## NOTICE OF STAFF TECHNICAL WORKSHOP

### **WORKSHOP OVERVIEW**

The purpose of this staff workshop is to assist interested persons in their review of the proposed Plan Amendment and the SED. The workshop is intended to provide technical information and an explanation of the analytical tools used in developing the proposed Plan Amendment and the recirculated draft SED. - City and County of San Francisco effects

There will be an opportunity to ask questions about the analytical tools and analyses at the end of each staff presentation.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act and the federal Clean Water Act require the State Water Board to regularly review and, as appropriate, revise the Bay-Delta Plan. The Bay-Delta Plan, last updated in 2006 (the 2006 Bay-Delta Plan), identifies beneficial uses of water in the Bay-Delta estuary, water quality objectives to protect those uses, and a program of implementation to achieve the water quality objectives. The proposed Plan Amendment includes new and revised San Joaquin River flow objectives for the protection of fish and wildlife beneficial uses, a revised salinity water quality objective for the protection of southern Delta agricultural beneficial uses, as well as a program of implementation for those objectives. The proposed flow objectives would require increased flows from three eastside, salmon-bearing tributaries to the San Joaquin River: the Stanislaus, Tuolumne and Merced rivers. The proposed Plan Amendment also includes non-regulatory updates.

On September 15, 2016, the State Water Board released the proposed Plan Amendment and the recirculated draft SED for public comment. The State Water Board will hold a public hearing to receive public comments on the Plan Amendment and the SED; the hearing will begin November 29, 2016. Written comments must be received no later than noon on Tuesday, January 17, 2017.
