DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED CHANGES

The Merced Irrigation District (MID) is petitioning to add a place of use to its License 2685 (Application 1224) in order to supply previously stored surface water to agricultural lands located near the boundaries of MID's authorized place of use. These lands are within an area known as MID's Sphere of Influence Lands (SOI Lands), an area known as the Red Top Area, Le Grand-Athlone Water District, Lone Tree Mutual Water Company, East Side Water District, and Chowchilla Water District (collectively, "Transferees"), which are all located within Merced County. The majority of the SOI Lands currently, and have historically received surface water from MID during years that MID's Board of Directors determines that adequate natural flow is available under its Pre-1914 claims from the Merced River. During months when surface water is not available under MID's Pre-1914 claims for delivery to SOI Lands, the individual landowners meet their demands through alternate supplies, such as groundwater. The landowners within the nearby water districts would also meet demands through alternate supplies.

Approval of this petition would provide for up to the proposed temporary transfer quantity of 20,000 AF to be made available by MID from releases of stored surface water. The releases by MID for the proposed water transfer would occur beginning upon approval of this Petition and potentially during a period of up to one year following approval of this Petition. These releases involve the delivery of previously stored surface water to the Transferees and refill of the reservoir, which normally occurs during periods of high runoff. MID will implement criteria to ensure no impact occurs to downstream water right holders. There will be minor changes to MID's current operations as a result of this Petition. Absent the proposed temporary transfer, MID would retain the entire quantity proposed for transfer, and the Transferees would meet their demands through alternate supplies, such as pumped groundwater. The Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) directs the Department of Water Resources to develop groundwater basin priorities and identify groundwater basins and subbasins in conditions of critical overdraft. The proposed addition to the place of use includes lands overlying the Merced Subbasin and the Turlock Subbasin. The Merced Subbasin has been identified as a critically overdrafted basin, and the Turlock Subbasin has been designated as high-priority. The proposed project may help provide supplemental water to recharge and alleviate the portions of the subbasin by using the transferred surface water for irrigation in lieu of groundwater pumping.

MID is required to release water pursuant to its other existing downstream requirements and commitments. Releases of water from storage will increase the streamflow between Lake McClure and MID's Main Canal by up to 20,000 AF during the period of releases in order to convey stored surface water for rediversion to the Transferees. There will be no changes to the crops produced within MID's boundaries as a result of the temporary water transfer; thus, MID

will provide the proposed releases over and above existing requirements, commitments, and deliveries. For these reasons, the proposed temporary transfer does not involve any construction or physical changes to the District's facilities. Petitions for temporary transfer of water pursuant to Water Code Section 1725 are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act.

PHOTOGRAPHS

The present points of diversion include existing facilities that are well known and documented with the Division. In addition, the present and proposed places of use are also well known and documented with the Division. Therefore, for these reasons, photographs of these points of diversion and places of use are not included.

MAPS

The present points of diversion, points of rediversion, and places of use are shown on maps filed with the Division for License 2685. The proposed additional place of use is shown on the attached map titled "Merced Irrigation District Map to Accompany Petition for Temporary Transfer under License 2685 (Application 1224) Proposed Addition to Place of Use and Point of Rediversion," dated May 4, 2018.
