- 3. There is evidence that the proposed operations, engineering design, and proposed construction of the WaterFix project either have changed or are subject to change, since the agents for the Department of Water Resources and the United States Bureau of

- Reclamation signed the WaterFix Water Right Change Petition application on August 25, 2015, as detailed below.
- Contra Costa Water District signed a Settlement Agreement with the Department of Water Resources on March 24, 2016.
- Westlands Water District voted on September 19, 2017 not to participate in the WaterFix project as currently proposed.
- 6. Santa Clara Valley Water District voted for a resolution on October 17, 2017, which stated in part, "[g]iven that Westlands Water District and certain other agriculture districts have declined to participate in the WaterFix project, we are supportive of a lower-cost, scaled-down, and staged project."
- 7. The Department of Water Resources ("DWR") has stated in a Request for Qualifications that DWR is considering changing to a phased implementation of the WaterFix project.
- 8. The Department of Water Resources has not submitted any new information in the WaterFix Water Right Change Petition Hearing regarding the phased implementation that DWR is considering.
- 9. The Department of Water Resources was reported to have notified the County of Sacramento et. al. on January 31, 2018, that DWR would not provide records requested under the Public Records Act, relating to the phased implementation of the WaterFix project, until March 24, 2018.
- 10. Employees of the California Department of Water Resources have stated that the CALSIM modeling for the WaterFix is "proprietary." Attorneys for the California Department of Water Resources have made statements in the WaterFix hearing that CALSIM is a public model.
- 11. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife is consulting with the Department of Water Resources on environmental compliance for the WaterFix project, and was reported by the County of Sacramento et. al., to have been in a meeting with DWR on

- January 26, 2018 at which materials regarding proposed project changes were shown to CDFW personnel but then collected and taken away.
- 12. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife is a trustee agency for fish and wildlife in the State of California (Fish and Game Code § 1802), yet the California Department of Fish and Wildlife withdrew as a party from Part 2 of the WaterFix hearing, and objected to a subpoena for witnesses to testify on the Department's public trust recommendations to the State Water Resources Control Board in 2010, for reasons which are unexplained.
- 13. The WaterFix Final Environmental Impact Report ("EIR") / Environmental Impact Statement ("EIS") was published over a year ago on December 22, 2016, but the United States Bureau of Reclamation ("Reclamation") has not signed a Record of Decision for the EIS.
- 14. On December 29, 2016 the Department of Water Resources signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Reclamation to initiate a concurrent NEPA process to determine long-term coordinated operation of the Central Valley Project and State Water Project, the Reinitiation of Consultation on Long Term Operations.
- 15. On December 29, 2017, Reclamation published a Notice of Intent to Prepare an Environmental Impact Statement on the Revisions to the Coordinated Long Term Operation of the Central Valley Project ("CVP") and State Water Project ("SWP") and Related Facilities in Volume 82, no. 249 of the Federal Register. The notice stated that Reclamation would be considering the following:

Modified operations of the CVP and SWP with and without new or proposed facilities including possible requests to modify environmental and regulatory requirements, and sharing of water and responsibilities in the Delta. (*Id.* at p. 61790, underlining added.)

16. Minutes of the February 14, 2017 stakeholder meeting on Reclamation's Reinitiation of Consultation contain statements by Reclamation that, "there is a basic assumption that if the project period extends to 2070, then Water Fix may be operable and this project would have to consider/model according to Water Fix impacts on CVP/SWP."

- 17. Reclamation has not submitted any information to the WaterFix Water Right Change Petition Hearing regarding any new operational scenarios that Reclamation is considering in the NEPA process on Revisions to the Coordinated Long Term Operations of the CVP and SWP and Related Facilities. Reclamation has also provided no witnesses for Part 2 of the WaterFix hearing to testify or be cross-examined on proposed CVP operations.
- 18. The Department of Interior ("DOI") asserted on November 14, 2017 that under the Department's "Touhy" act regulations at 43 C.F.R. section 2.280 et. seq., none of the agencies in the Department of Interior are required to comply with a subpoena for witnesses or for records in the WaterFix hearing, unless approved by DOI under DOI's "Touhy" act regulations. These agencies include Reclamation and the National Marine Fisheries Service.
- 19. The Department of Water Resources and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife are participating as a NEPA cooperating agencies in the Reinitiation of Consultation on the Coordinated Long-Term Operation of the CVP and SWP.
- 20. Save the California Delta Alliance ("STCDA") described documents shared with the WaterFix Hearing Team at meetings before and during Part 1 of the WaterFix Change Petition Hearing in STCDA's filing of January 12, 2018. STCDA also issued a Public Records Act request to the California Department of Water Resources on January 12, 2018. The documents have not been provided for the WaterFix hearing.
- 21. Emails obtained under Public Records Act requests show that the Department of Water Resources had many web conferences with the WaterFix Water Right Change Petition Hearing Team before and during Part 1 of the hearing. Recordings of the conferences may be available.
- 22. The definitions and instructions in this subpoena were adapted from a subpoena by the State Water Resources Control Board Prosecution Team in the Byron-Bethany Irrigation District, and are appropriate given the refusal by the Department of Water Resources to

respond fully and adequately to Public Records Act requests and to PCFFA/IFR's subpoena of July 6, 2016.
