APPROVAL OF STATE ENGINEER

This is to certify that I have examined the foregoing application, and do hereby grant the same, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

This permit is issued for all the unappropriated water of the Truckee River and its tributaries, and as such is issued junior in priority to all existing rights on the Truckee River and its tributaries, and can only be exercised in those years where there are high flows in the river in excess of the senior rights. In addition, this permit is issued subject to any interstate allocation of the Truckee River.

It is understood that the 477,851 acre feet annually herein granted is only a temporary allowance and that the final water right obtained under this permit will be dependent upon the amount of water actually placed to a recreational beneficial use. Accurate measurements of the water placed to beneficial use for recreation purposes must be included in the proof of such use when filed. The State retains the right to regulate the use of the water herein granted at any and all times.

This permit does not extend the permittee the right of ingress and egress on public, private or corporate lands.

The total combined duty of water under Permits 48061 and 48494 shall not exceed 477,851 acre feet annually.

The issuance of this permit does not waive the requirements that the permit holder obtain other permits from State, Federal and local agencies.

An annual report shall be submitted to the State Engineer and the Federal Water Master by February 1st of each year that documents the amount of water diverted and the amount of water used during the previous calendar year.

The point of diversion and place of use are as described on the submitted application to support this permit.

The amount of water to be appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be applied to beneficial use, and not to exceed a maximum of 3,000 cubic feet per second, but not to exceed 477,851 acre-feet annually.

Work must be prosecuted with reasonable diligence and proof of completion of work shall be filed on or before:

March 3, 2011

Water must be placed to beneficial use and proof of the application of water to beneficial use shall be filed on or before:

March 3, 2014

These flows are required for the recreational purpose of natural spawning of Lahontan cutthroat trout and cui-ui in the Truckee River below Derby Dam, to fulfill the purposes of the establishment of the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation, to provide sustenance for the members of the Pyramid Lake Indian Tribe and income to the Tribe, to prevent the loss of and to conserve the endangered cui-ui and the threatened Lahontan cutthroat trout, for operation of Marble Bluff Dam and Pyramid Lake Fishway in support of that fishery and to maintain Pyramid Lake at a stable level to support the lake's use for recreation.

28. The second component of the amount of water applied for is for the maintenance of the level of Pyramid Lake. For this purpose, an average annual inflow of the Truckee River to the lake of approximately 400,000 acre-feet is required. Based upon the historic flows of the Truckee River and the existing diversions from and depletions of those flows, the Applicant's intent is to appropriate all of the water in the Truckee River and its tributaries that is not subject to valid existing rights. 01531

8. Flows utilized in the Truckee River and flows into Pyramid Lake will be conducted in the Truckee River natural stream channel and, therefore, no other works are proposed. Flows utilized in connection with the Pyramid Lake Fishway will utilize Marble Bluff Dam and Pyramid Lake Fishway as conduits for conducting the water. These structures have been constructed and are currently operating.

APPLICATION FOR PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE THE PUBLIC WATERS OF THE STATE OF NEVADA

The water sought to be appropriated pursuant to this 12. application has been used historically and will continue to be used for recreational purposes including being used to help maintain Pyramid Lake at a stable level to support use for recreation, to fulfill the purposes of the establishment of the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation, to provide sustenance for the members of the Pyramid Lake Indian Tribe and income to the Tribe, to prevent the loss of and to conserve the endangered cui-ui and the threatened Lahontan cutthroat trout, to improve and maintain water quality and quantity in Pyramid Lake and the Truckee River downstream of Derby Dam, to provide flows for the operation of Marble Bluff Dam and Pyramid Lake Fishway and to provide suitable flows at proper temperatures for the natural spawning of Lahontan cutthroat trout and cui-ui in the Truckee River downstream of Derby Dam.

The Tribe claims that it is entitled to the water that is the subject of this application as a matter of federal law. That claim is currently being litigated in <u>United States v. Truckee-Carson Irrigation District</u>, et al., Civil No. R-2987-RCB, U.S. District Court for the District of Nevada. This application is therefore filed for protective purposes. By the filing of this application, the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe does not waive or relinquish its claim of right to any of the waters encompassed in this application.
