- GIVE REASON FOR PROPOSED CHANGE: The purpose for the change is to realign the water right to benefit the mission of the Park, including enhancing fish and wildlife habitat, and recreation. The National Park Service acquired the water right with the lands associated with the Giacomini Wetland Restoration Project. The dedication of this water right supports the Giacomini Wetlands Restoration Project objectives and will support native fish and aquatic species including steelhead trout, tidewater goby, and potentially coho salmon.
- WILL THE OLD POINT OF DIVERSION OR PLACE OF USE BE ABANDONED? Yes. The original Point of Diversion with this license involved the Giacomini's excavating a diversion channel from Fish Hatchery Creek to the Place of Use. This practice has been discontinued since the restoration was completed.
- WATER WILL BE USED FOR Enhancement of fish and wildlife habitat pursuant to Section 1707. We are seeking to change the entire licensed amount of 0.50 cfs.

This License 9730 was not specifically mentioned in the EIS/EIR, but the lands authorized for irrigation pursuant to License 9730 were restored as part of the Wetlands Project.

Attachment No. 1

National Park Service (NPS) acquired this water right—License 9730—from Waldo Giacomini. Mr. Giacomini used this right to irrigate meadow and for stock watering in support of his dairy operation. The right continued to be used pursuant to its licensed terms until August 2007, at which time the dairy operation was discontinued. Since that time, the water has not been diverted but rather has been allowed to remain in the stream.

Subsequent to the ceasing of dairy operations, the NPS restored the dairy lands, including the lands identified for irrigation pursuant to this license, as part of the Giacomini Wetlands Restoration Project (Wetlands Project). The impacts of the Wetlands Project are addressed in the Final Giacomini Wetland Restoration Project Environmental Impact Statement/Environmental Impact Report (2007). Though dedication of License 9730 was not specifically identified as part of the Wetlands Project in the EIS/EIR, the lands authorized for irrigation pursuant to this license were included and restored as part of the Wetlands Project. License 4324A, used by Mr. Giacomini in support of the dairy operation and acquired by the Park, was specifically identified in the EIS/EIR for dedication; a petition for change of License 4324A is also being submitted with this petition.

In support of the Wetlands Project and the mission of the Park in general, NPS desires to change the use of License 9730 pursuant to Water Code Section 1707. The proposed place of use is the stream segment from the headwater to the mouth of the creek, as shown on the attached map.


