Re: Support for Revocation of Auburn Dam Water Rights Permits

Ms. Doduc,

The undersigned conservation organizations support the Water Board's proposed revocation of the water rights permits held by the Bureau of Reclamation for the Auburn Dam Project. Revoking these permits will allow the water to be put to true beneficial use and will help ensure that the outstanding natural resources of the American River are protected for the future. Revocation will also bring existing allocations in line with existing uses.

A large multi-use dam on the American River would drown 50 miles of river canyon containing numerous sensitive plant and wildlife species, rich cultural and historic sites, and highly valued recreational lands that millions of Californians enjoy each year. The water permits in question have been held by the Bureau for over 35 years without action. Auburn Dam continues to have no financial support, insufficient legislative support, and because of seismic safety and environmental concerns, as well as inflating costs, is certainly not supported by most Californians. By revoking the unused water rights permits associated with this project, we can finally move on to using this water for truly beneficial purposes, such as supporting a healthy American River.

I support the proposed revocation of permits 16209, 16210, 16211, and 16212 currently held by the Bureau of Reclamation.
