Environmental Information for Petition for Change Involving Transfer
San Juan Water District – License 6324

Description of Proposed Changes

Petitioner San Juan Water District (“District”) proposes to transfer by groundwater substitution up to 2,175 acre-feet (“AF”) of surface water normally diverted by the District at the municipal intake in Folsom Dam, which feeds the pipelines that supply water to SJWD and the Cities of Folsom and Roseville. The District will combine this supply with an additional 2,175 acre-feet from its pre-1914 water right (discussed below), for a total of 4,350 acre-feet prior to applying necessary stream depletion factors.

The groundwater pumped to support this transfer will be pumped both by the Fair Oaks Water District (“FOWD”) and the Citrus Heights Water District (“CHWD”), both being retail water purveyors under agreement with the District to traditionally take delivery of the District’s surface water. FOWD will forego receiving up to 2,175 AF of its surface water supplies and CHWD will forego 2,175 AF of its surface water supplies and instead leave that foregone surface water supply at the outlet of Folsom Dam for transfer to two State Water Project (“SWP”) contractors, Dudley Ridge Water District, and Kern County Water Agency (“Buyers”).

The District, along with FOWD and CHWD, are part of a six-agency group of sellers that rely on the American River for their surface water supplies that are petitioning the State Water Board simultaneously to temporarily add points of rediversion, places of use and purposes of use to their water rights to enable transfer of approximately 12,000 acre-feet of surface water to the Buyers through groundwater substitution. The estimated availability of transferrable surface water reflects the net surface water available after applying an 8% stream depletion factor to the pumping of approximately 13,150 acre-feet of groundwater in the region to meet local demands otherwise served by the foregone surface supplies.

The water supplies that the District proposes to transfer to the Buyers will be used for irrigation purposes within the portion of the SWP service area that comprises the Buyers’ individual service areas. To make the 4,350 AF of “Transfer Water” available to the Buyers, FOWD and CHWD will pump groundwater to serve their customers’ demands that otherwise would have served with surface water diverted at Folsom Dam and treated at the Sidney N. Peterson Water Treatment Plant located adjacent to Folsom Dam for delivery to serve those demands.

To accomplish this groundwater substitution transfer, the District is foregoing water supplies under two water rights: License 6324, and pre-1914 appropriative right reported under Statement of Water Diversion and Use (“SODU”) S000656. The District will transfer up to 2,000 acre-feet under its pre-1914 appropriative right under Water Code section 1706 and a CEQA negative declaration (SCH #2018042036). This portion of the transfer, however, is not subject to approval under Water Code sections 1725 through 1732 and is noted here solely for informational purposes.

The District is requesting that the State Water Resources Control Board (“SWRCB”) approve the following temporary changes to the District’s Water Right License No. 6324:

1. Authorize an additional point of diversion for the Transfer Water at the SWP’s Harvey O. Banks Pumping Plant via Clifton Court Forebay, and point of rediversion at San Luis Reservoir;
2. Authorize an additional place of use for the Transfer Water within the service areas of the Buyers, which are all contained within the existing authorized SWP service area; and
3. Authorize an additional purpose of use for irrigation.

The existing point of diversion, place of use and purpose of use in the District’s License No. 6324 would continue to be valid and utilized.

The District will leave the Transfer Water in the American River at the outlet of Folsom Dam and allow the Buyers (as stipulated in a separate conveyance agreement between the Buyers, the Sellers and DWR) to take control of the Transfer Water at the District’s point of diversion, then flow down the lower American River, in the Sacramento River and across the Delta to the proposed additional temporary point of diversion at the Banks Pumping Plant. DWR then will divert the Transfer Water at the Banks Pumping Plant. After diversion from the Delta, the Transfer Water will either be conveyed for use in the Buyers’ service areas or stored in San Luis Reservoir or other facilities for later use by the Buyers. Conveyance of the Transfer Water will be scheduled in cooperation with DWR such that it will use available surplus release, pumping and transmission capacity and will not disrupt normal SWP operations. The proposed water transfer would be carried out in compliance with all existing laws and regulatory constraints on diversions from the Delta.

Only existing facilities will be utilized to accomplish this temporary water transfer. It does not involve construction or modification of any facilities. Because the proposed transfer would be conducted to replace existing water demands that otherwise would be unsatisfied in 2018 because of cutbacks in the Buyers’ SWP contractual entitlements, land uses within the District’s service areas and affected portions of the SWP service areas will not change as a result of this transfer. This transfer is needed to provide supplemental irrigation water supplies to the Buyers, which have been affected by reduced 2018 water supply allocations due to the dry hydrology. Because its purpose is to make up for unavailable water supplies normally used by the Buyers, the proposed transfer will not result in any land use changes.

CEQA is not required for this proposed transfer because temporary water transfers (one year or less) under Water Code sections 1725 through 1732 are statutorily exempt from CEQA. (Water Code, § 1729; CEQA Guidelines, § 15282(u).) The District will file a notice of exemption for this transfer upon the SWRCB’s approval of the Petition. The proposed transfer under the District’s pre-1914 water right has been addressed in a CEQA negative declaration (SCH #2018042036).

The proposed transfer will be conducted in compliance with the guidelines issued in the *Draft Technical Information for Preparing Water Transfer Proposals*, dated December 2015, as published by the California Department of Water Resources (“DWR”) and the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. The District and the other American River sellers will enter into a conveyance

agreement with DWR that will stipulate specific and applicable implementation measures for the transfer to assure the transfer complies with subdivision (d) of Water Code section 1810.

Coordination with Regional Water Quality Control Board

This transfer project will not require any construction and its operation will not generate waste or wastewater containing sewage or chemicals of any kind. As explained in Attachment No.1 to the Petition, the amount of water that the District proposes to transfer will only slightly increase anticipated 2018 baseline water flows in the lower American and Sacramento Rivers and in the Delta and will be within the range of historical flows. This negligible increase in estimated 2018 flows resulting from the proposed transfer is not expected to cause erosion, turbidity, or sedimentation.

Photographs

The present and proposed points of diversion include existing facilities that are well known to and documented with the SWRCB's Division of Water Rights ("Division"). In addition, the present and proposed places of use also are well known to and documented with the Division. Providing photographs of the present and proposed points of diversion and places of use would be redundant and, therefore, none are included with this Environmental Information form.

Maps

The District's existing point of redirection from Folsom Dam and into the Sidney N. Peterson Water Treatment Plant located adjacent to Folsom Dam, and existing place of use are shown on the map filed with the Division for License No. 6324. The District's existing place of use encompasses its wholesale service area, which includes Citrus Heights Water District, Fair Oaks Water District, Orangevale Mutual Water Company, City of Folsom's Ashland service area and San Juan's retail service area, which is where the surface water proposed to be transferred would otherwise be used. The proposed temporary point of redirection for the SWP Banks Pumping Plant is shown on maps filed with the Division for DWR's Application 5630. The proposed additional place of use is a portion of the SWP service area, as shown on Map 1878 – 2 and – 3 on file with the Division under Application 5630.
