Attachment to Petition for Temporary Transfer License 2685 (Application 1224) held by Merced Irrigation District

GENERAL

The Merced Irrigation District (Merced) is filing this petition in order to supply previously stored surface water to agricultural lands located near the boundaries of Merced's authorized places of use covered by its Post-1914 appropriative water rights. These lands are known as Merced's Sphere of Influence Lands (SOI Lands), which are all located within Merced County as shown on the map accompanying this petition. The majority of the SOI Lands currently, and have historically received surface water from Merced during years that Merced's Board of Directors determines water is available under its Pre-1914 claims, provided that adequate natural flow is available from the Merced River. During months when surface water is not available under Merced's Pre-1914 claims for delivery to SOI Lands, the individual landowners meet their demands through alternate supplies, such as groundwater. Within the past five years, the surface water deliveries to the SOI Lands were curtailed as early as July 1. Approval of this petition would provide continued surface water supplies for SOI Lands, up to the proposed temporary transfer quantity of 5,000 AF.

The surface water supply available to the SOI Lands is diverted, stored, rediverted, and conveyed through Merced's existing facilities. As shown on the map accompanying this petition, the proposed gross place of use includes lands identified by SOI landowners, which encompasses individual parcels, the boundaries of Le Grand-Athlone Water District, and the portion of Chowchilla Water District located within Merced County. Merced proposes to deliver the previously stored surface water to these districts for distribution to participating SOI landowners. The proposed net place of use for the temporary transfer, identified further in this petition, includes lands within the Merced County SOI Water Users Association.

Prior to the date at which the Merced Board of Directors determines that surface water is not available under its Pre-1914 claims for delivery to SOI Lands, Merced will evaluate the hydrologic conditions to assess whether the previously stored water will be made available to the SOI Lands by releases from storage or by groundwater exchange pumping. Releases from storage involve the delivery of water to SOI Lands and refill of the reservoir, which normally occurs during periods of high runoff. The release of stored water would be increased as compared with the condition absent the proposed temporary transfer. Merced is willing to accept refill criteria to assure no impact occurs to downstream water right holders.

Groundwater exchange pumping is the delivery of water pumped using Merced's groundwater wells into Merced's adjacent conveyance facilities and exchanging a like amount of surface water for delivery to SOI Lands, up to 5,000 AF. The release of stored water from the reservoir would be the same as compared with the condition absent the proposed temporary transfer. Merced's groundwater wells proposed for use in this temporary transfer are located throughout its service area and have been previously approved during other water transfers completed by Merced to ensure that the pumping does not affect the surface water system. This

conjunctive use operation would allow Merced to pump groundwater at a lower pumping head as compared with the groundwater wells utilized by the majority of the SOI landowners.

POINT OF DIVERSION OR REDIVERSION

No change in Merced's points of diversion or points of rediversion are proposed. Merced's authorized points of diversion and rediversion under License 2685 are listed below:

Present Point of Diversion:

New Exchequer Dam (Lake McClure)

The point of diversion to storage of such water is located South thirty-eight degrees, no minutes West (S 38° 00' W), thirty eight hundred (3800) feet from the NE corner of Section 13, T4S, R15E, MBD&M, being within the NW ¼ of SE ¼ of said Section 13 in Mariposa County.

Present Points of Rediversion:

Merced Falls Diversion Dam for Northside Canal

Point of direct diversion and rediversion of stored water from Merced River for Northside Canal is located North sixty eight degrees, no minutes West (N 68° 0' W) twenty seven hundred fifty (2750) feet from the SE corner of Section 4, T5S, R15E, MDB&M., being within the SW ¼ of SE ¼ of Section 7 in Merced County.

Crocker-Huffman Diversion Dam for Main Canal

Point of direct diversion and rediversion of stored water from Merced River for Main Canal is located North forty seven degrees, thirty minutes East (N 47° 30'E) twenty eight hundred thirty (2830) feet from the SW corner of Section 7, T5S, R15E, MDB&M, being within the NE ¼ of SW ¼ of said Section 7 in Merced County.

Mariposa Town Planning Area

Point of direct diversion from Merced River for Mariposa Town Planning Area Main is located at a point North 48°34'35" West 1,113 feet from SE corner of Section 9, within the SE ¼ of the SE ¼ of Section 9, T4S, R18E, MDB&M in Merced County.

Duck Slough (formerly El Nido Irrigation District)

Point of rediversion located on Duck Slough at a point 100 feet North and 50 feet East of ¼ Cor. Sections 10 and 11, T8S, R14E, within the SW ¼ of the NW ¼ Section 11, T8S, R14E, MDB&M in Merced County. This point of rediversion is associated with the former place of use for El Nido Irrigation District described below and in Licenses 6032 and 9429 (Applications 8238 and 18774), formerly held by El Nido Irrigation District and hereby transferred to Merced Irrigation District.

PLACE OF USE

Present Places of Use:

Domestic and irrigation purposes on 164,395 gross acreage within the boundaries of Merced Irrigation District as shown on map of District filed with the Division of Water Rights December 11, 1942.

Municipal use to 1,900 acres known as the Mariposa Town Planning Area, located within portions of projected Sections 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, and 36, T5S, R18E, MDB&M, as shown on a map on file with the State Water Resources Control Board dated May 1, 1995.

Irrigation purposes on 9,418.6 acres within the boundaries of El Nido Irrigation District as shown on map of El Nido Irrigation District filed with the Division of Water Rights for Application 8238. El Nido Irrigation District has been consolidated with Merced.

Proposed Place of Use:

No change to the present place of use is proposed. The following lands are proposed to be added to the place of use:

Irrigation of up to 39,066 acres within a gross area of 71,130 acres as shown on the attached map titled "Merced Irrigation District Map to Accompany Petition for Temporary Transfer under License 2685 (Application 1224) Proposed Addition to Place of Use". The purpose of this temporary transfer is to provide surface water to SOI Lands in lieu of the SOI water demands being met from individual groundwater supplies. Merced will provide, through its North and Main Canals, up to 5,000 AF of stored water for use by SOI landowners. The water delivered to the SOI Lands will be made available from Merced by either releases of stored water or by groundwater exchange pumping from Merced's groundwater wells.

Releases of water from storage will increase the streamflow between Lake McClure and Merced's Main Canal by the 5,000 AF during the period of releases in order to convey stored surface water for rediversion to SOI Lands. Providing surface water to SOI Lands through groundwater exchange pumping would result in no effect to streamflow and no effect to the underlying groundwater aquifer as this quantity would be pumped by individual landowners absent the proposed temporary transfer. The proposed temporary transfer involves the release of stored water for diversion at Merced's North and Main Canals for delivery to lands that would be in production without the proposed temporary transfer. Merced is required to release water to meet other downstream commitments and requirements below the inlet to its Main Canal. Therefore, there will be no downstream change of the streamflow, water quality, timing of diversion or use, return flows, or effects on legal users of water during the period of the proposed temporary transfer.

A potential effect to the downstream flow from the release of stored water arises during the subsequent refill of the 5,000 AF of vacated stored water. This refill normally occurs during periods of high runoff and periods of low water demand by downstream water right holders. Based on Merced's past experiences, which has included larger quantities of water, no adverse effect has resulted from the refilling of this previously stored water. Merced is willing to accept refill criteria to assure no impact occurs.

Based on the Department of Water Resources (DWR) Bulletin 120 publication for March 1, 2007, *Water Supply Conditions in California*, the unimpaired runoff forecast for the Merced River below Merced Falls during the 2007 Water Year is 54% of average. Assuming that the hydrology does not improve during the next few months and the 2007 Water Year will be classified as a dry year type, according to a 90% inflow exceedance forecast, Merced is prepared to make water available for this proposed temporary transfer by groundwater exchange pumping.

In this way, Merced would be exercising its conjunctive use operations by preserving surface water in the reservoir for the 2008 Water Year. Should the hydrology improve to an "average" runoff scenario, according to a 50% inflow exceedance forecast, Merced may elect to release surface water from storage for delivery to SOI Lands and refill the vacated storage.

4 – Regional Water Quality Control Board

We have contacted Anthony Toto ((559) 445-6278) of the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board. Mr. Toto did not believe that any action is required by Merced or the SOI landowners as a result of this proposed temporary transfer. We are sending Mr. Toto a copy of this petition for review.

<u>5a – CA Department of Fish and Game</u>

We have contacted Tim Heyne ((209) 853-2533) of the Department of Fish and Game. Mr. Heyne did not identify any concerns relative to the proposed temporary transfer and did not identify any mitigation measures that would be required. We are sending Mr. Heyne a copy of this petition for review.

5c & 5d

There will be an insignificant effect on fish, wildlife, or other instream beneficial uses as a result of this petition because the temporary transfer involves Merced's existing facilities and no new lands will be placed into production. Merced is required to release water from storage pursuant to its other existing downstream commitments; and thus, there will be no downstream effects from the proposed temporary transfer, as identified in responses to questions 1b, 3a, and 3b of this petition.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

The Merced Irrigation District (Merced) is petitioning to add places of use in order to supply previously stored surface water to agricultural lands located near the boundaries of Merced's authorized places of use covered by its Post-1914 appropriative water rights. These lands are known as Merced's Sphere of Influence Lands (SOI Lands), which are all located within Merced County. The majority of the SOI Lands currently, and have historically received surface water from Merced during years that Merced's Board of Directors determines water is available under its Pre-1914 claims, provided that adequate natural flow is available from the Merced River. During months when surface water is not available under Merced's Pre-1914 claims for delivery to SOI Lands, the individual landowners meet their demands through alternate supplies, such as groundwater.


Approval of this petition would provide continued surface water supplies for SOI Lands, up to the proposed temporary transfer quantity of 5,000 AF. Prior to the date at which the Merced Board of Directors determines that surface water is not available under its Pre-1914 claims for delivery to SOI Lands, Merced will evaluate the hydrologic conditions to assess whether the previously stored water will be made available to the SOI Lands by releases from storage or by groundwater exchange pumping. Releases from storage involve the delivery of water to SOI Lands and refill of the reservoir, which normally occurs during periods of high runoff. The release of stored water would be increased as compared with the condition absent the proposed temporary transfer. Merced is willing to accept refill criteria to assure no impact occurs to downstream water right holders.


Groundwater pumping exchange is the delivery of water pumped using Merced's groundwater wells into Merced's adjacent conveyance facilities and exchanging a like amount of surface water for delivery to SOI Lands, up to 5,000 AF. The release of stored water from the reservoir would be the same as compared with the condition absent the proposed temporary transfer. Merced's groundwater wells proposed for use in this temporary transfer are located throughout its service area and have been previously approved during other water transfers completed by Merced to ensure that the pumping does not affect the surface water system. This conjunctive use operation would allow Merced to pump groundwater at a lower pumping head as compared with the groundwater wells utilized by the majority of the SOI landowners.

There will be minor changes to Merced's current operations as a result of this petition; and these changes will be limited to continuing deliveries to SOI Lands after the date at which there is inadequate natural flow in the Merced River to deliver surface water to SOI Lands pursuant to Merced's Pre-1914 claims. Depending upon hydrologic conditions, Merced may pump additional groundwater, up to 5,000 AF, in exchange for delivery of surface water to SOI Lands. This quantity would be pumped by individual groundwater wells for use upon the SOI Lands absent the proposed temporary transfer.

RESOLUTION NO. 2007-11

RESOLUTION OF EXEMPTION REGARDING SPHERE OF INFLUENCE LANDS TRANSFERS

WHEREAS, the Sphere of Influence Lands (SOI Lands) currently, and historically, receive surface water from MID during years the Board of Directors of the Merced Irrigation District (MID) determine water is available under its Pre-1914 claims, provided adequate natural flow is available from the Merced River;

WHEREAS, MID is petitioning the State Water Resources Control Board to temporarily add the SOI lands to MID's Place of Use (the Project);

WHEREAS, approval of the petition would provide a combination of groundwater and continued surface water supplies to be released from storage at Lake McClure for SOI Lands, up to the proposed temporary transfer quantity of 5,000 acre feet;

WHEREAS, there will be insignificant changes to MID's current operations as a result of this petition, and these changes will be limited to continuing deliveries to SOI Lands after the date at which there is inadequate natural flow in the Merced River to deliver surface water to SOI Lands pursuant to MID's Pre-1914 claims;

WHEREAS, the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") became effective November 23, 1970;

WHEREAS, CEQA does not apply to public projects approved prior to the effective date that have not changed;

WHEREAS, the Project has not changed since prior to the enactment of CEQA.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: the Board finds and determines that the Project is exempt from CEQA, as the Project was approved prior to the effective date of CEQA and the Project has not changed since the effective date of CEQA. Exemption to 14 Cal. Code Regs. § 15261(a)(2) and *Nacimiento Regional Water Mgmt.* Advisory Comm. v. Monterey County Water Resources Agency (1993) 15 CA4th 200, 19 CR2d 1;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT: the Board finds and determines that the Project is categorically exempt pursuant to 14 Cal. Code Regs. § 15301, Class 1, since approval of the Project occurred prior to the enactment of CEQA, and since then there has been, if any, only a "negligible" or "no expansion" of existing use.

On behalf of Merced Irrigation District (Merced), enclosed are the following:

- 1. Petition for Temporary Transfer Form together with a map (original and one copy).

- 4. Check in the amount of \$3,497 to cover the Petition fee.
- 5. Check in the amount of \$850 to cover the fee for the Department of Fish and Game.

Merced is petitioning to add to the place of use covered by License 2685 (Application 1224) in order to supply previously stored surface water to agricultural lands located near its boundaries. The lands participating in this proposed temporary transfer include those involved in the new organization known as the Merced County Sphere of Influence Water Users Association (SOI Water Users), which are all located within Merced County. The majority of the SOI Water Users currently, and have historically, received surface water from Merced during years that Merced's Board of Directors determine water is available under its Pre-1914 claims, provided that adequate natural flow is available from the Merced River. During months when surface water is not available under Merced's Pre-1914 claims for delivery to the SOI Water Users, the individual landowners meet their demands through alternate supplies, such as groundwater.

Approval of this petition would provide continued surface water supplies for SOI Water Users, up to the proposed temporary transfer quantity of 5,000 AF. Prior to the date at which the Merced Board of Directors determines that surface water is not available under its Pre-1914 claims for delivery to the SOI Water Users, Merced will evaluate the hydrologic conditions to

assess whether the previously stored water will be made available to the SOI Lands by releases from storage or by groundwater exchange pumping. Based on the Department of Water Resources (DWR) Bulletin 120 publication for March 1, 2007, *Water Supply Conditions in California*, the unimpaired runoff forecast for the Merced River below Merced Falls during the 2007 Water Year is 54% of average. Assuming that the hydrology does not improve during the next few months and the 2007 Water Year will be classified as a dry year type, according to a 90% inflow exceedance forecast, Merced is prepared to make water available for this proposed temporary transfer by groundwater exchange pumping. In this way, Merced would be exercising its conjunctive use operations by preserving surface water in the reservoir for the 2008 Water Year. Should the hydrology improve to an "average" runoff scenario, according to a 50% inflow exceedance forecast, Merced may elect to release surface water from storage for delivery to the SOI Water Users and refill the vacated storage.
