## Rebuttal Testimony of Robert L. Reiter

1. Points of Diversion Upstream of Seven Oaks Dam
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- On May 2, Ms. McCue had a question regarding our points of diversion upstream of the
- 4 Seven Oaks Dam. Muni/Western's water right applications contain multiple diversion points
- 5 upstream of the Seven Oaks Dam. These points are the SCE river pickup points for the SAR
- 6 powerhouses. Instead of diverting water below Seven Oaks Dam, Muni/Western can divert
- 7 water at the higher elevation of the SAR 2/3 Powerhouse (formerly Powerhouse No. 3) Forebay.
- 8 The purpose for utilizing diversion points at this location is to take advantage of a higher
- 9 elevation point for gravity deliveries and in turn to save the energy costs related to pumping.

## 2. Minimum Wastewater Deliveries

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- Also on May 2, a question arose about the potential for a reduction in wastewater flows
- in Segment F below the RIX/Rialto outflows, with a potential impact on riparian habitat. To
- ensure meeting its minimum base flow obligations to Riverside Narrows under the *Orange*
- 14 County Judgment, Muni entered into contracts with the Cities of San Bernardino and Colton for
- minimum annual deliveries of treated wastewater from their respective treatment plants. The
- 16 contract with San Bernardino obligates it to deliver no less than 16,000 acre-feet of wastewater
- 17 to the Santa Ana River channel each year. The contract with Colton obligates it to deliver no
- less than 2,450 acre-feet of wastewater to the Santa Ana River channel each year. The total,
- 19 18,450 acre-feet per year, represents the minimum flows delivered to the Santa Ana River
- 20 channel at RIX/Rialto that will be maintained through contracts with wastewater agencies.

## 21 3. Water Conservation at Seven Oaks

- Testimony submitted by the Local Sponsors suggests that the U.S. Army Corps of
- 23 Engineers has not authorized water conservation at Seven Oaks Reservoir. Attached hereto is a
- true and correct copy (with the exception of the words "Attachment 1" at the bottom) of a
- 25 memorandum from Colonel Robert W. Burkhardt, Executive Director of Civil Works, dated 8
- June 1998, which states, in relevant part: "the water conservation project [at Seven Oaks Dam
- and Reservoir] is expected to be implemented by the non-Federal sponsor and <u>further</u>
- 28 <u>authorization is not required.</u>" (Emphasis added). The memorandum continues, in relevant part:

- 1 "[i]f it is determined that Corps involvement is necessary to implement the water conservation
- 2 project, a <u>post authorization</u> change report will be required to support future agency decisions."
- 3 (Emphasis added). I am not aware of any decision from Corps headquarters that supersedes this
- 4 memorandum.
