Re: Water Transfer & HCP Final EIR/EIS: CDROM Format fails to meet CEQA and NEPA's fundamental readability requirements.

Dear Mr. Grubaugh and Mr. Ellis:

Today, we received by express delivery a CDROM purporting to be the IID Water Conservation and Transfer Project HCP and Final EIR/EIS. On behalf of our client, National Audubon~ California, we request that the Final EIR/EIS be reformatted and retransmitted to us for the following reasons.

Though the CDROM's "read me" file instructs the user to open a "START_HERE.pdf," file, no such file exists. We did locate a file entitled "Start_~1.pdf," but all that file contains is two pictures of the cover of the document, telling the reader to review the "read me" file for further instructions. Eventually we did find the Table of Contents in a file entitled "Front_~1.pdf" and located inside the "IID" folder.

Upon reviewing the Table of Contents and following the "read me" file's instructions to move the cursor (a hand symbol) over the sections of the Table of Contents, we discovered that the hand symbol does in fact turn into a pointing finger symbol, indicating that a link is present. However, single-clicking any such link brings up an error message which reads "The specified file [Section_File_Name.pdf] does not exist."

Since we couldn't access the information through the Table of Contents, we then perused the individual files, trying to review the individual files on the CDROM. However, attempting to access the Final EIR/EIS sections manually leads the CDROM user through a maze of folders and files which appear in no particular order, have titles which in no way correlate to their contents, and which contents are often fragmented portions of unidentifiable documents.

NEPA Regulations (40 C.F.R. 1502.8 and 1502.10) state that "Environmental impact statements shall be written in plain language and may use appropriate graphics so that decisionmakers and the public can readily understand them," and that "Agencies shall use a format for environmental impact statements which will encourage good analysis and clear presentation of the alternatives including the proposed action." CEQA Guidelines section 15140 states that "EIRs shall be written in plain language and may use appropriate graphics so that decisionmakers and the public can *rapidly* understand the documents" (emphasis added).

The information in the CDROM, as presented, fundamentally fails to meet basic NEPA and CEQA readability standards because it is not reasonably accessible to the average reader. On behalf of our client, we cannot accept this CDROM as service of the Imperial Irrigation District Water Conservation and Transfer Project Habitat Conservation Plan and Final EIR/EIS.

At your earliest convenience, please provide our office with a printed version of the Final EIR/EIS or an updated CDROM containing proper links and instructions so that we may reasonably access the information in a coherent fashion.
