Please raise the volumes of water in the San Joaquin River and its tributaries at least back up to 60%. For the Merced, Tuolumne and Stanislaus 35% is much too low. We all want the fish and wildlife to survive!

More than half of the big river should make it to the Delta in the wet season, and enough flow for the fish and wildlife should make it through in the dry season, too.

The salmon and other fish and the birds are very important parts of our economy and culture. We must take care of them for future generations.
