GENERAL

The purpose of this Petition for Temporary Transfer is to: (1) add the State Water Project's (SWP) Harvey O. Banks Pumping Plant as a point of rediversion, (2) change the place of use to include the service area of the State Water Project (SWP), and (3) add Municipal and Industrial as purposes of use under License 11395 (Application 16186). This petition is being filed to facilitate a one-year transfer of up to 15,000 acre-feet (AF) of previously stored surface water from Merced Irrigation District (District), which will be made available by reservoir release to participating State Water Contractor (SWC) Agencies in order to provide an additional water supply for irrigation, domestic, municipal, and industrial uses. Reservoir reoperation will involve the release of water previously stored to the transfer participants from Lake McClure (New Exchequer Dam). The District is willing to accept reservoir refill criteria to ensure no injury occurs to downstream water right holders when water is made available. Absent the proposed temporary transfer, the District would retain the entire quantity of water proposed for transfer in storage pursuant to its water rights.

PROPOSED NEW USER

The proposed new users will be water users within the following four SWC Agencies listed below:

- DUDLEY RIDGE WATER DISTRICT,
- KERN COUNTY WATER AGENCY,
- OAK FLAT WATER DISTRICT, AND
- TULARE LAKE BASIN WATER STORAGE DISTRICT.

Proposed Additional Point of Rediversion:

No change in the present points of rediversion is proposed. The District proposes to add the following point of rediversion:

Banks Pumping Plant via the Clifton Court Forebay

N 486,035, E 1,695,057, California Coordinate System Zone 3, within the NW ¼ of SE ¼ of Projected Section 20, T1S, R4E, MDB&M

This proposed additional point of rediversion is identified on maps filed with the Division of Water Rights (Division) under Application 5630.

PLACE OF USE

Present:

Irrigation of 131,953 acres within a gross area of 154,394 acres within the boundaries of the Merced Irrigation District and a 55 acre golf course within the service area of Sierra Highlands Water Company.

Domestic use at homesites within the service area of Sierra Highlands Water Company and at homesites and recreational facilities adjacent to Lake McSwain and Lake McClure including McClure Point, McClure Boat Club and Barrett Cove.

Fish culture at Licensee's salmon spawning channel and at a privately operated trout farm.

Recreational use and fish and wildlife enhancement in and around lakes McClure and McSwain.

The present places of use are shown on map entitled "Official Map of the Merced Irrigation District – 1973" and other maps filed with State Water Resources Control Board.

In addition to the place of use authorized in License 11395 as set fourth on August 15, 1983, per Water Rights Order 93-2 issued on January 21, 1993, the place of use also includes South Shore Club, an area within the Lake San Pedro Community Services District described as follows:

2,010 acres located within Sections 11, 12, and 13, T3S, R14E and Sections 7 and 18, T3S, R15E, MDB&M, as shown on a map on file with the State Board prepared in accordance with the specifications in Title 23, Cal. Code of Regs., Div. 3, Ch. 2, Art. 7 (commencing with Section 715). Licensee may deliver water for domestic use within this place of use.

Irrigation purposes on 9,418.6 acres within the boundaries of El Nido Irrigation District as shown on map of District filed with the Division of Water Rights for Application 8238. El Nido Irrigation District has been consolidated with the District.

Proposed:

No change in the present place of use is proposed. The District proposes to add the service area of the SWP as the proposed additional place of use in order to facilitate the temporary water transfer to the participating SWCs. The service area of the SWP is shown on Map 1878-1, 2, 3, and 4 on file with the Division under Application 5630.

PURPOSE OF USE

Present:

Irrigation, Domestic, Fish Culture, and Recreation

Proposed:

The District proposes to temporarily add Municipal and Industrial as additional purposes of use.

RESPONSES TO NUMBERED ITEMS ON PETITION:

- 1b. Absent the proposed temporary transfer to the participating SWCs, the District would retain the entire quantity of water proposed for transfer in storage pursuant to its water rights.
- 2b. Although there are water users taking water from the stream between the District's current points of return flow and the points at which an export water user would return water to the system, we have answered question No. 2b as "not applicable." The District would not transfer water such that it would impact water users within Merced ID; and therefore, there will be no change in the return flow pattern from water users within the District.
- 2c. The District is proposing to add the SWP Banks Pumping Plant as an additional point of rediversion. The proposed transfer will result in an increase in the flow between the District's present points of rediversion and the additional proposed point of rediversion. This increase in flow may result in a positive effect to the water users between the present points of rediversion and the proposed additional point of rediversion. See files of the State Water Resources Control Board.
- Surface water will be made available for transfer from the District by reservoir release, consistent with the Draft Technical Information for Water Transfers in 2010 (Draft Technical Information) published by the Department of Water Resources (DWR) and U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation). The Draft Technical Information has been developed to address the concerns of DWR and Reclamation relative to the potential impacts that water transfers may have on other legal users. The District will coordinate with DWR and Reclamation for the proposed water transfer to the participating SWCs during 2010.

As a result of this proposed temporary transfer, the flow in the Merced River will increase by up to 15,000 AF during the period of the transfer over what would have occurred absent the proposed transfer. There will be no injury to other legal water users,

water quality, or return flows; in fact, the increased flows may result in instream benefits below the District's points of rediversion.

The release pattern for the proposed temporary transfer quantity will be coordinated with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USF&WS) and the Department of Fish and Game (DFG), in order to release up to 15,000 AF of water to support the District's Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) relicensing study 3.4, Instream Flow-Merced River Between Merced Falls Dam Crocker Huffman Dam (FERC Study) at the optimum high flow test rates.

- 4. The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (CVRWQCB) was contacted; and no comments were provided at this time. A copy of this petition has been provided to Jacqueline Matthews (530-224-4845) of the CVRWQCB.
- **5a.** The Department of Fish and Game (DFG) was contacted; and no comments were provided at this time. A copy of this petition has been provided to Lauren Dailey (916-358-2909) of DFG.
- As previously identified, the release of up to 15,000 AF of water will support the FERC Study at the optimum high flow test rates for use in an analysis to determine instream benefits to aquatic species. The proposed temporary transfer may provide environmental benefits through increased flows downstream of the District's present points of rediversion.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

Merced Irrigation District (District) is petitioning to temporarily add a point of rediversion, place of use, and purposes of use to the water right identified above in order to transfer up to a total of 15,000 AF to participating SWCs by release of previously stored surface water. The State Water Project's (SWP) Banks Pumping Plant is proposed to be added as a point of rediversion. In addition, the service area of the State Water Project (SWP) is proposed to be added as a place of use. Municipal and Industrial are proposed to be added as purposes of use. There is no change to the existing points of diversion or rediversion, place of use, or purposes of use. These proposed additions would authorize the transfer of water to participating SWCs during July through September 2010.

The quantity of water to be made available by reservoir release involves the use of previously stored surface water released into the Merced River for rediversion at the proposed additional point of rediversion. Absent the proposed temporary transfer, the District would have retained the 15,000 AF of surface water in storage pursuant to its water rights. For this reason, the proposed temporary transfer does not involve any construction or other physical changes to the District's facilities.

4. ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS

Petitions for temporary transfer of water pursuant to Water Code Section 1725 are exempt from CEQA. In February 2010, the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation prepared an Environmental Assessment (EA) and a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) for water transfers during 2010 and 2011 pursuant to the requirements under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). Although the EA and FONSI do not attempt to address the District's proposed water transfer directly, Section 3.18 of the EA covers Cumulative Effects, including a water transfer from the District for the quantity identified in this petition in 2010.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL SETTING

The proposed additional point of rediversion includes existing facilities that are well known and documented with the Division of Water Rights (Division). In addition, the proposed addition to the place of use is also well known and documented with the Division. Therefore, for these reasons, photographs of the proposed additional point of diversion and place of use are not included.
