

Giant Garter Snake




- DWR announced three barriers in late January 2015.
- Extended
 comment period
 from mid-Feb to
 March 30.



North Delta
Barriers would
harm many
farmers, harm
emigrating young
salmon and
resident fish.

DWR withdrew North Delta sites, settled on single barrier at False River.





DWR's Purpose with Barriers


- Barriers physically limit tidal salts entering Delta channels—reduces water releases by SWP and CVP to control salinity.
- Barriers help improve quality of water SWP and CVP are able to export.



RTD Stance on Barriers


- Imposes impacts of SWP and CVP mismanagement on Delta.
 - Unknown impacts of TUCP on Delta smelt and other vulnerable native fish species.
 - Potential impacts on vulnerable terrestrial species like giant garter snake.

401 Certification Concerns:

- Adequacy of field surveys.
- Poor job of public notice.
- •Harm to endangered fish species from semipermanent structures as "predation hotspots."
- •DWR started construction before 401 Cert or other permits issued.
- Mitigations not explicitly incorporated from DWR's IS/MND in 401 Cert.
- •RTD requests comment period extension for 401 Cert.
