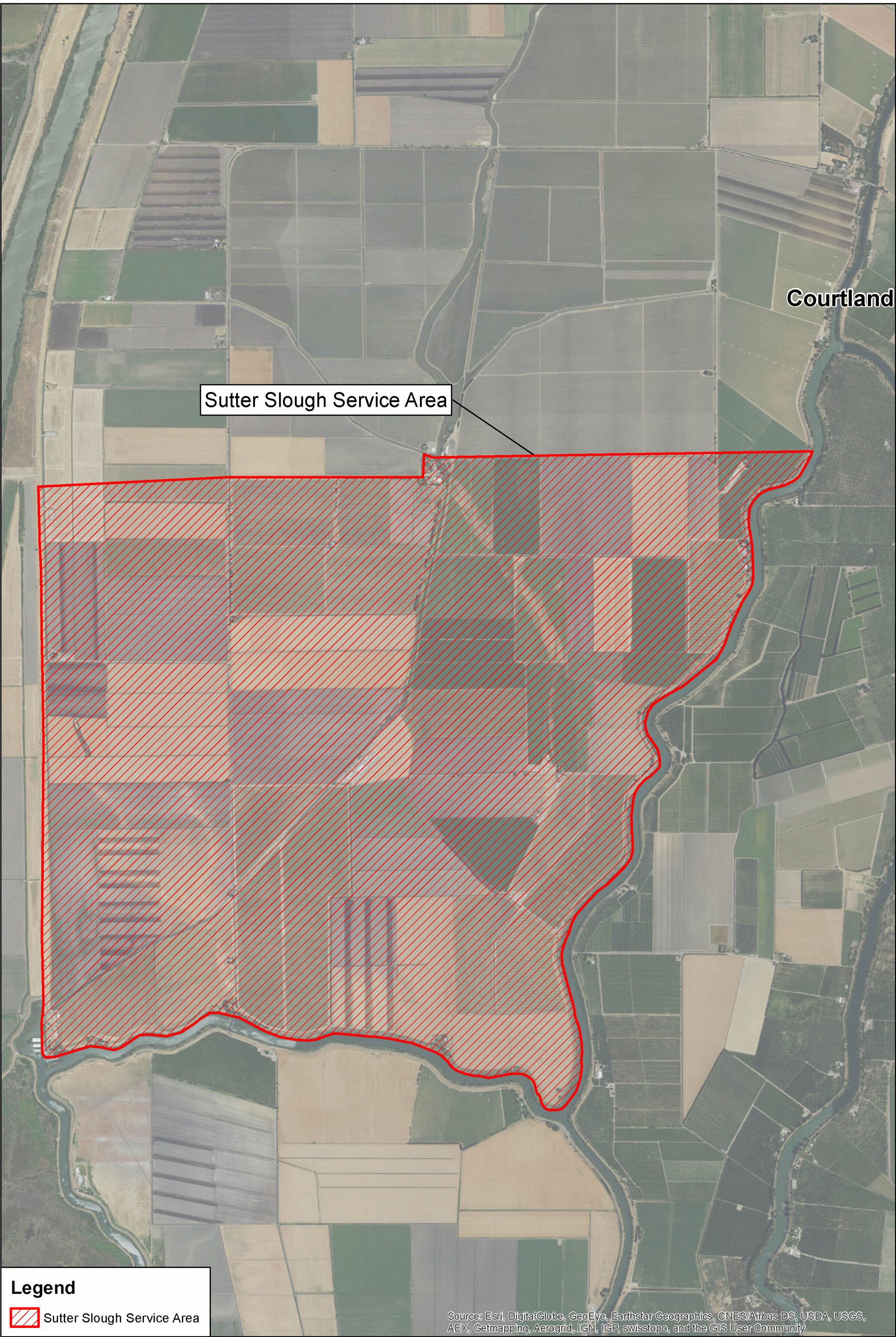

RD 999 is the owner and operator of the system that delivers riparian and pre-1914 rights to the land within its service area as an agent acting in trust on behalf of its landowners, separate from its public use responsibilities. RD 999 also holds licenses 1301, 1302, 1303, 1304, and Applications A001666, A004099, A004100, A004101 respectively, which also serve the water needs of the District. The Contract between the State of California Department of Water Resources and North Delta Water Agency dated January 28, 1981 also requires the provision of a dependable water supply of suitable quality by the California Department of Water Resources to lands within the District.

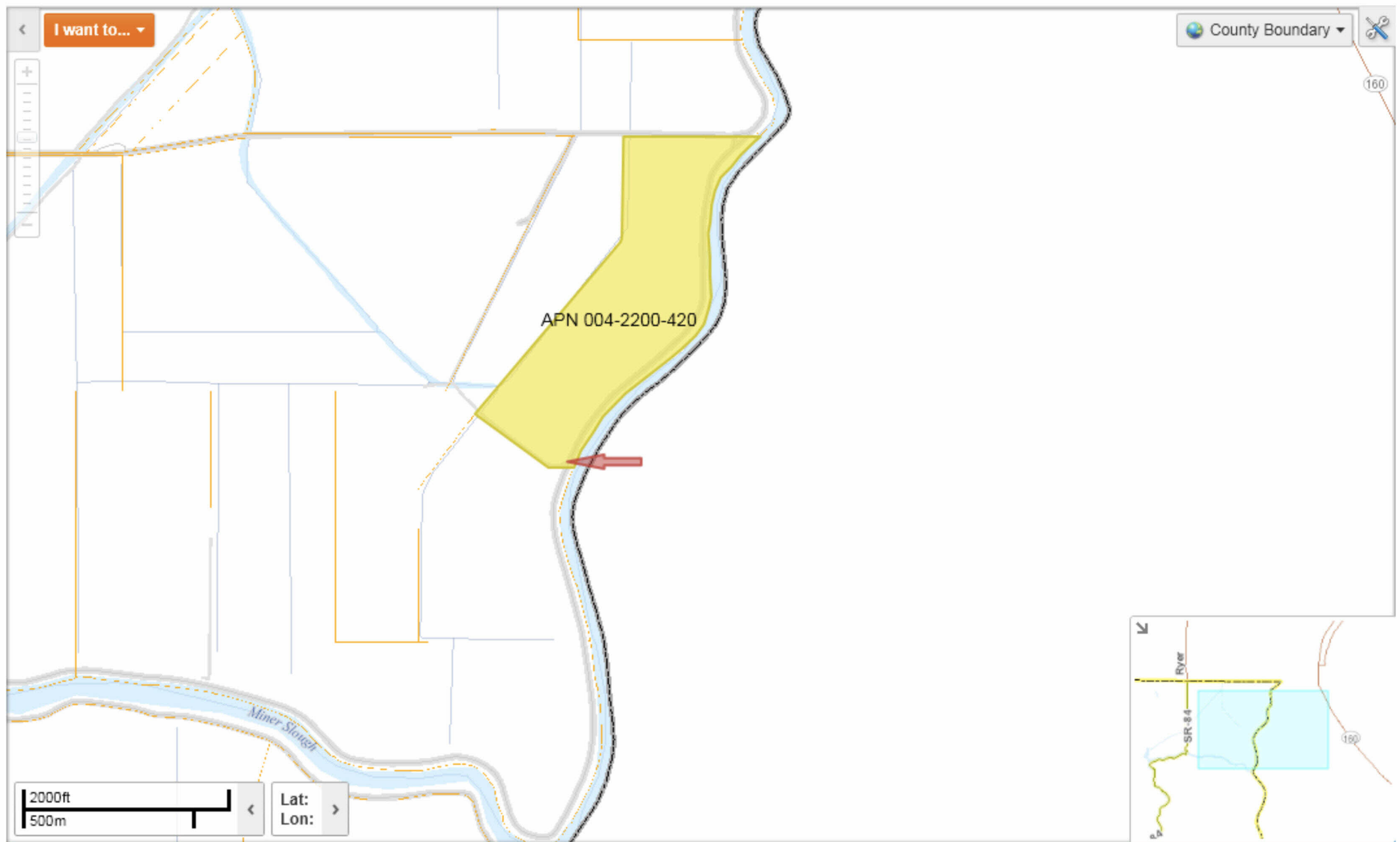

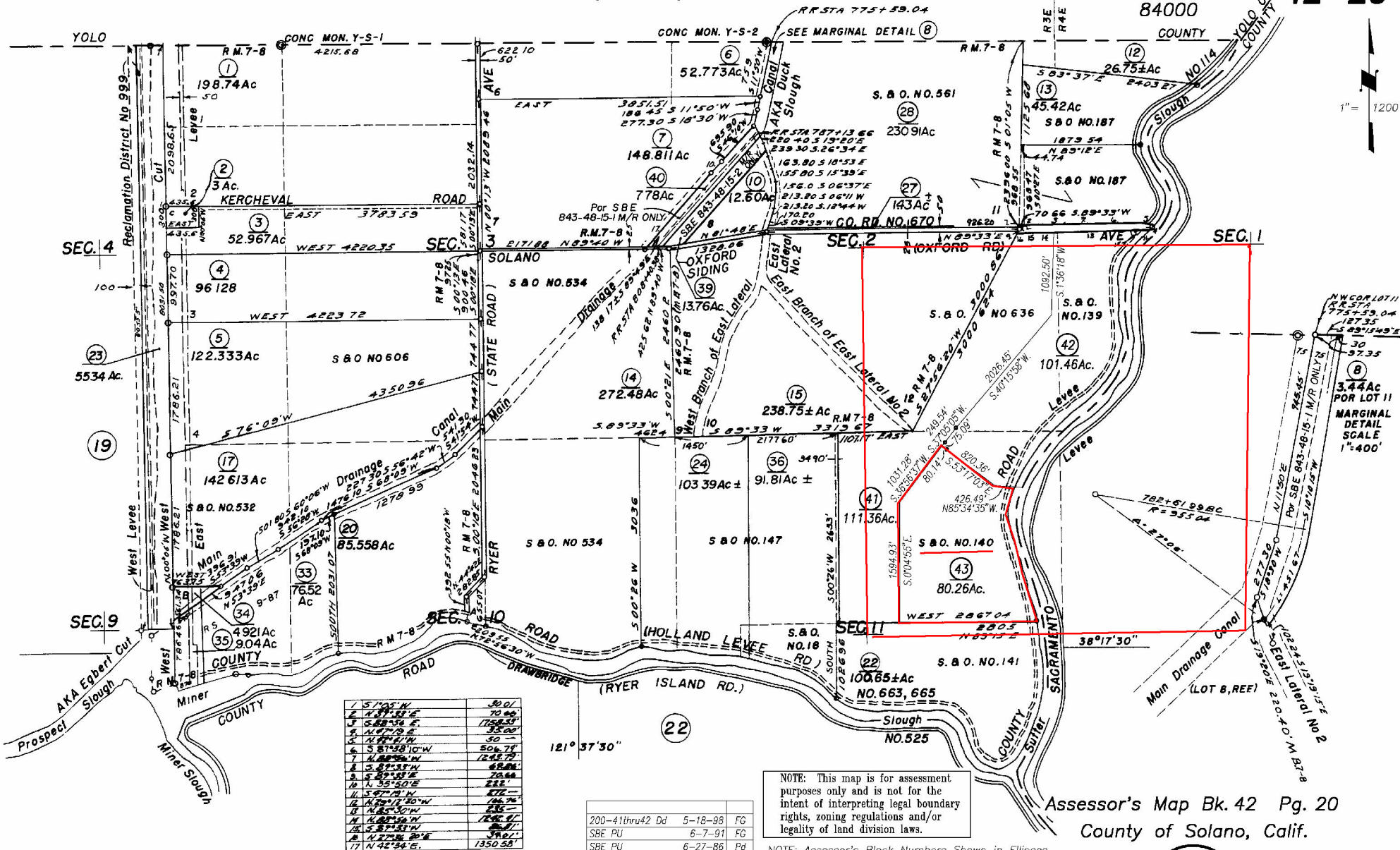

To All to whom these Presents shall Come, GREETING:

WHEREAS, Under the provisions of an Act of Congress of the United States, approved the twenty-eighth day of September, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty, entitled "An Act to enable the State of Arkansas, and other States, to reclaim swamp land within their limits," in which Act the manner of selecting and setting apart swamp and overflowed lands is fully set forth; **And Whereas**, The Legislature of the State of California has provided for the Sale and Conveyance of said lands by statutes enacted from time to time; **And Whereas**, It appears by the certificate of the Register of the State Land Office, No. 107, bearing date October 3rd, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy four, and issued in accordance with the provisions of law, that the tracts of **Swamp and Overflowed Lands** hereinafter described have been duly and properly surveyed in accordance with law; that full payment has been made to the State for the same, and that Sydney H. Kierman is entitled to receive a Patent therefor; said lands being situated in Delaware County, and described as follows, to wit: Survey No. 1119 Swamp and Overflowed Lands, Delaware County, Township No. 5 North, Range No. 3 East, Mount Diablo Meridian, Section No. 15 Portions of said Section and more particularly described in the field notes of said survey as follows:

Beginning at the first West corner of Section Twelve (12) in Township Five (5) North Range Three (3) East Mount Diablo Meridian, run thence North 40° 00' 00" East 62.05 ch. to bank of Little Slough thence along said bank and following the meanderings thence S 45° 15' 00" E 100.00 ch. S 12° 15' 00" E 67.00 ch. to Mt. Diablo Meridian, leaving said bank and run thence S 33° 00' 00" E 66 ch. to place of beginning and containing One Hundred and Sixty Seven (167) Acres, Survey run by the true meridian. Magnetic Variation 15° 00' East.

Now, Therefore, All the requirements of the Act of Congress, as well as the Acts of the State Legislature in relation to swamp and overflowed lands having been fully complied with, Sydney H. Kierman Governor of the State of California, by virtue of authority in me vested, have granted, bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Sydney H. Kierman

all the above described lands, with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, to have and to hold unto Sydney H. Kierman

his heirs and assigns forever.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, Sydney H. Kierman GOVERNOR OF THE

STATE OF CALIFORNIA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the State of California to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand, at the City of Sacramento, this fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy four.

* And that he has not entered any other land under the provisions of this act, or under the provisions of an act passed April 28th, 1855, entitled an act to provide for the sale of the swamp and overflowed lands belonging to this State, which, with the land sought to be purchased, shall exceed three hundred and twenty acres; and that he does not know of any legal or equitable claim, other than his own, to the said land, and that such purchase is sought for the purpose of settlement and reclamation by him, and that he has not, directly or indirectly, made any agreement or contract, in any way or manner, with any person or persons whatsoever, by which the title he may acquire from the department should inure, in whole or in part, to the benefit of any person except himself.
