PURPOSE OF PETITION

The purpose of this Petition for Change Involving Water Transfers (Petition) is to add an additional place of use and point of rediversion under Merced Irrigation District's (Merced) License 2685 (Application 1224) for the release of up to 20,000 AF of surface water for use on lands within Merced County. The releases by Merced for the proposed water transfer would occur beginning upon approval of this Petition. The proposed addition to the place of use includes an area known as Merced's Sphere of Influence Lands (SOI Lands), Le Grand-Athlone Water District, Lone Tree Mutual Water Company, East Side Water District, and Chowchilla Water District (collectively, "Transferees"), which are all located within Merced County as shown on the map accompanying this petition. The majority of the SOI Lands currently, and have historically received surface water from Merced during years that Merced's Board of Directors determines that adequate natural flow is available under its Pre-1914 claims from the Merced River. During months when surface water is not available under Merced's Pre-1914 claims for delivery to SOI Lands, the individual landowners meet their demands through alternate supplies, such as groundwater. The landowners within the nearby water districts would also meet demands through alternate supplies.

In 2016, Merced petitioned and received approval from the Division of Water Rights for a temporary water transfer to continue surface water deliveries to the Transferees. Merced is filing this petition in order to provide continued surface water supplies for the Transferees, in a manner similar to the temporary water transfer completed during 2016. The proposed addition to the place of use is 219,740 acres. The surface water supply available proposed to be made available to the Transferees is diverted, stored, rediverted, and conveyed through Merced's existing facilities.

The quantity of surface water proposed to be released by Merced for delivery to the Transferees will be made available by releases of up to 20,000 AF from reservoir storage. The releases by Merced for the proposed water transfer would occur beginning upon approval of this Petition and potentially during a period of up to one year following approval of this Petition. Releases of previously stored surface water involve the delivery of water to the Transferees and refill of the reservoir, which normally occurs during periods of high runoff. Merced will implement refill criteria to assure no impact occurs to downstream water right holders. Absent the proposed temporary transfer, Merced would retain the entire quantity proposed for transfer in storage pursuant to its water right.

POINT OF DIVERSION OR REDIVERSION

No change in Merced's present points of diversion or points of rediversion are proposed. Merced's authorized points of diversion and rediversion under License 2685 are listed below:

Present Points of Diversion:

New Exchequer Dam (Lake McClure)

The point of diversion to storage of such water is located South thirty-eight degrees, no minutes West (S 38° 0' W), thirty eight hundred (3800) feet from the NE corner of Section 13, T4S, R15E, MBD&M, being within the NW ¼ of SE ¼ of said Section 13 in Mariposa County.

Merced Falls Diversion Dam for Northside Canal

Point of direct diversion and rediversion of stored water from Merced River for Northside Canal is located North sixty eight degrees, no minutes West (N 68° 0' W) twenty seven hundred fifty (2750) feet from the SE corner of Section 4, T5S, R15E, MDB&M., being within the SW ¼ of SE ¼ of Section 7 in Merced County.

Crocker-Huffman Diversion Dam for Main Canal

Point of direct diversion and rediversion of stored water from Merced River for Main Canal is located North forty seven degrees, thirty minutes East (N 47° 30'E) twenty eight hundred thirty (2830) feet from the SW corner of Section 7, T5S, R15E, MDB&M, being within the NE ¼ of SW ¼ of said Section 7 in Merced County.

Mariposa Town Planning Area

Point of direct diversion from Merced River for Mariposa Town Planning Area Main is located at a point North 48°34'35" West 1,113 feet from SE corner of Section 9, within the SE ¼ of the SE ¼ of Section 9, T4S, R18E, MDB&M in Mariposa County.

Merced Falls Diversion Dam for Northside Canal

Crocker-Huffman Diversion Dam for Main Canal

Point of direct diversion and rediversion of stored water from Merced River for Main Canal is located North forty seven degrees, thirty minutes East (N 47° 30'E) twenty eight hundred thirty (2830) feet from the SW corner of Section 7, T5S, R15E, MDB&M, being within the NE ¼ of SW ¼ of said Section 7 in Merced County.

Duck Slough (formerly El Nido Irrigation District)

Point of rediversion located on Duck Slough at a point 100 feet North and 50 feet East of ½ Cor. Sections 10 and 11, T8S, R14E, within the SW ½ of the NW ¼ Section 11, T8S, R14E, MDB&M in Merced County. This point of rediversion is associated with the former place of use for El Nido Irrigation District described below and in Licenses 6032 and 9429 (Applications 8238 and 18774), formerly held by El Nido Irrigation District and hereby transferred to Merced Irrigation District.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Releases of water from storage will increase the streamflow between Lake McClure and Merced's Main Canal and Northside Canal by up to 20,000 AF during the period of releases in order to convey stored surface water for rediversion to the Transferees. The quantity of surface water delivered to the Transferees will be made available from Merced by releases of previously stored water. Merced will continue the same surface water supplies to its existing customers with or without the proposed temporary water transfer. In addition, Merced is required to release water to meet its other existing downstream commitments and requirements on the Merced River below the inlet to its Main Canal. Deliveries to the Transferees will be in addition to existing downstream requirements. Therefore, there will be no downstream change of the streamflow, water quality, timing of diversion, return flows, effects on legal users of water, or change in the purposes of use authorized by License 2685 during the period of the proposed temporary transfer, which is proposed to occur beginning upon approval of this Petition and potentially during a period of up to one year following approval of this Petition. Absent the proposed transfer, storage in Lake McClure at the end of the irrigation season, October 31, is projected to be approximately 674,600 AF. Considering this volume, the proposed transfer of 20,000 AF would result in less than a 3 percent decrease from this projected storage.

A potential effect to the downstream flow from the release of stored water arises during the subsequent refill of the 20,000 AF of vacated stored water. This refill normally occurs during periods of high runoff and periods of low water demand by downstream water right holders. Merced will implement refill criteria to assure no impact occurs. Absent the proposed temporary transfer, Merced would retain the entire quantity proposed for transfer in storage pursuant to its water rights, and the Transferees would meet their demands through alternate supplies, such as pumped groundwater. 
(SGMA) directs the Department of Water Resources to develop groundwater basin priorities and identify groundwater basins and subbasins in conditions of critical overdraft. The proposed addition to the place of use includes lands overlying the Merced Subbasin and the Turlock Subbasin. The Merced Subbasin has been identified as a critically overdrafted basin, and the Turlock Subbasin has been designated as high-priority. The proposed project may help provide recharge and alleviate the portions of the subbasin by using the transferred surface water for irrigation in lieu of groundwater pumping.

Although there are water users taking water from the stream between Merced's current points of return flow and the points at which the Districts would return water to the system, we have responded to the relevant section of the Petition form as "not applicable." Merced would not transfer water such that it would adversely impact water users within Merced, and Merced will continue the same surface water deliveries to its existing customers with or without the proposed temporary water transfer; therefore, there will be no change in the return flow pattern from water users within Merced.

See files of SWRCB for more information regarding other legal water users, which may include the Delta water users, the CVP, and the SWP. The Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) and the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (CVRWQCB) were contacted. Consultation with Annette Tenneboe, Regional Water Rights Coordinator, DFW was made by telephone during the development phase in May 2017 and during the petition process in order to discuss the proposed temporary water transfer. Absent the proposed temporary transfer, Merced would retain the entire quantity proposed for transfer, and the Transferees would meet their demands through alternate supplies, such as pumped groundwater. The Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) directs the Department of Water Resources to develop groundwater basin priorities and identify groundwater basins and subbasins in conditions of critical overdraft. The proposed addition to the place of use includes lands overlying the Merced Subbasin and the Turlock Subbasin. The Merced Subbasin has been identified as a critically overdrafted basin, and the Turlock Subbasin has been designated as high-priority. The proposed project may help provide recharge and alleviate the portions of the subbasin by using the transferred surface water for irrigation in lieu of groundwater pumping.

Merced is required to release water pursuant to its other existing downstream requirements and commitments. Releases of water from storage will increase the streamflow between Lake McClure and Merced's Main Canal by up to 20,000 AF during the period of releases in order to convey stored surface water for rediversion to the Transferees. There will be no changes to the crops produced within Merced's boundaries as a result of the temporary water transfer; thus, Merced will provide the proposed releases over and above existing requirements,

commitments, and deliveries. For these reasons, the proposed temporary transfer does not involve any construction or physical changes to the District's facilities. Petitions for temporary transfer of water pursuant to Water Code Section 1725 are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act.

PHOTOGRAPHS

The present points of diversion include existing facilities that are well known and documented with the Division. In addition, the present and proposed places of use are also well known and documented with the Division. Therefore, for these reasons, photographs of these points of diversion and places of use are not included.

MAPS

The present points of diversion, points of rediversion, and places of use are shown on maps filed with the Division for License 2685. The proposed additional place of use is shown on the attached map titled "Merced Irrigation District Map to Accompany Petition for Temporary Transfer under License 2685 (Application 1224) Proposed Addition to Place of Use and Point of Rediversion".
