DWR and Reclamation are requesting that the State Water Resources Control Board modify their permits to temporarily change the authorized place of use of in both agencies permits consolidate the SWP and CVP authorized place of use downstream of Banks and Jones Pumping Plants in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. The changes will allow DWR and Reclamation to more efficiently utilize the operational flexibility of the combined SWP and CVP facilities and water supply south of Banks and Jones in order to minimize to some extent the severe impacts to water users south of the Delta caused by unavailability of adequate SWP and CVP Project water supplies in 2014.

California is entering its third straight year of below-average rainfall and very low snowmelt runoff. Reservoir levels throughout the state were already significantly below average in October at the beginning of the 2013/2014 water year. The low initial storage and extremely dry conditions experienced since January 2013 have resulted in significant reductions in water supplies and will likely lead to critical water shortages in 2014. Because of the relentless dry pattern, on January 29 DWR announced that no 2014 supply would be allocated this year, which if not increased over the course of the year would represent the largest allocation deficiency for Municipal and Industrial contractors on record. Reclamation will announce its water supply allocations in mid to late February. CVP contractors anticipate similar dramatic cuts in allocations.

Water supply conditions are classified as "Critical" for both the Sacramento and San Joaquin River basins. Forecasts for Water Year 2014 indicate it is likely to be one of the most severe drought years in California's history. Extremely low reservoir storage levels are forecasted for this year in Northern California. Governor Brown declared a state of Emergency on January 17, 2014 citing the critically dry conditions in 2014 following two previous dry years. The Governor recognized the importance of maximizing the flexibility of the projects to allow exchanges of existing Project supplies in Directives 5 and 9 of the Proclamation which direct DWR and SWRCB to expeditiously process a petition to consolidate the SWP and CVP places of use to facilitate Project water exchanges.

ne requested change is necessary to help alleviate to some extent the impacts of the water shortages to users within the SWP and CVP service areas ownstream of the Delta pumping facilities, and to facilitate the most efficient use of limited Project water that is available. The change will not result in e diversion of additional water from the Delta or a change in timing of diversions.
