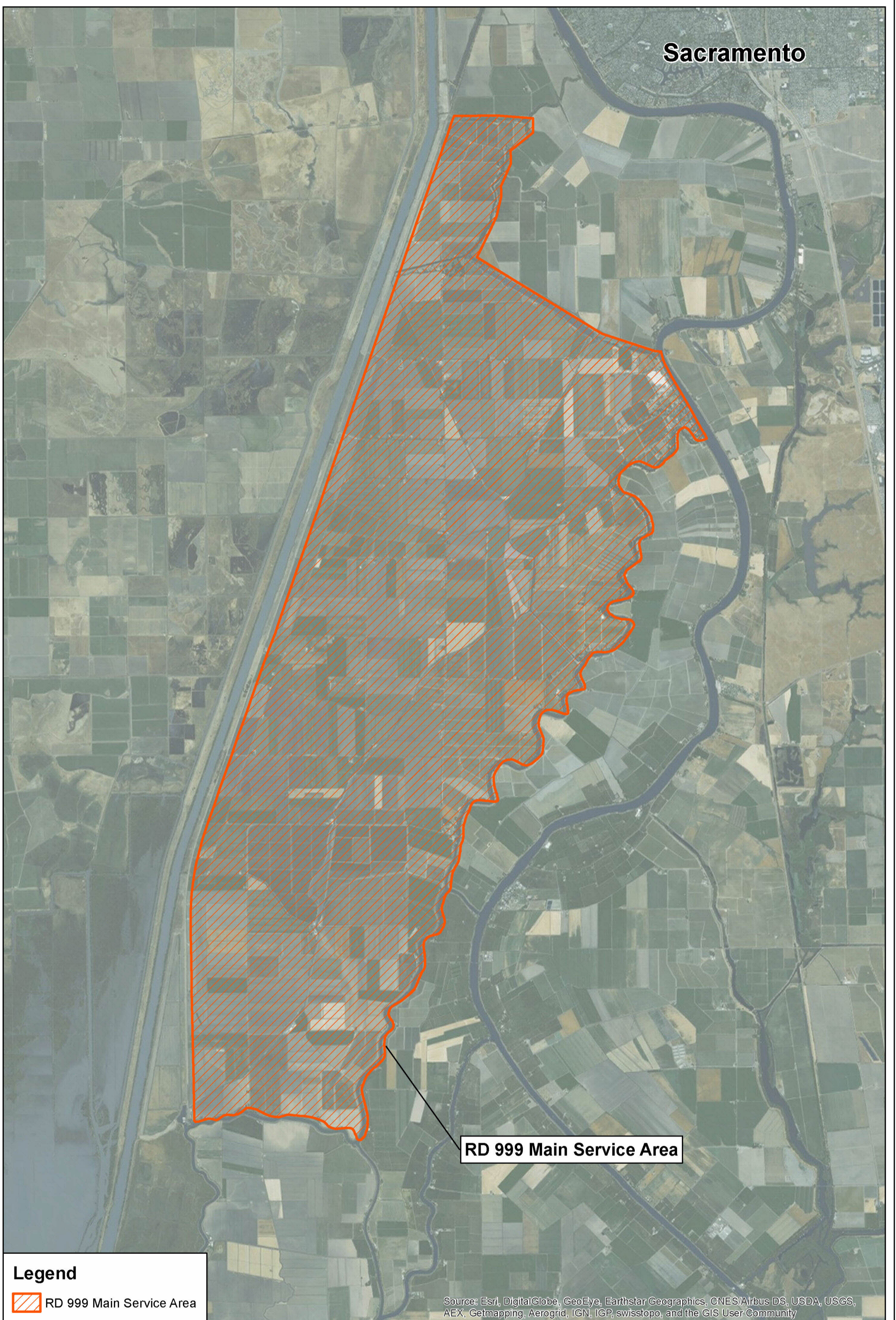

RD 999 is the owner and operator of the system that delivers riparian and pre-1914 rights to the land within its service area as an agent acting in trust on behalf of its landowners, separate from its public use responsibilities. RD 999 also holds licenses 1301, 1302, 1303, 1304, and Applications A001666, A004099, A004100, A004101 respectively, which also serve the water needs of the District. The Contract between the State of California Department of Water Resources and North Delta Water Agency dated January 28, 1981 also requires the provision of a dependable water supply of suitable quality by the California Department of Water Resources to lands within the District.

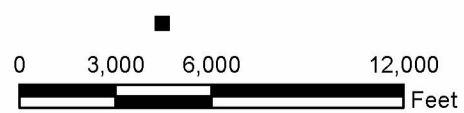

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

Whereas, Under the provisions of an Act of Congress of the United States, approved the twenty-eighth day of September, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty, entitled "An Act to enable the State of Arkansas, and other States, to reclaim swamp land within their limits," in which, set the manner of selecting and selling swamp and overflowed lands as fully set forth; **And Whereas**, The Legislature of the State of California has provided for the sale and conveyance of said lands by statutes enacted from time to time; **And Whereas**, It appears by the certificate of the Register of the State Land Office, Number A. 21, bearing date Twenty first March, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and Seventy Two, and issued in accordance with the provisions of law, that the tracts of **SWAMP AND OVERFLOWED LANDS** hereinafter described have been duly and properly surveyed in accordance with law; that full payment has been made to the State for the same, and that H. H. Houghton of San Francisco County is entitled to receive a Patent therefor; said lands being situated in Yuba County, and described as follows, to wit: Survey No. 527 Swamp and Overflowed Lands Yuba County, Township No. 7, Range No. 20, Section No. 22 Three fourths of acres in Block Number 10 and Block Number 11 North East Quarter Section 22 and more particularly described in the field notes of said survey as follows:

Beginning at a point on the south east corner of Block Number 10 and Block Number 11, East Base and Meridian of Township No. 7, Range No. 20, Section No. 22, thence south 87 degrees 30 minutes West 200 chains to the river bank thence south 87 degrees 30 minutes West 200 chains to the river bank thence south 87 degrees 30 minutes West 200 chains to the place of beginning. Containing three hundred & thirty seven 1/2 acres more or less as shown by the true and correct map of said lands and assigns forever.

Now, therefore, All the requirements of the Act of Congress, as well as the Acts of the State Legislature, in relation to swamp and overflowed lands, having been fully complied with, H. H. Houghton Governor of the State of California, by virtue of authority in me vested, have granted, surveyed, sold and conveyed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto H. H. Houghton all the above described lands, with the appurtenances thereto belonging, to have and to hold unto the said H. H. Houghton his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, H. H. Houghton Governor of the State of California, have caused these Letters to be under Patent, and the seal of the State of California to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Sacramento, this twentieth March day of 1872, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Seventy Two.

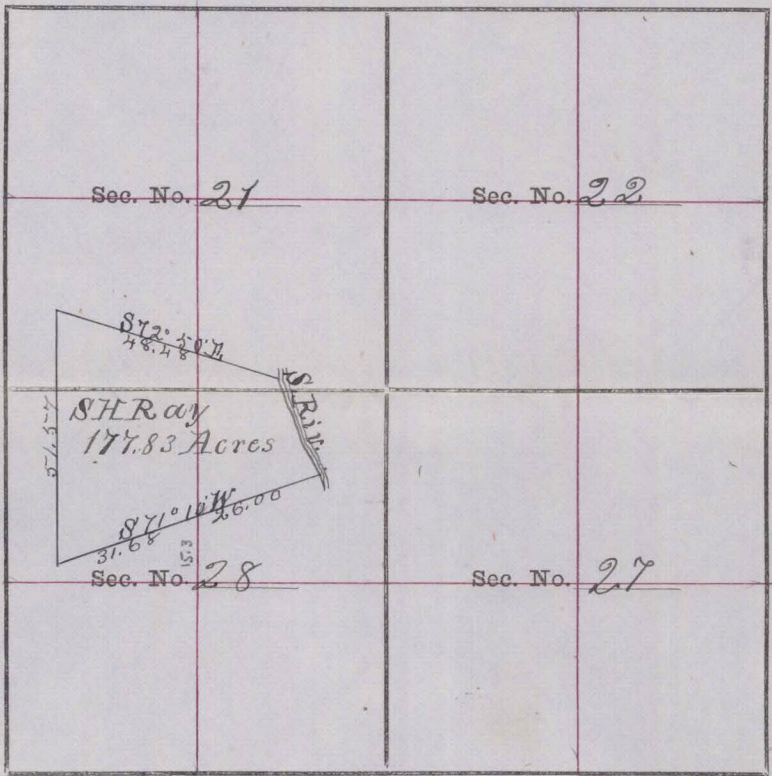
