- 16. Cecilia Ng** No shared governance of water decisions with youth, the largest constituency group that will deal with the CA Water Fix's repercussions, but not actively engaged in these political processes
- 17. Jessica Carmona** Economic Impacts on local Delta farming and livelihoods of migrant farmworkers
- 18. Alexandra Nagy** Concerns of CA Water Fix's relationship in water delivered to oil and gas operations, particularly fracking, which endangers public health of communities
- 19. Walker Foley** Concerns of CA Water Fix plan's inherent flaws in solving twenty-first century circumstances with archaic, outdated proposals
- 20. Garrett Compton Daniells** Lack of understanding of repercussions of CA Water Fix to the waterways affected, already in critical conditions due to drought
- 21. Brytnee Miller** Concerns of saltwater intrusion due to CA Water Fix and its impacts on farm soils in the Central Valley
- 22. Javier Padilla Reyes** Environmental justice, connections between the Delta and the Bay, and economic impacts
