Dear Mr. Ekdahl:

Please find the enclosed temporary urgency change petitions involving the subject permits and license, filed pursuant to Water Code Section 1435 (Petitions). Reclamation has filed these Petitions in order to take advantage of water stored in Millerton Reservoir and subsequently released from storage that is not needed by Friant Division contractors or the San Joaquin River Restoration Program (SJRRP) at the time of release. Reclamation proposes to deliver this water to wildlife refuges designated in the Petitions.

The enclosed Petitions each contains a pre-printed statement that an \$850.00 fee made payable to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) must accompany each Petition. Therefore a check for \$850.00 made payable to the CDFW is enclosed with the Petitions. Since all Petitions will be reviewed and considered together for the same action, only one fee is enclosed pursuant to Section 10005(e) of the California Public Resources Code.

Reclamation understands that the administrative filing fee required to process these Petitions is covered by the water right fees program to the extent that sufficient funds are available. Any administrative costs incurred as a result of processing Reclamation's Petitions that exceed the funds available under the water right fees program will be covered under the existing contract between Reclamation and the State Water Board (Board) for services rendered by Board staff.

Reclamation appreciates the assistance that the Division will be providing in processing these Petitions.

Point of Diversion/Rediversion

Present: San Joaquin River, Tributary to Suisun Bay

Coordinate Description

Points of diversion and rediversion are at Friant Dam. The points of diversion and rediversion are the same as on file with the State Water Board for Applications 23, 234, 1465, and 5638.

Friant Dam: North 39° 30' West 2,200 feet from S¼ corner of Section 5, T11S, R21E, M.D.B.&M, being within the NW¼ of SW¼ of Section 5, T11S, R21E, M.D.B.&M.

Proposed:

Points of rediversion are proposed to be added at the following location.

Mendota Dam, Located N 1745375 E 6598943 California Coordinate System, Zone 3, NAD 83, being within the SE ¼ of NE ¼ of Section 19, T13S, R15E, M.D.B.&M.,

Place of Use

Present: The places of use are the same as on file with the State Water Board for Applications 23, 234, 1465, and 5638. See Map 1785-202-50, 214-212-37, and 214-208-3331, and 1785-202-14, on file with the State Water Board.

Proposed: Same.

Purpose of Use

Present: The combined purposes of use for all three permitted and licensed applications are irrigation, domestic, incidental domestic, municipal, stockwatering, preservation and enhancement of fish and wildlife, and recreational, as on file with the State Water Board.

Proposed: Same.

Requested Change

Reclamation seeks to take advantage of water stored pursuant to the listed permits and license in Millerton Reservoir (Central Valley Project water, or so-called "CVP water") and subsequently released from storage that is not needed by Friant Division contractors or the San Joaquin River Restoration Program (SJRRP) at the time of release by delivering this water to the below-listed refuges. Temporary addition of the listed PORD to the permits and license listed in this petition is necessary in order to make these deliveries. Rediverted flows would be conveyed through canal intakes off Mendota Dam and delivered to the refuges pursuant to agreements with various entities that take water from Mendota Pool into their conveyance systems and then convey it to the refuges.

Consequently, Reclamation requests that the State Water Board modify the permits and license listed in this petition to temporarily add the point of rediversion (PORD) below Friant Dam listed above in order to deliver up to 60,000 acre-feet to the following wildlife refuges.

Urgent Need

There is an urgent need for this change in order to put CVP water released from Millerton Reservoir to beneficial use that would otherwise be wasted. The snowpack in the San Joaquin basin is currently 152 % of the April 1 average. Runoff into Millerton Reservoir is estimated to be 113% to 145% of average (1,927 to 2,422 thousand acre-feet); therefore, Reclamation will have additional CVP water available to put to beneficial use this year. However, Reclamation will have limited control of this additional supply; in order to make maximum beneficial use of this water, Reclamation will have to release CVP water previously stored in Millerton Reservoir sometime during the April – June timeframe. This water is not needed to meet the demand of the Friant Division contractors or the SJRRP at that time; therefore, delivery to wildlife refuges allows Reclamation to maximize beneficial use of this water.

Water released from storage in Millerton may be the only source of CVP water for the above-listed refuges during this period. Abnormally high runoff from the San Joaquin and Kings Rivers could cause Reclamation to stop delivery of CVP water from the Delta-Mendota Canal (DMC) to the Mendota Pool. CVP water delivered from the DMC is the main source of supply to the refuges; if this water is not available in the Mendota Pool, no water can be delivered to the refuges. It is uncertain whether hydrologic conditions will cause Reclamation to stop delivery of CVP water from the DMC to the Mendota Pool in 2019; if so, water released from storage in Millerton may be the only source of CVP water for the refuges.

Reclamation has various contracts and agreements for the conveyance of water to certain wildlife refuges, including the above. (See: https://www.usbr.gov/mp/cvpia/3406d/env_docs/) These contracts and agreements implement refuge water supply requirements under Section 3406(d) of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act (Title 34, P.I. 102-575) (CVPIA). They provide, among other things and subject to stated conditions and provisions, that during each year Reclamation shall convey CVP water to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and California Department of Fish and Wildlife in quantities of CVP water required to provide each refuge with L2 and L4 supplies as set forth in Exhibit B to those contracts and agreements. Approval of this action would assist Reclamation in meeting its obligations to deliver L2 and L4 supplies pursuant to the requirements of each refuge listed above.

The State Water Board issued a Temporary Order dated March 6, 2018 (in response to Reclamation's December 7, 2017, temporary transfer change petitions) approving the temporary addition of Banta-Carbona and Patterson Irrigation District facilities for the recapture of SJRRP Restoration Flows dedicated for instream purposes under Reclamation's water rights for the

operation of Friant Dam. In that Order, the Board added a term providing that the PORDs cited in Reclamation's Millerton water rights are for the recapture of SJRRP Restoration Flows. The discussion section of the March 6 Order provides that the PORDs shown on the amended Millerton water rights in 2013 as part of the permanent change petition implementing the SJRRP (2013 Order) are solely for recapture of Restoration Flows. The State Board's interpretation of this Order is that these PORDs could not be used for any other purpose, such as delivery of Millerton releases to the refuges. Fundamentally, the State Water Board has attempted to condition the exercise of an element of Reclamation's permanent water rights (in this case, point of rediversion) on the basis of the water right holder's water management program being implemented at the time of need for downstream rediversion.

Reclamation disagrees with the State Water Board's interpretation of the 2013 Order (as expressed in our Petitions for Reconsideration of the March 6, 2018 Order). However, in an abundance of caution, and without waiving any of its rights or arguments as to the use of the PORDs added in the 2013 Order, Reclamation is filing this Temporary Urgency Change petition in order to assure there are no complications with the use of this PORD for delivery of CVP water released from Millerton Reservoir to wildlife refuges.

No Injury to Other Legal Users

The water released from storage in Millerton reservoir is water appropriated to storage under the water right permits and license for Millerton Reservoir. However, this water is in excess of the demands for the CVP's Friant Division contractors and delivery of this water to the refuges does not injure them by diminishing their supply; Friant Division contractors potentially could be offered uncontrolled season deliveries, SJRRP Recovered Water Account Water, and Section 215 deliveries before making any necessary releases downstream of Friant Dam that would be subsequently delivered to the above listed refuges. The water involved in this proposed action could not be carried over but would need to be released in order for Millerton Reservoir to remain in accordance with flood control requirements during the upcoming snowmelt.

The proposed transfer/exchange would not affect water delivery obligations to other contractors and refuges. There would be no expansion of existing obligations, or increases in demands, to provide CVP water supplies. Nor would it adversely impact Reclamation's ability to meet terms and conditions of it water rights for the operation of the CVP. Reclamation expects under current hydrological conditions that it is unlikely that diverters downstream would have a need to divert these springtime Millerton storage releases.

The proposed action would not alter other CVP operations or release patterns from CVP facilities, or the maximum volume of water delivered to CVP contractors. In addition, CVP water released from storage and delivered to the refuges will not affect the amount of water used by the SJRRP.

Therefore, the proposed action would not injure or unreasonably affect any legal user of water, nor increase the amount of water Reclamation is entitled to use under the subject CVP Applications.

No unreasonable effects to fish and wildlife

Rediversion of flows at the proposed point of rediversion will not have an unreasonable effect upon fish and wildlife resources. The SJRRP will continue to function as required, and Reclamation will comply all applicable biological opinions.

Reclamation seeks to take advantage of water stored pursuant to the listed permits and license in Millerton Reservoir (Central Valley Project water, or so-called "CVP water") and subsequently released from storage that is not needed by Friant Division contractors or the San Joaquin River Restoration Program (SJRRP) at the time of release by delivering this water to the above-listed refuges. Rediverted flows would be conveyed to refuges through canal intakes off Mendota Dam. The flows would be used toward meeting the requirements of the above refuges pursuant to long-term contracts and agreements executed by Reclamation for the conveyance and delivery of Level 2 (L2) and Level 4 (L4) supplies.

Urgent Need

There is an urgent need for this change in order to put CVP water released from Millerton Reservoir to beneficial use that would otherwise be wasted. The snowpack in the San Joaquin basin is currently 152 % of the April 1 average. Runoff into Millerton Reservoir is estimated to be 113% to 145% of average (1,927 to 2,422 thousand acre-feet); therefore, Reclamation will have additional CVP water available to put to beneficial use this year. However, Reclamation will have limited control of this additional supply; in order to make maximum beneficial use of this water, Reclamation will have to release CVP water previously stored in Millerton Reservoir sometime during the April – June timeframe. This water is not needed to meet the demand of the Friant Division contractors or the SJRRP at that time; therefore, delivery to wildlife refuges allows Reclamation to maximize beneficial use of this water.

Water released from storage in Millerton may be the only source of CVP water for the above-listed refuges during this period. Abnormally high runoff from the San Joaquin and Kings Rivers could cause Reclamation to stop delivery of CVP water from the Delta-Mendota Canal (DMC) to the Mendota Pool. CVP water delivered from the DMC is the main source of supply to the refuges; if this water is not available in the Mendota Pool, no water can be delivered to the refuges. It is uncertain whether hydrologic conditions will cause Reclamation to stop delivery of CVP water from the DMC to the Mendota Pool in 2019; if so, water released from storage in Millerton may be the only source of CVP water for the refuges.

Reclamation has various contracts and agreements for the conveyance of water to certain wildlife refuges, including the above. (See: https://www.usbr.gov/mp/cvpia/3406d/env_docs/) These contracts and agreements implement refuge water supply requirements under Section 3406(d) of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act (Title 34, P.L. 102-575) (CVPIA). They provide, among other things and subject to stated conditions and provisions, that during each year Reclamation shall convey CVP water to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and California Department of Fish and Wildlife in quantities of CVP water required to provide each refuge with L2 and L4 supplies as set forth in Exhibit B to those contracts and agreements. Approval of this action would assist Reclamation in meeting its obligations to deliver L2 and L4 supplies pursuant to the requirements of each refuge listed above.

The State Water Board issued a Temporary Order dated March 6, 2018 (in response to Reclamation's December 7, 2017, temporary transfer change petitions) approving the temporary addition of Banta-Carbona and Patterson Irrigation District facilities for the recapture of SJRRP Restoration Flows dedicated for instream purposes under Reclamation's water rights for the

operation of Friant Dam. In that Order, the Board added a term providing that the PORDs cited in Reclamation's Millerton water rights are for the recapture of SJRRP Restoration Flows. The discussion section of the March 6 Order provides that the PORDs shown on the amended Millerton water rights in 2013 as part of the permanent change petition implementing the SJRRP (2013 Order) are solely for recapture of Restoration Flows. The State Board's interpretation of this Order is that these PORDs could not be used for any other purpose, such as delivery of Millerton releases to the refuges. Fundamentally, the State Water Board has attempted to condition the exercise of an element of Reclamation's permanent water rights (in this case, point of rediversion) on the basis of the water right holder's water management program being implemented at the time of need for downstream rediversion.

Reclamation disagrees with the State Water Board's interpretation of the 2013 Order (as expressed in our Petitions for Reconsideration of the March 6, 2018 Order). However, in an abundance of caution, and without waiving any of its rights or arguments as to the use of the PORDs added in the 2013 Order, Reclamation is filing this Temporary Urgency Change petition in order to assure there are no complications with the use of this PORD for delivery of CVP water released from Millerton Reservoir to wildlife refuges.

No Injury to Other Legal Users

The water released from storage in Millerton reservoir is water appropriated to storage under the water right permits and license for Millerton Reservoir. However, this water is in excess of the demands for the CVP's Friant Division contractors and delivery of this water to the refuges does not injure them by diminishing their supply; Friant Division contractors potentially could be offered uncontrolled season deliveries, SJRRP Recovered Water Account Water, and Section 215 deliveries before making any necessary releases downstream of Friant Dam that would be subsequently delivered to the above listed refuges. The water involved in this proposed action could not be carried over but would need to be released in order for Millerton Reservoir to remain in accordance with flood control requirements during the upcoming snowmelt.

The proposed transfer/exchange would not affect water delivery obligations to other contractors and refuges. There would be no expansion of existing obligations, or increases in demands, to provide CVP water supplies. Nor would it adversely impact Reclamation's ability to meet terms and conditions of it water rights for the operation of the CVP. Reclamation expects under current hydrological conditions that it is unlikely that diverters downstream would have a need to divert these springtime Millerton storage releases.

The proposed action would not alter other CVP operations or release patterns from CVP facilities, or the maximum volume of water delivered to CVP contractors. In addition, CVP water released from storage and delivered to the refuges will not affect the amount of water used by the SJRRP.

Therefore, the proposed action would not injure or unreasonably affect any legal user of water, nor increase the amount of water Reclamation is entitled to use under the subject CVP Applications.

No unreasonable effects to fish and wildlife

Rediversion of flows at the proposed point of rediversion will not have an unreasonable effect upon fish and wildlife resources. The SJRRP will continue to function as required, and Reclamation will comply all applicable biological opinions.

Requested Change

Reclamation seeks to take advantage of water stored pursuant to the listed permits and license in Millerton Reservoir (Central Valley Project water, or so-called "CVP water") and subsequently released from storage that is not needed by Friant Division contractors or the San Joaquin River Restoration Program (SJRRP) at the time of release by delivering this water to the below-listed refuges. Temporary addition of the listed PORD to the permits and license listed in this petition is necessary in order to make these deliveries. Rediverted flows would be conveyed through canal intakes off Mendota Dam and delivered to the refuges pursuant to agreements with various entities that take water from Mendota Pool into their conveyance systems and then convey it to the refuges.

Consequently, Reclamation requests that the State Water Board modify the permits and license listed in this petition to temporarily add the point of rediversion (PORD) below Friant Dam listed above in order to deliver up to 60,000 acre-feet to the following wildlife refuges.

Urgent Need

There is an urgent need for this change in order to put CVP water released from Millerton Reservoir to beneficial use that would otherwise be wasted. The snowpack in the San Joaquin basin is currently 152 % of the April 1 average. Runoff into Millerton Reservoir is estimated to be 113% to 145% of average (1,927 to 2,422 thousand acre-feet); therefore, Reclamation will have additional CVP water available to put to beneficial use this year. However, Reclamation will have limited control of this additional supply; in order to make maximum beneficial use of this water, Reclamation will have to release CVP water previously stored in Millerton Reservoir sometime during the April – June timeframe. This water is not needed to meet the demand of the Friant Division contractors or the SJRRP at that time; therefore, delivery to wildlife refuges allows Reclamation to maximize beneficial use of this water.

Water released from storage in Millerton may be the only source of CVP water for the above-listed refuges during this period. Abnormally high runoff from the San Joaquin and Kings Rivers could cause Reclamation to stop delivery of CVP water from the Delta-Mendota Canal (DMC) to the Mendota Pool. CVP water delivered from the DMC is the main source of supply to the refuges; if this water is not available in the Mendota Pool, no water can be delivered to the refuges. It is uncertain whether hydrologic conditions will cause Reclamation to stop delivery of CVP water from the DMC to the Mendota Pool in 2019; if so, water released from storage in Millerton may be the only source of CVP water for the refuges.

Reclamation has various contracts and agreements for the conveyance of water to certain wildlife refuges, including the above. (See: https://www.usbr.gov/mp/cvpia/3406d/env_docs/) These contracts and agreements implement refuge water supply requirements under Section 3406(d) of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act (Title 34, P.L. 102-575) (CVPIA). They provide, among other things and subject to stated conditions and provisions, that during each year Reclamation shall convey CVP water to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and California Department of Fish and Wildlife in quantities of CVP water required to provide each refuge with L2 and L4 supplies as set forth in Exhibit B to those contracts and agreements. Approval of this action would assist Reclamation in meeting its obligations to deliver L2 and L4 supplies pursuant to the requirements of each refuge listed above.

The State Water Board issued a Temporary Order dated March 6, 2018 (in response to Reclamation's December 7, 2017, temporary transfer change petitions) approving the temporary addition of Banta-Carbona and Patterson Irrigation District facilities for the recapture of SJRRP Restoration Flows dedicated for instream purposes under Reclamation's water rights for the

operation of Friant Dam. In that Order, the Board added a term providing that the PORDs cited in Reclamation's Millerton water rights are for the recapture of SJRRP Restoration Flows. The discussion section of the March 6 Order provides that the PORDs shown on the amended Millerton water rights in 2013 as part of the permanent change petition implementing the SJRRP (2013 Order) are solely for recapture of Restoration Flows. The State Board's interpretation of this Order is that these PORDs could not be used for any other purpose, such as delivery of Millerton releases to the refuges. Fundamentally, the State Water Board has attempted to condition the exercise of an element of Reclamation's permanent water rights (in this case, point of rediversion) on the basis of the water right holder's water management program being implemented at the time of need for downstream rediversion.

Reclamation disagrees with the State Water Board's interpretation of the 2013 Order (as expressed in our Petitions for Reconsideration of the March 6, 2018 Order). However, in an abundance of caution, and without waiving any of its rights or arguments as to the use of the PORDs added in the 2013 Order, Reclamation is filing this Temporary Urgency Change petition in order to assure there are no complications with the use of this PORD for delivery of CVP water released from Millerton Reservoir to wildlife refuges.

No Injury to Other Legal Users

The water released from storage in Millerton reservoir is water appropriated to storage under the water right permits and license for Millerton Reservoir. However, this water is in excess of the demands for the CVP's Friant Division contractors and delivery of this water to the refuges does not injure them by diminishing their supply; Friant Division contractors potentially could be offered uncontrolled season deliveries, SJRRP Recovered Water Account Water, and Section 215 deliveries before making any necessary releases downstream of Friant Dam that would be subsequently delivered to the above listed refuges. The water involved in this proposed action could not be carried over but would need to be released in order for Millerton Reservoir to remain in accordance with flood control requirements during the upcoming snowmelt.

The proposed transfer/exchange would not affect water delivery obligations to other contractors and refuges. There would be no expansion of existing obligations, or increases in demands, to provide CVP water supplies. Nor would it adversely impact Reclamation's ability to meet terms and conditions of it water rights for the operation of the CVP. Reclamation expects under current hydrological conditions that it is unlikely that diverters downstream would have a need to divert these springtime Millerton storage releases.

The proposed action would not alter other CVP operations or release patterns from CVP facilities, or the maximum volume of water delivered to CVP contractors. In addition, CVP water released from storage and delivered to the refuges will not affect the amount of water used by the SJRRP.

Therefore, the proposed action would not injure or unreasonably affect any legal user of water, nor increase the amount of water Reclamation is entitled to use under the subject CVP Applications.

No unreasonable effects to fish and wildlife

Rediversion of flows at the proposed point of rediversion will not have an unreasonable effect upon fish and wildlife resources. The SJRRP will continue to function as required, and Reclamation will comply all applicable biological opinions.

Coordinate Description

Points of diversion and rediversion are at Friant Dam. The points of diversion and rediversion are the same as on file with the State Water Board for Applications 23, 234, 1465, and 5638.

Place of Use

Present: The combined purposes of use for all three permitted and licensed applications are irrigation, domestic, incidental domestic, municipal, stockwatering, preservation and enhancement of fish and wildlife, and recreational, as on file with the State Water Board.

Proposed: Same.

Requested Change

Reclamation seeks to take advantage of water stored pursuant to the listed permits and license in Millerton Reservoir (Central Valley Project water, or so-called "CVP water") and subsequently released from storage that is not needed by Friant Division contractors or the San Joaquin River Restoration Program (SJRRP) at the time of release by delivering this water to the below-listed refuges. Temporary addition of the listed PORD to the permits and license listed in this petition is necessary in order to make these deliveries. Rediverted flows would be conveyed through canal intakes off Mendota Dam and delivered to the refuges pursuant to agreements with various entities that take water from Mendota Pool into their conveyance systems and then convey it to the refuges.

Consequently, Reclamation requests that the State Water Board modify the permits and license listed in this petition to temporarily add the point of rediversion (PORD) below Friant Dam listed above in order to deliver up to 60,000 acre-feet to the following wildlife refuges.

Urgent Need

There is an urgent need for this change in order to put CVP water released from Millerton Reservoir to beneficial use that would otherwise be wasted. The snowpack in the San Joaquin basin is currently 152 % of the April 1 average. Runoff into Millerton Reservoir is estimated to be 113% to 145% of average (1,927 to 2,422 thousand acre-feet); therefore, Reclamation will have additional CVP water available to put to beneficial use this year. However, Reclamation will have limited control of this additional supply; in order to make maximum beneficial use of this water, Reclamation will have to release CVP water previously stored in Millerton Reservoir sometime during the April – June timeframe. This water is not needed to meet the demand of the Friant Division contractors or the SJRRP at that time; therefore, delivery to wildlife refuges allows Reclamation to maximize beneficial use of this water.

Water released from storage in Millerton may be the only source of CVP water for the above-listed refuges during this period. Abnormally high runoff from the San Joaquin and Kings Rivers could cause Reclamation to stop delivery of CVP water from the Delta-Mendota Canal (DMC) to the Mendota Pool. CVP water delivered from the DMC is the main source of supply to the refuges; if this water is not available in the Mendota Pool, no water can be delivered to the refuges. It is uncertain whether hydrologic conditions will cause Reclamation to stop delivery of CVP water from the DMC to the Mendota Pool in 2019; if so, water released from storage in Millerton may be the only source of CVP water for the refuges.

Reclamation has various contracts and agreements for the conveyance of water to certain wildlife refuges, including the above. (See: https://www.usbr.gov/mp/cvpia/3406d/env_docs/) These contracts and agreements implement refuge water supply requirements under Section 3406(d) of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act (Title 34, P.L. 102-575) (CVPIA). They provide, among other things and subject to stated conditions and provisions, that during each year Reclamation shall convey CVP water to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and California Department of Fish and Wildlife in quantities of CVP water required to provide each refuge with L2 and L4 supplies as set forth in Exhibit B to those contracts and agreements. Approval of this action would assist Reclamation in meeting its obligations to deliver L2 and L4 supplies pursuant to the requirements of each refuge listed above.

The State Water Board issued a Temporary Order dated March 6, 2018 (in response to Reclamation's December 7, 2017, temporary transfer change petitions) approving the temporary addition of Banta-Carbona and Patterson Irrigation District facilities for the recapture of SJRRP Restoration Flows dedicated for instream purposes under Reclamation's water rights for the

operation of Friant Dam. In that Order, the Board added a term providing that the PORDs cited in Reclamation's Millerton water rights are for the recapture of SJRRP Restoration Flows. The discussion section of the March 6 Order provides that the PORDs shown on the amended Millerton water rights in 2013 as part of the permanent change petition implementing the SJRRP (2013 Order) are solely for recapture of Restoration Flows. The State Board's interpretation of this Order is that these PORDs could not be used for any other purpose, such as delivery of Millerton releases to the refuges. Fundamentally, the State Water Board has attempted to condition the exercise of an element of Reclamation's permanent water rights (in this case, point of rediversion) on the basis of the water right holder's water management program being implemented at the time of need for downstream rediversion.

Reclamation disagrees with the State Water Board's interpretation of the 2013 Order (as expressed in our Petitions for Reconsideration of the March 6, 2018 Order). However, in an abundance of caution, and without waiving any of its rights or arguments as to the use of the PORDs added in the 2013 Order, Reclamation is filing this Temporary Urgency Change petition in order to assure there are no complications with the use of this PORD for delivery of CVP water released from Millerton Reservoir to wildlife refuges.

No Injury to Other Legal Users

The water released from storage in Millerton reservoir is water appropriated to storage under the water right permits and license for Millerton Reservoir. However, this water is in excess of the demands for the CVP's Friant Division contractors and delivery of this water to the refuges does not injure them by diminishing their supply; Friant Division contractors potentially could be offered uncontrolled season deliveries, SJRRP Recovered Water Account Water, and Section 215 deliveries before making any necessary releases downstream of Friant Dam that would be subsequently delivered to the above listed refuges. The water involved in this proposed action could not be carried over but would need to be released in order for Millerton Reservoir to remain in accordance with flood control requirements during the upcoming snowmelt.

The proposed transfer/exchange would not affect water delivery obligations to other contractors and refuges. There would be no expansion of existing obligations, or increases in demands, to provide CVP water supplies. Nor would it adversely impact Reclamation's ability to meet terms and conditions of it water rights for the operation of the CVP. Reclamation expects under current hydrological conditions that it is unlikely that diverters downstream would have a need to divert these springtime Millerton storage releases.

The proposed action would not alter other CVP operations or release patterns from CVP facilities, or the maximum volume of water delivered to CVP contractors. In addition, CVP water released from storage and delivered to the refuges will not affect the amount of water used by the SJRRP.

Therefore, the proposed action would not injure or unreasonably affect any legal user of water, nor increase the amount of water Reclamation is entitled to use under the subject CVP Applications.

No unreasonable effects to fish and wildlife

Rediversion of flows at the proposed point of rediversion will not have an unreasonable effect upon fish and wildlife resources. The SJRRP will continue to function as required, and Reclamation will comply all applicable biological opinions.
