resources of the State.

5.1 However, since the Board's function in the procedure authorizing registration of small use domestic appropriations pursuant to the Permitting Reform Act is ministerial, the Board has no opportunity to consider the environmental consequences of a registration of a small use domestic appropriation which proposes to augment the water supply in a fully appropriated source by developing or salvaging water. Accordingly, any such registration should not be exempted from the filing prohibition contained in Water Code Section 1206(a). Pursuant to Water Code Section 1228.2(b), the Board should not accept such registrations. registration procedure being thus unavailable to such a project, the proponent should be authorized to file an application to appropriate unappropriated water, pursuant to the exception contained in paragraph 5.0 above.

### 6.0 CONDITIONS GOVERNING APPLICATIONS AND REGISTRATIONS FOR APPROPRIATION OF WATER IN ADJUDICATED AREAS

Special analysis is required to determine the status of availability of water for appropriation in stream systems upon which a proceeding pursuant to Water Code Section 2500 et seq. (hereinafter, "statutory adjudication") had been conducted. These proceedings do not involve a determination whether unappropriated water is available to supply an applicant for an appropriation permit. (See Water Code Section 1375(d).) Instead, the proceeding results in a Board Order of Determination, and ultimately a Superior Court decree, determining the rights of all water users in the stream system, in terms of amount, priority, season of use, purpose of use, point of diversion, and place of use of water. (Water Code Section 2769.) examination of the records of these proceedings, including especially the reports of investigation conducted pursuant to Water Code Section 2525, shows that there is insufficient water available during the dry seasons of most years to satisfy all direct diversion rights of existing water right holders. These reports of investigation form the basis for the Board's findings and orders, pursuant to Water Code Section 2525, that the public interest and necessity will be served by conducting the adjudication. fact, inadequacy of water to serve all direct diversion

rights appears to be the circumstance that typically triggers the filing of a petition for a statutory adjudication. Further, in every case the Board's Order of Determination (and the resulting Superior Court decree) creates priority classes in which the various water rights are classified, with existing domestic use rights generally enjoying senior priority and other uses -- chiefly irrigation -- assigned more junior priority. Any subsequent right, whether initiated by conventional application or by small domestic use registration, would necessarily be relegated to a priority inferior to all classes of existing rights. It is inappropriate, and inimical to the public interest, that satisfaction of a need for domestic use of water be attempted through acquisition of an appropriative direct diversion right which would necessarily be of inferior priority and uncertain reliability. Avoidance of water rights conflict is one of the major objectives of the statutory adjudication procedure; yet acquisition of paper domestic rights of this type would inevitably promote conflict among the holders thereof and the holders of senior rights under the decree. Accordingly, the Board finds that all stream systems wherein rights have been determined pursuant to a statutory adjudication are fully appropriated as to direct diversion for domestic use.

The Board further finds that the Declaration should contain conditions in accordance with the following finding.

- Registrations of small use domestic appropriations, made pursuant to the Permitting Reform Act, which propose in whole or in part appropriation other than by collection to storage during the wet season<sup>4</sup> from sources within statutorily adjudicated stream systems should not be accepted. Since the registration procedure is thus unavailable to the proponent of such a project, the proponent should be authorized to file a conventional application to appropriate unappropriated water, pursuant to the condition contained in paragraph 6.2 next below.
- Applications to appropriate unappropriated water for any beneficial use which propose in whole or in part appropriation by direct diversion, or appropriation by storage outside the wet season, from sources within statutorily adjudicated stream systems should be accepted for filing only if accompanied by a written statement containing information which shows that, in the case of domestic use, a reliable alternative source of water is available, or that, in the case of a use

<sup>4</sup> For the purpose of this condition, the wet season should mean that period from December 1 of each year through March 31 of each succeeding year.

other than domestic, a reliable alternative source is either available or unnecessary. The statement should comply with the formal requirements for information presented in an application to appropriate unappropriated water.

## 7.0 FINDINGS REGARDING DISPOSITION OF APPLICATIONS PENDING ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE DECLARATION

Pursuant to Water Code Section 1206(a), the Board is authorized, but not required, to cancel any application to appropriate water from a stream system declared to be fully appropriated, which application is pending on the date of adoption of this Declaration. The Board finds that it is inappropriate to make disposition of such pending applications in gross. Instead, the Chief, Division of Water Rights, should review all such applications. 5 Applications determined by the Chief to be consistent with the conditions of this Declaration should be processed normally. In the case of all applications determined to be inconsistent in any material respect with the conditions of the Declaration, the Chief should provide the applicant notice, in accordance with the following:

7.0.1 The respects in which the application is inconsistent with the conditions of the Declaration should be specified;

<sup>5</sup> For the reasons given in paragraph 7.4 <u>infra</u>, this review should not include "state filings".

- 7.0.2 A reasonable time should be specified within which the applicant may withdraw the application;
- 7.0.3 A reasonable time should be specified within which the applicant may amend the application to make it consistent with the conditions of the Declaration;
- A reasonable time should be specified within which the applicant may provide a statement, in the nature of an offer of proof, to show that hydrologic circumstances have changed within the stream system declared to be fully appropriated, or that other circumstances exist which justify the continued processing of the application. The statement should be in sufficient detail to support a prima facie finding that unappropriated water is available to supply the applicant. The statement should comply with the formal requirements for information presented in an application to appropriate unappropriated water.
- 7.0.5 A reasonable time should be specified within which the applicant may provide a statement to show that the appropriation proposed by the application is entitled to the benefit of area-of-origin principles. These include the provisions of Water Code Section 10500 et seq., which protect the availability of water for

use within counties of origin; of Water Code Section 11460 et seg., and of Water Code Section 11128, which protect the availability of water for use within watersheds of origin and watersheds immediately adjacent thereto which can be conveniently served therefrom; of Water Code Section 1215 et seq., which protect the availability of water for use within specified "protected areas"; and of any specific water right decisions or orders which implement the foregoing statutes or which implement the Board's public interest authority, pursuant to Water Code Section 1253, to protect the availability of water for use within areas The statement should comply with the formal of origin. requirements for information presented in an application to appropriate unappropriated water.

- 7.1 In any case in which an applicant fails to respond to the notice provided for in paragraph 7.0, within the time specified in the notice, the Chief should order cancellation of the application.
- 7.2 In any case in which an applicant responds to the notice provided for in paragraph 7.0, within the time specified in the notice, by amending the application in such manner as to make it consistent with the conditions of this Declaration, as determined by the Chief, the application should be processed normally.

- 7.3 In any case in which an applicant responds to the notice provided for in paragraph 7.0, within the time specified in the notice, and whether or not such response also includes proposed amendment of the application, by providing a statement pursuant either to paragraph 7.0.4. or paragraph 7.0.5, the Chief should provide the Board with recommendations concerning disposition of the application. Such recommendations should be in the form of a proposed order, which may concern one or more applications. The Chief may notice the proposed order for hearing, in which event the order, in addition to making disposition of the application or applications concerned, may operate to revoke or revise the Declaration pursuant to Water Code Section 1205(c).
- Pursuant to Water Code Section 10500 et seq., the

  Department of Water Resources and its predecessors have

  filed numerous applications to secure and maintain an

  inchoate right to priority, in order to provide for the

  development and completion of a general or coordinated

  plan of development, utilization, or conservation of

  the State's water resources. These applications, which

  are held by the Board, are commonly referred to as

"state filings". They are, by express provision of Water Code Section 10500, relieved from the due diligence requirements applicable to conventional The Legislature retains the prerogative applications. of revoking the special statutory exemption of state filings from the conventional due diligence The evident legislative objective requirements. underlying the state filing provisions is to guide water resources development in accordance with a statewide plan. Cancellation of state filings would defeat the legislative objective. Accordingly, pending applications filed by the Department of Water Resources or its predecessors pursuant to Water Code Section 10500 et seq. which propose as sources for appropriation of water stream systems identified in the Declaration as fully appropriated should not be cancelled.

8.0 CONDITION PROVIDING FOR ACCEPTANCE OF PETITIONS FOR ASSIGNMENT OF STATE FILINGS AND FILING OF PROPOSED COMPLETED APPLICATIONS, AND OF PETITIONS FOR RELEASE OF PRIORITY OF STATE FILINGS IN FAVOR OF CONVENTIONAL APPLICATIONS

In paragraph 7.4 next above, the Board made findings with respect to pending applications filed by the Department of Water Resources and its predecessors pursuant to Water Code Section 10500 et seq. The state filing process is implemented in one of two ways. A

person may petition the Board for assignment of the state filing, accompanying the petition with a proposed completed application. (Water Code Section 10504.01.) Alternatively, a person may petition the Board for release of the priority of a state filing in favor of an accompanying conventional application. (Water Code Section 10504.) Both means of implementation continue the evident legislative objective of guiding water resources development in accordance with a statewide In paragraph 7.4 the Board found that this legislative objective would be defeated were the Board to cancel certain state filings. Similarly, the legislative objective would be defeated were the Board not to provide for a condition in the Declaration, pursuant to Water Code Section 1206(b), for acceptance for filing of such petitions and applications, notwithstanding that the applicable state filing proposes a source for appropriation that is identified in the Declaration as fully appropriated. Accordingly, petitions for assignment and release of priority, together with accompanying applications, which implement Water Code Section 10500 et seq., and which propose as sources for appropriation of water stream systems identified in the Declaration as fully appropriated, should be accepted for filing. Such filings should be processed in the manner provided by law.

# 9.0 CONDITION PROVIDING FOR ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS SEEKING THE BENEFIT OF AREA-OF-ORIGIN PROTECTION PRINCIPLES

In paragraphs 7.0.5 and 7.3 above the Board made provision for pending applications which propose appropriations from stream systems declared to be fully appropriated but which are entitled to the benefit of area-of-origin principles. This provision was found necessary to carry out legislative intent to assure availability of water for the development of the areas The same consideration requires a condition of origin. in the Declaration providing for acceptance of new applications which propose appropriations entitled to the benefit of area-of-origin principles. b Accordingly, such applications should be accepted but should be required to be accompanied by a statement showing that the appropriation proposed by the application is entitled to the benefit of area-oforigin principles. The statement should comply with the formal requirements for information presented in an application to appropriate unappropriated water.

<sup>6</sup> The general objective common to all of California's area-of-origin principles is to secure a water supply for development of the area in which water originates, as against users of such water outside the originating area, that is, "exporters". Obviously, these principles cannot guarantee that sufficient water will originate in the proteced areas to meet the needs of all levels of development.

10.0 CONDITION PROVIDING FOR ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS FOR TEMPORARY PERMITS AND PETITIONS FOR CHANGE OF POINT OF DIVERSION, PLACE OF USE, OR PURPOSE OF USE

Water Code Section 1206(c) provides that the prohibition against accepting applications, and the Board's authority to cancel pending applications, to appropriate water from sources within stream systems declared to be fully appropriated shall not apply to applications for temporary permits to meet an urgent need to divert and use water filed pursuant to Water Code Section 1425 et seq., or to petitions to change point of diversion, place of use, or purpose of use filed pursuant to any provision of the Water Code. Accordingly, the Declaration should contain a condition providing for acceptance of such applications and petitions.

## 11.0 FINDING DISCLAIMING ANY IMPACT OF DECLARATION ON EXISTING RIGHTS

The legal effect of this Declaration is limited to that set forth in Water Code Section 1206. The Board may not accept new applications to appropriate unappropriated water where the source is declared to be fully appropriated, except where the application is consistent with conditions specified in the Declaration. Further, the Board may — but is not required to — cancel applications pending on the effective date of its Declaration; provision is made

for such pending applications in Paragraph 7.0 above.

No provision of law provides that the Declaration is to affect existing water rights, regardless of their basis in legal doctrine. This would include rights in the process of being perfected, i.e., rights initiated under permits to appropriate unappropriated water.

Accordingly, nothing in the Declaration should be interpreted as affecting, or intending to affect, such existing rights.

# 12.0 FINDINGS PROVIDING FOR REVOCATION OR REVISION OF THE DECLARATION AND FOR FUTURE DECLARATIONS THAT OTHER STREAM SYSTEMS ARE FULLY APPROPRIATED

Water Code Section 1205(c) provides that a declaration that a stream system is fully appropriated may be revoked or revised upon the Board's own motion or upon petition of any interested party. Additionally, provisions of the Permitting Reform Act require that the Division of Water Rights report annually to the Board on the availability of unappropriated water in stream systems which may become fully appropriated within the next reporting period. (Water Code Section 1228.2(c).) If it can be reasonably anticipated that a stream system will become fully appropriated during the next reporting period, the Board -- following notice and hearing -- is required to determine whether that stream system should be declared to be fully

appropriated pursuant to Water Code Section 1205 et seq. (Water Code Section 1228.2(d).) Taken together, these statutes comprise a system whereby the initial Declaration adopted herein may be maintained in a current status.

- The Chief, Division of Water Rights, should be responsible for reporting to the Board pursuant to Water Code Section 1228.2(c). The report should include a description of the availability of unappropriated water in stream systems which may become fully appropriated within the next reporting period. The report should include stream systems recommended by the Chief to be declared fully appropriated so that the Board may determine whether Water Code Section 1228.2(d) should be implemented.
- To assure public participation in the process of revoking and revising the Declaration pursuant to Water Code Section 1205(c), and of adding stream systems to the Declaration as provided in Water Code Section 1228.2(d), the Chief should propose administrative rules for adoption by the Board. These rules should prescribe procedures whereby interested persons may (a) petition the Board for revocation or revision of the Declaration, and (b) participate in the hearing

required by Water Code Section 1228.2(d) to determine whether a stream system should be added to the Declaration.

#### 13.0 RECONSIDERATION OF THIS ORDER

Provision should be made for reconsideration of this Order, either upon petition of an interested party or upon the Board's own motion.


#### ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings, it is hereby ORDERED that:

- Exhibit A is hereby adopted as the Board's Declaration of Fully Appropriated Stream Systems.
- 2. The Chief, Division of Water Rights, shall compile and maintain the Board's Declaration of Fully Appropriated Stream Systems, together with Conditions for Acceptance of Water Right Applications and Small Domestic Use Registrations, in accordance with the findings in this Order.
- 3. The Chief, Division of Water Rights, shall review all applications, except "state filings", to appropriate unappropriated water pending before the Board. Applications determined by the Chief to be consistent with the conditions

of the Declaration shall be processed normally. In the case of all applications determined by the Chief to be inconsistent in any material respect with the conditions of the Declaration, the Chief shall provide notice and take the actions set forth in Section 7.0 of this Order.

- 4. The Chief, Division of Water Rights, shall report to the Board pursuant to Water Code Section 1128.2(c). The report shall include a description of the availability of unappropriated water in stream systems which may become fully appropriated within the next reporting period. The report shall include stream systems recommended by the Chief to be declared fully appropriated so that the Board may determine whether Water Code Section 1128.2(d) should be implemented.
- 5. The Chief shall propose administrative rules for adoption by the Board. The proposed rules shall prescribe procedures whereby interested persons may (a) petition the Board for revocation or revision of the Declaration, and (b) participate in the hearing required by Water Code Section 1228.2(d) to determine whether a stream system should be added to the Declaration.



6. Water Code Sections 1357, 1358, and 1359, relating to reconsideration and amendment of decisions and orders, shall apply to the instant Order.
