BASIS OF NEED

As identified in a memorandum prepared by the Department of Water Resources (DWR), dated March 5, 2009, the need for this proposed temporary transfer of water is based on the following:

"The 2009 Drought Water Bank (Water Bank) began in the summer of 2008 in response to Governor Schwarzenegger's June 4, 2008, Executive Order S-06-08 to help alleviate the drought conditions should they continue into 2009. On June 12, the Governor issued an Emergency Proclamation for nine counties in the San Joaquin Valley due to the critically dry conditions. 2009 is proving to be another critically dry year."

In addition, on February 27, 2009, the Governor declared a State of Emergency to address California's water shortage by directing state agencies to utilize their resources to provide assistance for people, communities, and business impacted by the drought. As identified in the attached Environmental Information for Petitions Form, on March 9, 2009, DWR issued a Notice of Exemption (NOE) from the requirements under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the DWB. This NOE was issued by DWR based on the Governor's State of Emergency declaration.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

In order to assist in addressing the State of Emergency, Pelger Mutual Water Company (Company) proposes to participate in the DWR's 2009 Drought Water Bank (DWB) by transferring up to 1,750 AF, which will be made available by groundwater substitution. Groundwater substitution involves the use of water pumped to produce crops in exchange for a like amount of surface water that will remain instream for diversion at the proposed additional points of diversion. Absent the proposed temporary transfer, the Company would divert the entire quantity of surface water proposed for transfer from the Sacramento River pursuant to its water rights and Settlement Contract with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation). This petition is being filed to facilitate a one year transfer to the DWB for use by water users within the Central Valley Project (CVP) or State Water Project (SWP) Service Areas.

PROPOSED NEW USER

The proposed new users will be water users within the places of use of the CVP and SWP; facilitated through the Drought Water Bank.

These proposed points of diversion are identified on maps filed with the Division of Water Rights (Division) under Applications 5630 and 5626.

PLACE OF USE

Present:

The present place of use is 2,086 acres net within a gross area of 2,900 acres, as shown on maps contained in the Division's files for License 8547B.

Proposed:

No change in the present place of use is proposed. The Company proposes to add the service areas of the CVP and the SWP served by the proposed points of diversion as the proposed additional places of use. The service area of the CVP is shown on Map 214-208 – 12581 on file with the Division under Application 5626. The service area of the SWP is shown on Map 1878 – 1, 2, 3, and 4 on file with the Division under Application 5630.

PURPOSE OF USE

Proposed:

The Company proposes to temporarily add Domestic, Municipal and Industrial as additional purposes of use.

PROPOSED TRANSFER WILL BE PLACED TO USE IN THE FOLLOWING COUNTY/COUNTIES

The water will be placed to beneficial use within the following counties: Yolo, Solano, Napa, Contra Costa, Alameda, Santa Clara, San Benito, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Merced, Fresno, Madera, Kings, Tulare, Kern, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, Ventura, Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, San Bernardino, and Riverside.

RESPONSES TO NUMBERED ITEMS ON PETITION:

- 1b. Absent the proposed temporary transfer to the DWB, groundwater would not be pumped and the Company would have diverted the surface water to meet its irrigation demands.
- Banks Pumping Plant and Barker Slough Pumping Plant, and the Contra Costa Canal as points of diversion. The proposed transfer will result in an increase in the flow between the Company's present point of diversion and the additional proposed points of diversion. This increase in flow, up to approximately 25 cfs which is the capacity of the three groundwater wells proposed for participation in the DWB, may result in a positive effect to the water users between the present and proposed points of diversion. These water users may include the Delta water users, the CVP, the SWP, and the Cities of Sacramento and West Sacramento. See files of the State Water Resources Control Board.
- **3a & 3b.** Under the Company's Settlement Contract No. 14-06-200-2073A, Reclamation releases water to meet the Company's demands. The Company will reduce its surface water diversions that would have occurred absent the proposed transfer.


Water from the Company's groundwater substitution program will be made available consistent with guidelines associated with the DWB. These guidelines have been developed to address the concerns of DWR and Reclamation relative to the potential impacts that water transfers may have on other legal water users. The Company has submitted a proposal to the DWB for participation, which includes detailed information relative to historical groundwater pumping, groundwater well characteristics, and associated maps. Currently, DWR and Reclamation are conducting an extensive review of these documents in order to ensure that the quantity of water proposed to be made available by the Company meets the relevant criteria to demonstrate a reduction in water use will occur as a result of the proposed transfer. In addition, it is our understanding that DWR and Reclamation are in contact with the Department of Fish and Game (DFG) and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) to address potential concerns.

Only wells which have been approved by the DWR or Reclamation for use in the DWB will be used for the proposed temporary transfer. Attachment 2 to this petition is a map showing the location of each of these wells within the Company. The

Company is not a public entity; and therefore, is not authorized to prepare a groundwater management plan. The Company, on behalf of its shareholders, is participating in the development of a groundwater management plan being prepared by Sutter County, which will include the wells and the overlying lands within the boundaries of the Company. The Company does not believe the proposed temporary transfer to the DWB by groundwater substitution will result in an overdraft of the underlying groundwater basin. As a condition of participation in the DWB, the Company will develop a monitoring and mitigation plan in cooperation with DWR and Reclamation to assure the proposed transfer does not result in any unreasonable impacts to the groundwater basin.

As a result of this proposed temporary transfer, the flow in the Sacramento River will increase by up to 1,750 AF during the period of transfer over what would have occurred absent the proposed transfer. The increased flow in the Sacramento River to the proposed points of diversion will be a small percentage of the total flow and will be water that would be available to the Company, absent this proposed transfer. Therefore, there will be no injury to other legal water users, water quality, or return flows; in fact, the increased flows may result in instream benefits through the increased flow downstream of the Company's present point of diversion.

- 4. The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board was contacted; and a copy of this petition has been provided.
- 5a. It is our understanding that representatives of the DWB have been in contact with staff of the DFG. In addition, we contacted Paul Forsberg (916) 323-7215 of DFG staff. Mr. Forsberg did not have an initial opinion relative to the effects of the proposed temporary transfer; and thus, a copy of this petition has been provided to DFG staff.
- 5c & 5d. The proposed transfer may provide environmental benefits through increased flows downstream of the Company's present point of diversion due to the reduction in surface water diversions. These reduced diversions may provide additional flows during critical periods of the year from the Company's point of diversion to the proposed additional points of diversion. These additional flows may enhance habitat for fisheries and wildlife.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

Pelger Mutual Water Company (Company) is petitioning to temporarily add points of diversion, places of use, and purposes of use to its water right identified above in order to transfer up to a total of 1,750 AF to the Department of Water Resources' (DWR) 2009 Drought Water Bank (DWB) by groundwater substitution. The Central Valley Project (CVP) CW "Bill" Jones Pumping Plant, the State Water Project (SWP) Banks Pumping Plant and Barker Slough Pumping Plant, and the Contra Costa Canal are to be added as points of diversion. In addition, the service areas of the CVP and SWP are proposed to be added as places of use. Domestic, Municipal, and Industrial are proposed to be added as purposes of use. There is no change to the existing point of diversion, place of use, or purpose of use. These proposed additions would authorize the transfer of water to the DWB, which was formed by DWR to facilitate water transfers during 2009.

The quantity of water to be made available by groundwater substitution involves the use of water pumped upon overlying lands in exchange for a like amount of surface water that will remain instream for diversion at the proposed additional points of diversion. Absent the proposed temporary transfer, the Company would divert the entire quantity of surface water proposed for transfer from the Sacramento River pursuant to its water rights. For this reason, the proposed temporary transfer does not involve any construction or other physical changes to the Company's facilities.

4. ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS

On March 4, 2009, DWR published an Addendum to the Environmental Water Account (EWA) Environmental Impact Statement/Environmental Impact Report (EIS/EIR) and the EWA Supplemental EIS/EIR, to address issues relevant to the DWB (State Clearinghouse #1996032083). The Addendum is available at: http://www.water.ca.gov/drought/docs/030409DWBaddendum.pdf

On March 9, 2009, the DWR issued a Notice of Exemption from the requirements under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the DWB, which states that "This Project is subject to the Governor's Proclamation of a State of Emergency of February 27, 2009, among whose purposes is to protect the safety of persons and property from the natural disaster created by the critical drought conditions currently existing in the State. Therefore, CEQA exemptions under Section 17 and CCR title 14, section 1529(c) shall apply, therefore; the 2009 Drought Water Bank falls within this exemption."
